



#### **Entering Characters on the LCD Screen**

Follow these guidelines to enter characters for passwords and other settings.



- 1 Displays the character count
- 2 Moves the cursor left or right
- 3 Switches between uppercase and lowercase characters, numbers and symbols
- 4 Switches between characters and numbers or symbols
- 5 Displays a list of common domain names to choose from
- 6 Enters a space
- 7 Select when you are finished
- 8 Deletes the previous character





#### **Selecting the Date and Time**

You can select the current date, time, and daylight saving phase in your area, and choose your preferred date and time format.

- 1. Select the 🔙 icon.
- 2. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > Date/Time Settings.
- 3. Change any of these settings as necessary:
  - Date/Time: Selects the date and time.
  - **Daylight Saving Time**: Selects between summer or winter daylight saving time.

• **Time Difference**: Adjusts the time difference between your local time and UTC (Coordinated Universal Time).

#### **Adjusting Control Panel Sounds**

You can adjust the sound level heard when you press buttons on the control panel or an error occurs.

- 1. Select the 🔙 icon.
- 2. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > Sounds.
- 3. Change any of these settings as necessary:
  - Mute: Turns on or off all sound from the product.
  - Button Press: Adjusts the sound volume heard when pressing a button.
  - Error Tone: Adjusts the sound volume heard when a product error occurs.
  - Sound Type: Changes the type of sound heard.

### **Adjusting the Screen Brightness**

You can adjust the brightness of the LCD screen.

- 1. Select the licon.
- 2. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > LCD Brightness.
- 3. Press the or + icons to decrease or increase the brightness.
- 4. Select **OK** to exit.

#### **Turning Off the Internal Light**

The printer's internal light turns on during printing but you can turn it off.

- 1. Select the 🔚 icon.
- 2. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > Inside Light.
- 3. Select from the following options:
  - · Auto: Turns on the internal light automatically during printing.
  - Manual: Turns the light on or off only when you press the Manual:

#### **Using Power Saving Settings**

Your product enters sleep mode automatically and turns off the LCD screen if it is not used for a period of time. You can make the time period shorter and select other options to save energy and resources.

You can adjust the time period before your product enters sleep mode and turns off the LCD screen.

1. Select the 🔜 icon.

You can have the product turn off automatically if it is not used for a specified period of time.

## **Using AirPrint**

AirPrint enables instant wireless printing from iPhone, iPad, iPod touch, and Mac without the need to install drivers or download software.



1. Load paper in your product.

- 2. Set up your product for wireless printing. See the link below.
- 3. Connect your Apple device to the same wireless network that your product is using.
- 4. Print from your device to your product.

# **Network Security Recommendations**

To help deter unauthorized access to your product over a network, you should protect your network environment using appropriate security measures.

Security measures such as these can help deter threats such as loss of user data, use of telephone and fax lines, and other intrusions:

#### Enable security on your wireless LAN

Enable the appropriate security on the wireless LAN you plan to use with your product. Network security such as a network password can deter interception of traffic over the wireless LAN. Your router may already have a default password enabled by your Internet service provider (ISP). See your ISP and router documentation for instructions on how to change the default password and better secure your network.

#### · Connect your product only to a network protected by a firewall

Connecting your product directly to the Internet may leave it vulnerable to security threats. Instead, connect it to a router or other network connection protected by a firewall. Your router may already have a firewall set up by your Internet service provider; check with your ISP for confirmation. For best results, set up and use a private IP address for your network connection.

#### Change the default administrator password on your product


If your product has an option to set an administrator password, change the default administrator password to deter access by unauthorized users to personal data stored on your product, such as IDs, passwords, and contact lists.

# Wi-Fi Infrastructure Mode Setup

You can set up your product to communicate with your computer using a wireless router or access point. The wireless router or access point can be connected to your computer over a wireless or wired network.

**Note:** You cannot connect to a wired and wireless network at the same time.

## **Selecting Wireless Network Settings from the Control Panel**

You can select or change wireless network settings using your product control panel.

To install your product on a wireless network, install the necessary print driver software package by downloading it from the Epson website. The installer program guides you through network setup.

- 1. Select the Figure icon.
- 2. Select Wi-Fi (Recommended) > Start Setup or Change Settings > Wi-Fi Setup Wizard.
- 3. Select the name of your wireless network or select **Enter Manually** to enter the name manually. Use the on-screen keyboard to enter your network name.
- 4. Select the **Enter Password** field and enter your wireless password using the on-screen keyboard.



**Note:** The network name and password are case sensitive. Be sure to correctly enter uppercase and lowercase letters, and numeric or special characters.


- To move the cursor, press the left or right arrows.
- To enter numbers or symbols, select 123#.
- To change the case of letters, select
- To delete the previous character, select
- To enter a space, select **Space**.
- 5. Select **OK** when you finish entering your password.

6. Confirm the displayed network settings and select **Start Setup** to save them.

## Wi-Fi Direct Mode Setup

You can set up your product to communicate directly with your computer or another device without requiring a wireless router or access point. In Wi-Fi Direct Mode, the product itself acts as a network access point for up to 8 devices.

#### **Enabling Wi-Fi Direct Mode**

You can enable Wi-Fi Direct mode to allow direct communication between your product and computer or other devices without a wireless router or access point.

- 1. Select the Fig icon.
- 2. Select Wi-Fi Direct > Start Setup.

- 3. Do one of the following to complete Wi-Fi Direct setup:
  - For iOS devices, select iOS. Scan the QR code with the camera app on your device and follow the
    instructions on your device. Select Next on the LCD screen to display your product information,
    then open the compatible Epson printing app on your device and select your product. Select
    Complete on the LCD screen.
  - For Android devices, select **Android**. Open the compatible Epson printing app on your device and select your product. Select **Complete** on the LCD screen.
  - For other types of devices, select **Other OS Devices**. Use your device to select the Wi-Fi network name (SSID) displayed on the LCD screen and enter the password shown. Select **Next** on the LCD screen to display your product information, then follow the instructions on the LCD screen.

# Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS)

If your network uses a WPS-enabled wireless router or access point, you can quickly connect your product to the network using Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS).

**Note:** To check if your router is WPS-enabled, look for a button labeled **WPS** on your router or access point. If there is no hardware button, there may be a virtual WPS button in the software for the device. Check your network product documentation for details.

### **Using WPS to Connect to a Network**

If you have a WPS-enabled wireless router or access point, you can use Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) to connect your product to the network.

- 1. Select the Fig icon.
- 2. Select Wi-Fi (Recommended) > Start Setup or Change Settings > Push Button Setup (WPS).
- 3. Hold down the WPS button on your wireless router until the security light flashes.
- 4. Follow the instructions on the LCD screen to complete WPS setup.



## **Network Connection Report Codes and Messages**

Check the error codes and messages on the network connection report to solve problems you may encounter with network connections. The tables here list solutions to problems based on the error codes and messages that may appear at the top of the report.

**Note:** Error codes and messages listed here may not all apply to your product.

#### **Error Codes and Messages**

Error code and message	Solution
E-1 Confirm that the network cable is connected and network devices such as a hub, router, or access point are turned on.	Make sure your router, access point, and/or hub are turned on, and the network cable is securely connected to your device and your product.  If you are trying to set up Wi-Fi, remove the network cable and set up Wi-Fi again. Ethernet and Wi-Fi cannot be connected at the same time.

Error code and message	Solution
E-2, E-3, or E-7	Check the following:
No wireless network names (SSID) found. Confirm that the router/access point is turned on and the wireless network (SSID)	Make sure your router or access point is turned on and is correctly connected to your computer or network device.
is set up correctly. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	<ul> <li>Turn off the router or access point, wait about 10 seconds, and turn it on again.</li> </ul>
No wireless network names (SSID) found. Confirm that the wireless network name (SSID) of the PC you wish to connect is set up correctly. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	Move your product closer to your router or access point, and remove any obstacles between them. Also move your product away from devices such as wireless phones or microwaves.
Entered security key/password does not match the one set for your router/access point. Confirm security key/password. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	Confirm that the SSID shown on the network connection report matches the label on your router or access point. Also make sure your SSID uses only ASCII characters and symbols, or your product cannot display the SSID correctly.
assistance.	If you are trying to connect using the WPS push button method, make sure your router or access point supports it.
	If you are using a network password, check the label on your router or access point to confirm that you are using the correct password, or check with your network administrator or router/access point documentation.
	If you are connecting to a smart device that generates an SSID, check the device documentation for the SSID and password you should use.
	If your wireless connection suddenly disconnects, and another smart device was added to the network using a WPS push button method, or your network was set up using a non-WPS push button method, try downloading and installing your product software again.
	Check to see if you have the latest firmware installed.

E-5 Security mode (e.g. WEP, WPA) does not match the current setting of the printer.	If the security on your router or access point is not one of the following types, change the type of security on your router or access point and reset your product's network settings.
Confirm security mode, and contact the network administrator for assistance.	• WEP-64 bit (40 bit)
	• WEP-128 bit (104 bit)
	WPA PSK (TKIP/AES); also known as WPA Personal
	WPA2 PSK (TKIP/AES); also known as WPA2 Personal
	WPA (TKIP/AES)
	WPA2 (TKIP/AES)
	Latin America: Also make sure you are connecting to the 2.4GHz band on your network and using the password for that band.
E-6  MAC address of your printer may be filtered. Check whether your router/access point has restrictions such as MAC address filtering. See the documentation of the router/access point or contact your network administrator for assistance.	If your router or access point has MAC address filtering enabled, register your product's MAC address so it is not filtered. Locate the MAC address on the network connection report and check your router or access point documentation for instructions.
	If your router or access point is using shared authentication with WEP security, confirm that you are using the correct authentication key and index.
	If your router or access point limits the number of connected devices, raise the connection limit. See your router or access point documentation for instructions.
E-8	If your product's <b>Obtain IP Address</b> setting is set to <b>Auto</b> ,
Incorrect IP address is assigned to the printer. Confirm IP address setup of the network device (hub, router, or access point). Contact your network administrator for assistance.	enable DHCP on your router or access point. If it is set to <b>Manual</b> , the IP address may be out of range or on a different network segment; set a valid IP address using your product control panel or the Web Config utility.

E-9 Confirm the connection and network setup of the PC or other device. Connection using the EpsonNet Setup is available. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	Make sure your computer or network device are turned on. Also make sure that you can access the Internet and other devices on the same network from the devices you are trying to connect to your product.
	If you still cannot connect to your product, turn off your router or access point, wait about 10 seconds, and turn it on again. Download and install your product software again to reset your network settings.
E-10 Confirm IP address, subnet mask, and default gateway setup. Connection using the EpsonNet Setup is available. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	Make sure other devices on the network are turned on and do the following:
	If your product's <b>Obtain IP Address</b> setting is set to <b>Manual</b> , check the IP address, subnet mask, and default gateway addresses on the network connection report to see if they are correct. If not, correct the settings.
	If DHCP is enabled, set your product's <b>Obtain IP</b> Address setting to <b>Auto</b> . If you want to use the DHCP-assigned address as a static address, set the <b>Obtain IP</b> Address setting to <b>Manual</b> , enter the product's IP address as listed on the network connection report, and set the subnet mask to 255.255.255.0.

## **Accessing the Web Config Utility**

You can select your product's network settings and confirm its operating status using a web browser. You do this by accessing your product's built-in Web Config utility from a computer or other device that is connected to the same network as your product.

- 1. Print a network status sheet.
- 2. Locate the IP address for your product that is listed on the network status sheet.

- 3. On a computer or other device connected to the same network as your product, open a web browser.
- 4. Enter your product's IP address into the address bar and press **Enter**.

You see the available Web Config utility options.

- 1. Disconnect the USB cable from your product.
- 2. Uninstall your product software.
- 3. Download and install your product software from the Epson website using the instructions on the *Start Here* sheet.

#### Changing a Wi-Fi Connection to a Wired Network Connection

If you have already connected your product to your computer wirelessly, you can change to a wired network connection if necessary.

- 1. Select the Fig icon.
- 2. Select Description > Wired LAN Connection Method > Start Setup.

The Wi-Fi connection is disabled.

- 3. Connect one end of an Ethernet network cable to the product's **LAN** port.
- 4. Connect the other end to any available LAN port on your router or access point.

## Connecting to a New Wi-Fi Router

If you change the wireless router you have been using on your network, you need to update your product's Wi-Fi connection to the new router.

**Note for Latin America:** If you are using a 5 GHz wireless router, set the router to operate in dual band (2.4 GHz and 5 GHz) mode. If your router uses a single network name (SSID) for both the 2.4 GHz and 5 GHz band, give each band its own network name (SSID) instead, such as Home Network 2.4 GHz and Home Network 5 GHz. See your router documentation or contact your internet service provider for instructions.

- 1. Do one of the following:
  - Windows: Uninstall your product software.
  - Mac: Go to the next step.
- 2. Download and install your product software from the Epson website using the instructions on the *Start Here* sheet.

## **Disabling Wi-Fi Features**

You may need to disable your product's Wi-Fi features if you change your network connection type or need to solve a problem with your network connection.

**Note:** Before disabling Wi-Fi features, make a note of your product's SSID (network name) and password.

- 1. Select the Fig icon.
- 2. Select Wi-Fi (Recommended) > Start Setup or Change Settings > Others > Disable Wi-Fi.
- 3. Select **Start Setup** to disable Wi-Fi.



# **Loading Media in the Rear Paper Feeder**

You can print on a variety of paper types and sizes from paper loaded in the sheet feeder.


- 1. Turn on your product.
- 2. Open the paper support and pull up the extensions.




# 3. Open the front cover.



4. Load paper, glossy or printable side up and short edge first.



5. Slide the edge guides against the paper, but not too tightly.



- 6. When prompted by LCD screen, select the size and type of the paper you loaded. Always follow these paper loading guidelines:
  - · Load only the recommended number of sheets.
  - · Load paper short edge first, no matter which way your document faces.
  - · Load the printable side faceup.
  - · Load letterhead or pre-printed paper top edge first.
  - Do not load paper above the arrow mark inside the edge guide.
  - Check the paper package for any additional loading instructions.



# **Loading Media in the Front Paper Feeder**


You can load fine art media, poster boards, and other thick media in the front paper feeder. You can load papers up to 0.011 inch (0.3 mm) thick.

**Note:** Leave at least the following amount of space behind the printer for ejected paper:

**SureColor P700**: 13 inches (330 mm) **SureColor P900**: 16 inches (405 mm)



1. Select **Paper Setting** on the LCD screen.



- 2. Select Front Paper Feeder Fine Art or Front Paper Feeder Poster Board.
- 3. Pull out the front paper feeder as instructed on the LCD screen.
- 4. Follow the rest of the on-screen instructions to load paper.
- 5. When prompted by the LCD screen, select the size and type of the paper you loaded.

Always follow these paper loading guidelines:

- Load only one sheet at a time.
- Load fine art media short edge first, no matter which way your document faces.
- Load the printable side faceup.
- Check the paper package for any additional loading instructions.



# **Loading Roll Paper**

You can load roll paper into the SureColor P700. To load roll paper in the SureColor P900, you need to install the optional roll media adapter.

1. Select **Paper Setting** on the LCD screen.



- 2. Select Roll Paper.
- 3. Pull out the roll paper unit as instructed on the LCD screen.
- 4. Follow the rest of the on-screen instructions to load paper.
- 5. When prompted by the LCD screen, select the size and type of the paper you loaded.


## **Cutting and Removing Roll Paper**

After printing on roll paper, use scissors as described here to cut your printout from the roll paper.

- 1. When printing is finished, select **Cut/Eject** on the LCD screen.
- 2. Select **Cut and Eject** to print a cut line and feed the paper.
- 3. Use scissors to cut the paper along the cut line.
- 4. Select **Done**.

The paper feeds back through the printer.

5. For SureColor P900 only, open the roll paper unit.



6. Remove the roll paper.

Store unused roll paper in its original packaging away from high temperatures, humidity, and direct sunlight.


# Loading a CD/DVD

You can print on any compatible, ink jet-printable CDs or DVDs, including Blu-ray Discs.

**Caution:** Do not insert the disc tray while the product is printing, copying, or performing other operations. Otherwise, your product may be damaged or the surface of the CD/DVD may become dirty or scratched.

**Note:** If you are using discs where the printable area extends to within 0.16 inch (4 mm) of the center hole, you may need to adjust the inner diameter setting using the control panel.

- 1. Burn your files, music, or video onto your disc before printing on it.
- 2. Select **Paper Setting** on the LCD screen.



- 3. Select Disc Tray.
- 4. Pull out the front paper feeder as shown on the LCD screen.
- 5. Follow the rest of the on-screen instructions to load your disc.

Caution: Do not turn off the product with a CD or DVD loaded in it. Always remove the disc first.



## Removing a Printed CD/DVD


After your CD or DVD is printed, the tray extends automatically.

**Caution:** Always remove the disc tray after printing. If you turn the product off and on again or perform a head cleaning without removing the tray, the print head may contact the CD/DVD tray and cause the product to malfunction.

1. Pull the disc tray out of the product and remove your CD or DVD from the tray.



2. Close the front cover.



**Caution:** After printing, handle the CD or DVD carefully. You may need to wait up to 24 hours for the ink to dry fully before inserting it in a drive, depending on the type of disc you used. Keep printed discs away from moisture and direct sunlight.



Before printing from your computer, make sure you have set up your product and installed its software as described on the *Start Here* sheet.


2. Select the print command in your application.

**Note:** You may need to select a print icon on your screen, the **Print** option in the File menu, or another command. See your application's help utility for details.

3. If necessary, select your product name as the printer you want to use.

**Note:** You may also need to select **Preferences**, **Properties**, **Print Settings**, or **Printer Properties** to view your print settings.

You see the Main tab of your printer settings window:



4. Select the **Media Type** setting that matches the paper you loaded.

**Note:** You can click **Custom Settings** to select a custom paper configuration.

- 5. If you are using non-Epson paper or media and you need to fine-tune its performance, select the **Media Type** setting that is closest to the paper you loaded, click the **Paper Config** button, and adjust the **Color Density** option as necessary.
- 6. Select a **Color** option:
  - To print a color document or photo, select the Color setting.
  - To print text and graphics in black or shades of gray, select the Advanced B&W Photo or Grayscale setting.

**Note:** The **Grayscale** setting is available only when plain paper is selected as the **Media Type**.

- 7. Select the **Print Quality** setting that matches the print quality you want to use.
- 8. Select **Black Enhance Overcoat** to increase the black density by overcoating light gray ink on the dark parts of printouts.

**Note:** The **Black Enhance Overcoat** setting may not be available depending on the selected paper type.

- 9. Select the desired color management option as the **Mode** setting.
- 10. Select the **Source** setting that matches the paper feeding method you are using.
- 11. Select the size of the paper you loaded as the **Size** setting.

Note: You can also select the User-Defined setting to create a custom paper size.

12. If you want to print a photo without borders, select **Borderless**.

**Note:** You must select a compatible borderless paper type and size to print without borders. Check the borderless paper compatibility list for details.

- 13. To see a preview of how your document or photo will print, select **Print Preview**. (The preview appears after you click **Print** but before printing starts.)
- 14. To layout multiple print jobs for printing all at once, select **Layout Manager**.



### **Advanced B&W Photo Options - Windows**

If you select **Advanced B&W Photo** as the Color option, you can easily produce neutral and toned black-and-white prints. Whether your photo is color or grayscale, you can use this screening and color management technology to create stunning black-and-white prints. Click **Advanced** and select any of the available options. You can also use **Black Enhanced Overcoat** to print darker tones of black.

#### **Color Toning**

Adds tone (hue) to your black-and-white output. The default is **Neutral**, which provides a neutral tonal scale print. You can also choose other popular presets such as **Cool**, **Warm**, and **Sepia**. Note that the presets affect the target in the tone color circle.

#### Tone

Changes the entire tonal scale of your black-and-white output. While **Darker** is the default setting, you may see better results if you choose **Dark**. The tone color circle adjusts the hue of your black-and-white print. Click on any portion of the color wheel or enter corresponding values to customize the tone (hue) to add to your print. The closer you select to the edge of the wheel, the more color you add.

#### **Brightness**

Adjusts the overall lightness and darkness of your image.

#### Contrast

Adjusts the difference between the light and dark areas of your image.

### **Shadow Tonality**

Controls tonality only in the shadow areas of your image.

### **Highlight Tonality**

Controls tonality only in the highlight areas of your image.

### **Max Optical Density**

Adjusts the overall density or focus of the print. Create a soft focus print by lowering the density setting.

### **Highlight Point Shift**

Helps reduce gloss differential on glossy media by adding density to the highlights of your image.

### **Print Quality Options - Windows**

You can use the Speed/Quality slider to set the desired quality level and select any of the available Print Quality options to fine-tune the quality of your print. Some settings may be unavailable, depending on the paper type and border setting you have chosen.

### **High Speed**

Speeds up printing but may reduce print quality.

### **Edge Smoothing**

Smooths jagged edges in low-resolution images such as screen captures or images from the Web.

#### **Finest Detail**

Sharpens edges on vector-based data including text, graphics, and line art. (This setting does not affect photographs.)

Note: Enabling Finest Detail may decrease the print speed.

#### **Black Enhance Overcoat**

Prints darker tones of black by overcoating the black ink with gray.

**Note:** Printing with **Black Enhance Overcoat** increases the edge margins. Select **Quality Options > Minimize Top Margin** to reduce the size of the margins. This may lower print quality and may cause paper that curls easily to rub against the print head.

#### **PhotoEnhance**

Lets you choose from various Scene Correction settings to automatically analyze your photos.

**Note:** PhotoEnhance uses a sophisticated face recognition technology to optimize photos that include faces. For this to work, both eyes and the nose must be visible in the subject's face. If your photo includes a face with an intentional color cast, such as a statue, you may want to turn off **PhotoEnhance** to retain the special color effects.

#### **ICM**

Automatically adjusts colors based on the printer's ICC profile and the selected **Media Type** setting, using the Image Color Matching system. Click the **Advanced** button to choose the input profile and other settings.

**Note:** In most cases, you get better results by applying color management in your application, rather than in the printer driver.

#### **Off (No Color Adjustment)**


Turns off color management in your printer software so you can manage color using only your application software.

**Note:** An ICC profile is required if color management is turned off.





- To print multiple pages on one sheet of paper, or print one image on multiple sheets of paper, select the **Multi-Page** checkbox and select the options you want.
- To print on both sides of the paper, select a **Double-Sided Printing** option
- To enlarge your image beyond the limits of your application program, select the **Optimize Enlargement** checkbox.

**Note:** The driver can increase the image size up to 650% and decrease the output resolution to stay within the pixel limitations. Depending on the resolution of the original image and the print size, you may see reduced print quality.

- To print a color background on the page, select the **Print Bckg Color** checkbox and click **Color Settings** to select the color you want to use.
- To print the time, date, and other information about your print job at the top or bottom of the page, select the **Job Settings** checkbox and click **Details** to select the settings you want to use.

Note: Enabling Finest Detail may decrease the print speed.


To print on roll paper, you select the roll paper size and roll paper options from the Printer Settings menu.

- 1. Select Manage Custom Sizes as the Paper Size setting.

- 3. For borderless printing, enter one of the following as the **Width** setting:

  - 16 for 16-inch (406 mm) wide roll paper (SureColor P900)
  - 16.5 for 16.5-inch (419 mm) wide roll paper (SureColor P900)
  - 17 for 17-inch (432 mm) wide roll paper (SureColor P900)

**Note:** Make sure your image fits within the width of your roll paper.

- 4. Enter the length of your roll paper image as the **Height** setting (up to 129 inches [3277 mm]).
- 5. Set the margin settings to **0**.
- 6. Click OK.
- 7. Select your new custom roll paper size as the **Paper Size** setting.
- 8. Select Page Layout Settings.

The maintenance box stores ink that gets flushed from the system during print head cleaning. When an ink cartridge is expended or the maintenance box is at the end of its service life, you need to replace it.

You may also need to replace a cartridge that is more than six months old if your printouts do not look their best, even after cleaning and aligning the print head.

**Note:** Please dispose of your used Epson branded ink cartridges and maintenance boxes responsibly and in accordance with local requirements. 

Make sure you have your replacement cartridges handy before you begin. You must install new cartridges immediately after removing the old ones.



**Note:** Replace all expended ink cartridges. You cannot print if any of the ink cartridges are expended or missing.







**Warning:** If ink gets on your skin, wash it thoroughly with soap and water. If ink gets into your eyes, flush them immediately with water. If discomfort or vision problems persist, see a doctor immediately. If ink gets into your mouth, spit it out and see a doctor right away. Keep ink cartridges out of the reach of children.

**Note:** Dispose of used cartridges carefully. Do not take the used cartridge apart or try to refill it.

6. Gently shake the new ink cartridge about 15 times.




7. Remove the new ink cartridge from the package.







**Caution:** If you remove an ink cartridge for later use, protect the ink supply area from dirt and dust and store it in the same environment as the printer. The valve in the ink supply is designed to contain any excess ink, but do not touch the ink supply port or surrounding area.

## **Maintenance Box Replacement**

The maintenance box stores surplus ink that gets collected during printing or print head cleaning. When you see a message on the LCD screen, follow the on-screen instructions to replace the maintenance box.

Note the following precautions when replacing the maintenance box:

- Do not remove the maintenance box or its cover except when replacing the maintenance box; otherwise, ink may leak.
- Do not touch the green chip on the side of the maintenance box.
- Do not tilt the maintenance box after removing it or ink may leak.
- Do not touch the openings in the maintenance box or you may get ink on you.
- Do not drop the maintenance box or subject it to strong shocks.
- If you cannot replace the cover, the maintenance box may not be installed correctly. Remove and reinstall the maintenance box.
- Do not store the maintenance box in high or freezing temperatures.
- Do not replace the maintenance box during printing; otherwise, ink may leak.
- Keep the maintenance box out of direct sunlight.

**Caution:** Do not reuse a maintenance box that has been removed and left uninstalled for a long period. Keep the maintenance box away from direct sunlight.

**Note:** The maintenance box is a user-replaceable part and is not covered by the product warranty.

You can check for clogged nozzles before you clean them so you don't clean them unnecessarily.

**Note:** You cannot clean the print head if an ink cartridge is expended, and may not be able to clean it when a cartridge is low. You must replace the cartridge first.





- 5. When the cleaning cycle is finished, you can check to see if the nozzles are clean; click **Print Nozzle**Check Pattern and click **Print**.
- 6. Check the printed pattern to see if there are gaps in the lines.

- If there are no gaps, click Finish.
- If there are gaps or the pattern is faint, click Clean to clean the print head again.

If you don't see any improvement after cleaning the print head up to 3 times, turn off the product and wait at least six hours. Then try cleaning the print head again. If quality still does not improve, run a Power Cleaning. If there is still no improvement, contact Epson support.

## **Running a Power Cleaning Using the Product Control Panel**

If print head nozzles are still clogged after cleaning the print head several times, run the **Power**Cleaning utility from the product control panel. This process consumes a lot of ink to clean the clogged nozzles.

- 1. Load a few sheets of plain paper in the rear paper feeder.
- 2. Select the icon on the LCD screen
- 3. Select Maintenance > Power Cleaning.
- 4. Select **Start** to begin the power cleaning cycle.

Caution: Never turn off the product during a cleaning cycle or you may damage it.

5. When the cleaning cycle is finished, print the nozzle check pattern again to see if any nozzles are still clogged.

If nozzles are still clogged, wait for at least 6 hours without printing. Then try cleaning the print head again. If there is still no improvement, contact Epson for support.

## **Cleaning the Paper Guide**

If you see ink on the back of a printout, you can clean the paper guide rollers to remove any excess ink.

- 1. Load a few sheets of the following size paper in the rear paper feeder: A3 (11.7 × 16.5 inches [297 × 420 mm]) or A3+ (13 × 19 inches [329 × 483 mm]) for SureColor P700 and A2 (16.5 × 23.4 inches [420 × 594 mm]) for SureColor P900.
- 2. Select the 🔙 icon on the LCD screen.
- 3. Select Maintenance > Paper Guide Cleaning.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to clean the paper path.
- 5. Repeat these steps as necessary until no smeared ink appears on your printouts.

## **Cleaning Your Product**

To keep your product working at its best, you should clean it several times a year.

**Caution:** Do not use a hard brush, benzene, alcohol, or paint thinner to clean the product or you may damage it. Do not place anything on top of the cover or use the cover as a writing surface, or it could get permanently scratched. Do not use oil or other lubricants inside the product or let water get inside.

- 1. Turn off the product.
- 2. Unplug the power cable.
- 3. Disconnect any connected cables.
- 4. Remove all the paper and the roll paper unit from the product.
- 5. Close the paper support, rear paper feeder, output tray, and any covers.
- 6. Clean the outer case, except for the front cover, with a soft cloth dampened with a mild detergent. For the front cover, use a feather duster to clean the surface.
- 7. Plug the power cable back in and turn on the product.
- 8. Load several sheets of plain paper (or a cleaning sheet) in the sheet feeder and clean the paper guide.

Close the rear paper support and output tray when you are not using the product to help keep it clean.

## **Transporting Your Product**

If you need to store your product or transport it a long distance, prepare it for transportation as described here.

**Caution**: During transportation and storage, follow these guidelines:

- Avoid tilting the product, placing it vertically, or turning it upside down; otherwise ink may leak.
- Leave the ink cartridges installed. Removing the cartridges can dry out the print head and may prevent the product from printing.

**Note:** Before storing your product for a long period, replace low, expended, or expired ink to help prevent the print head from drying out. Store your product in a cool, dry place.

- 1. Turn off the product.
- 2. Unplug the power cable.
- 3. Disconnect any connected cables.
- 4. Remove all the paper from the product.
- 5. Open the printer cover and secure the print head to the case with tape.
- 6. Close the printer cover.
- 7. Prepare the printer for transportation as shown.
- 8. Place the product in its original packing materials, if possible, or use equivalent materials with cushioning around the product. Make sure the box adequately protects the product control panel.
- 9. After unpacking the product, be sure to remove the tape from the print head.

Keep the product level during transportation. If print quality has declined when you print again, clean and align the print head.

## **Checking for Software Updates**

# **Product Status Messages**

You can often diagnose problems with your product by checking the messages on its LCD screen.

**Note:** If the LCD screen is dark, press the screen to wake the product from sleep mode.

Paper Setup Auto Display is set to Off. Some features may not be available. For details, see your documentation.	If <b>Paper Setup Auto Display</b> setting is disabled, you cannot use AirPrint.
Recovery Mode Update Firmware	An error has occurred during firmware updating. Connect your product using a USB cable and try updating the firmware again. If you still receive this error message, contact Epson for support.

**Note:** The ink pads in the printer collect, distribute, and contain the ink that is not used on printed pages. During the life of your product it may reach a condition where either satisfactory print quality cannot be maintained or the ink pads have reached the end of their usable life. The Epson Status Monitor, your LCD screen, or lights on the control panel will advise you when these parts need replacing. If this happens during the standard warranty of the product, the exchange of the product or replacement of the pads is covered under the standard warranty. If the product is out of warranty, the pads can be replaced by any Epson authorized service provider. The waste ink pads are not a user-replaceable part.

    operation problem you may have could be caused by your computer, cable, software, or selected
    settings. Check the other solutions in this manual or try uninstalling and reinstalling your printer
    software.
  - If the page prints but the nozzle check pattern has gaps, clean or align the print head.
  - If the page does not print, the product may have a problem. Check the other solutions available. If they do not work, contact Epson.

#### **Noise After Ink Installation**

If you hear noises from your product after installing ink, check the following:

- The first time you install the ink cartridges, the product must charge its print head. Wait until charging
  finishes before you turn off the product, or it may charge improperly and use excess ink the next time
  you turn it on.
- If the product's print head stops moving or making noise, and the charging process has not finished after approximately 5 minutes, turn off your product. Turn it back on and check to see if charging is still in progress. If it is still in progress, contact Epson for help.

#### **Software Installation Problems**

If you have problems while installing your product software, try these solutions:

- Make sure your product is turned on and any necessary cables are securely connected at both ends. If

- Close any other programs, including screen savers and virus protection software, and install your product software again.

#### **Product Cannot Connect to a Wireless Router or Access Point**

If your product has trouble finding or connecting to a wireless router or access point, try these solutions:

- If you are connecting the product via Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) and the Wi-Fi icon on your product's LCD screen is not lit or does not appear, make sure you select one of the WPS options from the product control panel within 2 minutes of pressing the WPS button on your router.
- Make sure to place your product within contact range of your router or access point. Avoid placing your product near a microwave oven, cordless phone, or large metal object, such as a filing cabinet.

**Note for Latin America:** If you are using a 5 GHz wireless router, set the router to operate in dual band (2.4 GHz and 5 GHz) mode. If your router uses a single network name (SSID) for both the 2.4 GHz and 5 GHz band, give each band its own network name (SSID) instead, such as Home Network 2.4 GHz and Home Network 5 GHz. See your router documentation or contact your internet service provider for instructions.

- Verify that your router or access point is operating correctly by connecting to it from your computer or another device.
- Print a network connection report and check the codes and messages on the report to help determine the cause of the problem.
- You may need to disable the firewall and any anti-virus software on your wireless router or access point.
- Try restarting your router following the instructions in your router documentation.

**Note:** If you are reading these instructions online, you will lose your Internet connection when you restart your router.

- Check to see if access restrictions, such as MAC address filtering, are set on the router or access
  point. If access restrictions are set, add your product's MAC address to your router's address list. To
  obtain your product's MAC address, print a network status sheet. Then follow the instructions in your
  router or access point documentation to add the address to the list.
- If your router or access point does not broadcast its network name (SSID), follow the instructions that came with your product to enter your wireless network name manually.
- If your router or access point has security enabled, determine the kind of security it is using and any
  required password or passphrase for connection. Then make sure to enter the exact WEP key or WPA
  passphrase correctly.
- Check if your computer is restricting the available wireless channels. If so, verify that your wireless access point is using one of the usable channels and change to a usable channel, if necessary.
- If you cannot connect your product to a device using Wi-Fi Direct, you may have exceeded the
  maximum number of devices connected to your product (8). Print a network status sheet or access
  Web Config on the browser for your device and check the number of connected devices. If 8 devices
  are already connected, disconnect a device by deleting the product's SSID from the Wi-Fi screen of
  that device. If fewer than 8 devices are connected, check the accuracy of your other network settings,
  move your device closer to your product, and try connecting again.
- If you are using a Wi-Fi Direct connection that suddenly disconnects, the Wi-Fi Direct password on
  your device may have been changed. If necessary, delete the existing DIRECT-xxxxxxxx connection
  settings from your device and enter a new password. See your device documentation for instructions.
- If you connected your product to a Windows computer using Wi-Fi Direct and it automatically selected Access Point Mode, you may have trouble accessing a low-priority Internet connection. Check the network connection or adapter settings in the Windows Control Panel and set the Internet metric setting to 100 for your version of the Internet Protocol.

### **Network Software Cannot Find Product on a Network**

If EpsonNet Setup cannot find your product on a network, try these solutions:

- If you have replaced your router, reinstall your product software to connect to the new router.

## **Product Does Not Appear in Mac Printer Window**

If your product does not appear in the Mac printer window, try these solutions:

• Turn your product off, wait 30 seconds, then turn it back on again.

- If you are connecting the product wirelessly via EpsonNet Setup and a WiFi symbol is not displayed on the product's LCD screen, make sure your product software was installed correctly. If necessary, reinstall your software.
- Make sure you installed your product software correctly for your network. See the Start Here sheet for instructions.
- If your Mac includes both wired and wireless network services, make sure the network to which you
  connected your product is at the top of the Set Service Order list. Check your Mac documentation for
  instructions.

#### **Cannot Print Over a Network**

If you cannot print over a network, try these solutions:

- Print a network connection report and check the codes and messages on the report to help determine the cause of the problem.

- Make sure your computer and product are both using the same wireless network.
- If network printing is slow, print a network status sheet and check the signal strength. If it is poor, place your product closer to your router or access point. Avoid placing your product near a microwave oven, cordless phone, or large metal object, such as a filing cabinet.

  product's LCD screen is not lit, make sure you select one of the WPS options from the product control
  panel within 2 minutes of pressing the WPS button on your router.
- Check your wired LAN router or access point to see if the LED for the port to which your product is connected is on or flashing. If the link LED is off, try the following:
  - Make sure the Ethernet cable is securely connected to your product and to your router, access point, switch, or hub.
  - Try connecting your product to a different port or a different router, access point, switch, or hub.
  - Try connecting with a different Ethernet cable.
  - Try printing to your product from another computer on the network.

## **Paper Feeding Problems**

If you have problems feeding paper, try these solutions:

- If paper does not feed into the sheet feeder, remove the paper and fan the edges to separate the sheets. Reload paper against the right side and slide the edge guide against it. Do not load too many sheets in the sheet feeder at once and make sure the product cover is closed.
- When using the sheet feeder, do not load paper above the arrow mark on the left edge guide. Load only one sheet of compatible paper when using the front manual feed tray.
- Load only one sheet of media in the front manual feed tray. For posterboard, make sure there is enough space behind the product for the media to feed through.
- If multiple pages feed at once, remove the paper, fan the edges to separate the sheets, and reload it.
- If you cannot insert paper easily into the front manual feed tray, make sure the paper is perfectly flat and not curled.
- If you are printing on roll paper or with the sheet feeder, make sure the manual feed tray is not extended. Extend it only to load fine art paper or posterboard.
- If paper loaded using the front manual feed tray does not feed, make sure you installed the paper correctly and guided it all the way into the product.
- Do not load more than the recommended number of sheets.
- Make sure paper is loaded in the correct orientation. Load cut sheets in the sheet feeder vertically.
- Make sure your paper meets the specifications for your product.
- If paper dust builds up on the rollers, they may lose traction and become unable to feed paper properly. Clean the paper guide.
- If roll paper does not feed, cut the end straight across and uncurl it by rolling it backward, if necessary. Then reload the paper.
- If thick media does not feed, make sure you are loading it straight into the product, not at an angle.
- If paper jams when you print on both sides of the paper, try loading fewer sheets.
- For best results, follow these guidelines:
  - Use new, smooth, high-quality paper that is not damp, curled, creased, old, too thin, or too thick.
  - Load paper printable side up.

- Run a product check to see if a test page prints. If the test page prints, check to see if your product software is installed correctly.
- In Windows, make sure your product is selected as the default printer.
- In Windows, clear any stalled print jobs from the Windows Spooler:
  - Windows 10: Click and select (Settings) > Devices > Printers & scanners. Select your product name and select Manage > Open print queue. Right-click the stalled print job, click Cancel, and click Yes.
  - Windows 8.x: Navigate to the Apps screen and select Control Panel > Hardware and Sound >
     Devices and Printers. Right-click your product name, select See what's printing, and select your
     product name again if necessary. Right-click the stalled print job, click Cancel, and click Yes.
  - Windows 7: Click and select Devices and Printers. Right-click your product name, select See what's printing, and select your product name again, if necessary. Right-click the stalled print job, click Cancel, and click Yes.

### **Printing is Slow**

If printing becomes slow, try these solutions:

- Make sure your system meets the requirements for your operating system. If you are printing a highresolution image, you may need more than the minimum requirements. If necessary, increase your system's memory.
- If you are using Windows 7, close the **Devices and Printers** window before you print.
- On a Mac, make sure you download and install the Epson printer driver.
- Clear space on your hard drive or run a defragmentation utility to free up existing space.
- Close any programs you are not using when you print.
- If your product is connected to a USB hub, connect it directly to your computer instead.
- If printing becomes slower after printing continuously for a long time, the product may have automatically slowed down to protect the print mechanism from overheating or becoming damaged. Let the product rest with the power on for 30 minutes, then try printing again.
- If you are printing over a wireless network, factors such as interference, network traffic, or weak signal strength may affect your printing speed.

**Note for Latin America:** If you are using a 5 GHz wireless router, set the router to operate in dual band (2.4 GHz and 5 GHz) mode. If your router uses a single network name (SSID) for both the 2.4 GHz and 5 GHz band, give each band its own network name (SSID) instead, such as Home Network 2.4 GHz and Home Network 5 GHz. See your router documentation or contact your internet service provider for instructions.

For the fastest printing, select the following settings in your product software:

- Make sure the paper type setting matches the type of paper you loaded.
- Turn on any high speed settings in your product software.
- Select a lower print quality setting.
- Windows: Click the Maintenance or Utility tab, select Extended Settings or Speed and Progress, and select the following settings:
  - Always Spool RAW Datatype
  - Page Rendering Mode
  - Print as Bitmap

If printing is still slow and you are using Windows 7 or Windows Vista, try the following:

1. Click and select Computer or My Computer. Double-click the C: drive and open these folders: ProgramData > EPSON > PRINTER.

**Note:** If you do not see the ProgramData folder, open the **Organize** menu and select **Folder and search options**. In the window that appears, click the **View** tab, select **Show hidden files, folders, and drives** in the Advanced settings list, and click **OK**.

- 2. Right-click the **EPAUDF01.AUD** file and select **Delete**.
- 3. Restart your computer and try printing again.

- Make sure you loaded the printable side of the paper correctly for your product.
- Turn off any high speed settings in your product software.
- You may need to replace the ink cartridges.

## **Blurry or Smeared Printout**

If your printouts are blurry or smeared, try these solutions:

- Make sure your paper is not damp, curled, old, or loaded incorrectly in your product.
- Use a support sheet with special paper, or load special paper one sheet at a time.
- Make sure your paper meets the specifications for your product.
- Use Epson papers to ensure proper saturation and absorption of genuine Epson inks.
- Make sure the paper type setting in your product software matches the type of paper you loaded.
- Make sure you loaded the printable side of the paper correctly for your product.
- If you are printing on thick paper or poster board, make sure you select the appropriate settings.
- Avoid handling printouts on glossy paper right after printing to allow the ink to set.
- Dry printouts completely before filing or displaying them. When drying printouts, avoid direct sunlight, do not use a dryer, and do not touch the printed side of the paper.
- · Do not stack printouts immediately after printing.
- If you print on both sides of a sheet of paper, smudges may appear on the reverse side of heavily saturated or dark images. If one side of a sheet will contain a lighter image or text, print that side first. Adjust the density and/or ink drying time settings.
- Run a nozzle check to see if any of the print head nozzles are clogged. Then clean the print head, if necessary.
- Adjust the print quality in the product software.
- Clean the paper path.

**Note:** Your product will not operate properly while tilted at an angle. Place it on a flat, stable surface that extends beyond the base of the product in all directions.

### **Grainy Printout**

If your printouts are grainy, try these solutions:

- Make sure you loaded the printable side of the paper correctly for your product.
- Select a higher print quality setting and turn off any high speed settings in your product software.
- Run a nozzle check to see if any of the print head nozzles are clogged. Then clean the print head, if necessary.
- Adjust the print quality in the product software.
- You may need to increase the image resolution or print a smaller size; see your software documentation.

Note: Images from the Internet may be low resolution and not result in a high quality printout.

 If you enlarged the image size in an image-editing program, you need to increase the image resolution setting to retain a high image quality. Increase the image resolution by the same amount you increase the image size. For example, if the image resolution is 300 dpi (dots per inch) and you will double the image size for printing, change the resolution setting to 600 dpi.

**Note:** Higher resolution settings result in larger file sizes, which take longer to process and print. Consider the limitations of your computer system when selecting a resolution, and select the lowest possible resolution that produces acceptable quality to keep file sizes manageable.

- The ink cartridges may be old or low on ink, and you may need to replace them.
- After you print, the colors in your printout need time to set as the ink dries. During this time, the colors
  may look different than you expect. To speed up drying time, do not stack your printouts on top of each
  other.
- Your printed colors can never exactly match your on-screen colors. However, you can use a color management system to get as close as possible. Try using the color management options in your printer software.
- For best results, use genuine Epson paper.



## **Binding Arbitration and Class Waiver**

# 1. DISPUTES, BINDING INDIVIDUAL ARBITRATION, AND WAIVER OF CLASS ACTIONS AND CLASS ARBITRATIONS

- 1.1 **Disputes**. The terms of this Section 1 shall apply to all Disputes between you and Epson. The term "Dispute" is meant to have the broadest meaning permissible under law and includes any dispute, claim, controversy or action between you and Epson arising out of or relating to this Agreement, Epson branded products (hardware and including any related software), or other transaction involving you and Epson, whether in contract, warranty, misrepresentation, fraud, tort, intentional tort, statute, regulation, ordinance, or any other legal or equitable basis. "DISPUTE" DOES NOT INCLUDE IP CLAIMS, or more specifically, a claim or cause of action for (a) trademark infringement or dilution, (b) patent infringement, (c) copyright infringement or misuse, or (d) trade secret misappropriation (an "IP Claim"). You and Epson also agree, notwithstanding Section 1.6,that a court, not an arbitrator, may decide if a claim or cause of action is for an IP Claim.
- 1.2 Binding Arbitration. You and Epson agree that all Disputes shall be resolved by binding arbitration according to this Agreement. ARBITRATION MEANS THAT YOU WAIVE YOUR RIGHT TO A JUDGE OR JURY IN A COURT PROCEEDING AND YOUR GROUNDS FOR APPEAL ARE LIMITED.

  Pursuant to this Agreement, binding arbitration shall be administered by JAMS, a nationally recognized arbitration authority, pursuant to its code of procedures then in effect for consumer related disputes, but excluding any rules that permit joinder or class actions in arbitration (for more detail on procedure, see Section 1.6 below). You and Epson understand and agree that (a) the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. §1, et seq.) governs the interpretation and enforcement of this Section 1, (b) this Agreement memorializes a transaction in interstate commerce, and (c) this Section 1 shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- 1.3 **Pre-Arbitration Steps and Notice**. Before submitting a claim for arbitration, you and Epson agree to try, for sixty (60) days, to resolve any Dispute informally. If Epson and you do not reach an agreement to resolve the Dispute within the sixty (60) days), you or Epson may commence an arbitration. Notice to Epson must be addressed to: Epson America, Inc., ATTN: Legal Department, 3131 Katella Ave., Los Alamitos, CA 90720 (the "Epson Address"). The Dispute Notice to you will be sent to the most recent address Epson has in its records for you. For this reason, it is important to notify us if your address changes by emailing us at EAILegal@ea.epson.com or writing us at the Epson Address above. Notice of the Dispute shall include the sender's name, address and contact information, the facts giving rise to the Dispute, and the relief requested (the "Dispute Notice"). Following receipt of the Dispute Notice, Epson and you agree to act in good faith to resolve the Dispute before commencing arbitration.
- 1.4 **Small Claims Court**. Notwithstanding the foregoing, you may bring an individual action in the small claims court of your state or municipality if the action is within that court's jurisdiction and is pending only in that court.

- 1.5 WAIVER OF CLASS ACTIONS AND CLASS ARBITRATIONS. YOU AND EPSON AGREE THAT EACH PARTY MAY BRING DISPUTES AGAINST THE OTHER PARTY ONLY IN AN INDIVIDUAL CAPACITY, AND NOT AS A PLAINTIFF OR CLASS MEMBER IN ANY CLASS OR REPRESENTATIVE PROCEEDING, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION FEDERAL OR STATE CLASS ACTIONS, OR CLASS ARBITRATIONS. CLASS ACTION LAWSUITS, CLASS-WIDE ARBITRATIONS, PRIVATE ATTORNEY-GENERAL ACTIONS, AND ANY OTHER PROCEEDING WHERE SOMEONE ACTS IN A REPRESENTATIVE CAPACITY ARE NOT ALLOWED. ACCORDINGLY, UNDER THE ARBITRATION PROCEDURES OUTLINED IN THIS SECTION, AN ARBITRATOR SHALL NOT COMBINE OR CONSOLIDATE MORE THAN ONE PARTY'S CLAIMS WITHOUT THE WRITTEN CONSENT OF ALL AFFECTED PARTIES TO AN ARBITRATION PROCEEDING.
- 1.6 **Arbitration Procedure**. If you or Epson commences arbitration, the arbitration shall be governed by the rules of JAMS that are in effect when the arbitration is filed, excluding any rules that permit arbitration on a class or representative basis (the "JAMS Rules"), available at http://www.jamsadr.com or by calling 1-800-352-5267, and under the rules set forth in this Agreement. All Disputes shall be resolved by a single neutral arbitrator, and both parties shall have a reasonable opportunity to participate in the selection of the arbitrator. The arbitrator is bound by the terms of this Agreement. The arbitrator, and not any federal, state or local court or agency, shall have exclusive authority to resolve all disputes arising out of or relating to the interpretation, applicability, enforceability or formation of this Agreement, including any claim that all or any part of this Agreement is void or voidable. Notwithstanding this broad delegation of authority to the arbitrator, a court may determine the limited question of whether a claim or cause of action is for an IP Claim, which is excluded from the definition of "Disputes" in Section 1.1 above. The arbitrator shall be empowered to grant whatever relief would be available in a court under law or in equity. The arbitrator may award you the same damages as a court could, and may award declaratory or injunctive relief only in favor of the individual party seeking relief and only to the extent necessary to provide relief warranted by that party's individual claim. In some instances, the costs of arbitration can exceed the costs of litigation and the right to discovery may be more limited in arbitration than in court. The arbitrator's award is binding and may be entered as a judgment in any court of competent jurisdiction.

You may choose to engage in arbitration hearings by telephone. Arbitration hearings not conducted by telephone shall take place in a location reasonably accessible from your primary residence, or in Orange County, California, at your option.

- a) Initiation of Arbitration Proceeding. If either you or Epson decides to arbitrate a Dispute, both parties agree to the following procedure:
- (i) Write a Demand for Arbitration. The demand must include a description of the Dispute and the amount of damages sought to be recovered. You can find a copy of a Demand for Arbitration at <a href="http://www.jamsadr.com">http://www.jamsadr.com</a> ("Demand for Arbitration").
- (ii) Send three copies of the Demand for Arbitration, plus the appropriate filing fee, to: JAMS, 500 North State College Blvd., Suite 600 Orange, CA 92868, U.S.A.

- (iii) Send one copy of the Demand for Arbitration to the other party (same address as the Dispute Notice), or as otherwise agreed by the parties.
- b) Hearing Format. During the arbitration, the amount of any settlement offer made shall not be disclosed to the arbitrator until after the arbitrator determines the amount, if any, to which you or Epson is entitled. The discovery or exchange of non-privileged information relevant to the Dispute may be allowed during the arbitration.
- c) Arbitration Fees. Epson shall pay, or (if applicable) reimburse you for, all JAMS filings and arbitrator fees for any arbitration commenced (by you or Epson) pursuant to provisions of this Agreement.
- d) Award in Your Favor. For Disputes in which you or Epson seeks \$75,000 or less in damages exclusive of attorney's fees and costs, if the arbitrator's decision results in an award to you in an amount greater than Epson's last written offer, if any, to settle the Dispute, Epson will: (i) pay you \$1,000 or the amount of the award, whichever is greater; (ii) pay you twice the amount of your reasonable attorney's fees, if any; and (iii) reimburse you for any expenses (including expert witness fees and costs) that your attorney reasonably accrues for investigating, preparing, and pursuing the Dispute in arbitration. Except as agreed upon by you and Epson in writing, the arbitrator shall determine the amount of fees, costs, and expenses to be paid by Epson pursuant to this Section 1.6d).
- e) Attorney's Fees. Epson will not seek its attorney's fees and expenses for any arbitration commenced involving a Dispute under this Agreement. Your right to attorney's fees and expenses under Section 1.6d) above does not limit your rights to attorney's fees and expenses under applicable law; notwithstanding the foregoing, the arbitrator may not award duplicative awards of attorney's fees and expenses.
- 1.7 Opt-out. You may elect to opt-out (exclude yourself) from the final, binding, individual arbitration procedure and waiver of class and representative proceedings specified in this Agreement by sending a written letter to the Epson Address within thirty (30) days of your assent to this Agreement (including without limitation the purchase, download, installation of the Software or other applicable use of Epson Hardware, products and services) that specifies (i) your name, (ii) your mailing address, and (iii) your request to be excluded from the final, binding individual arbitration procedure and waiver of class and representative proceedings specified in this Section 1. In the event that you opt-out consistent with the procedure set forth above, all other terms shall continue to apply, including the requirement to provide notice prior to litigation.
- 1.8 **Amendments to Section 1**. Notwithstanding any provision in this Agreement to the contrary, you and Epson agree that if Epson makes any future amendments to the dispute resolution procedure and class action waiver provisions (other than a change to Epson's address) in this Agreement, Epson will obtain your affirmative assent to the applicable amendment. If you do not affirmatively assent to the applicable amendment, you are agreeing that you will arbitrate any Dispute between the parties in accordance with the language of this Section 1 (or resolve disputes as provided for in Section 1.7, if you timely elected to opt-out when you first assented to this Agreement).

1.9 Severability. If any provision in this Section 1 is found to be unenforceable, that provision shall be severed with the remainder of this Agreement remaining in full force and effect. The foregoing shall not apply to the prohibition against class or representative actions as provided in Section 1.5. This means that if Section 1.5 is found to be unenforceable, the entire Section 1 (but only Section 1) shall be null and void.
