Software	Description					
Epson Software Updater	Periodically checks for software updates and then notifies you and installs the software if an update is available. You can select the interval for update checks and make settings for receiving update notifications. In addition to driver updates, also allows you to update product firmware and previously installed applications, and install additional software that is compatible with the printer.					
Epson Edge Dashboard	Allows you to manage the status of multiple printers and easily copy custom paper settings from one printer to another.					
Epson Media Installer	Allows you to download paper information, including ICC profiles, print modes, and print control parameters, from Internet servers and save it in the printer or printer driver.

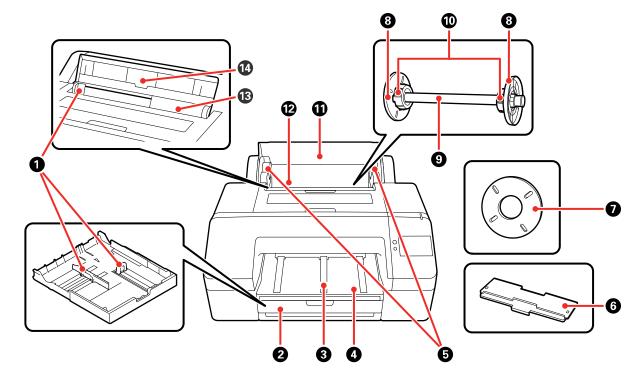

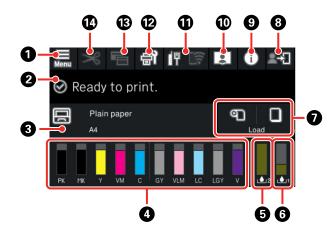
Control Panel

When paper is not loaded, - - - is displayed. If there is no paper loaded in either paper source, select to display the **Paper Setting** screen.

4 Displays the amount of ink remaining

The abbreviation below each bar indicates the ink color.

PK: Photo Black

MK: Matte Black

Y: Yellow

VM: Vivid Magenta

M: Magenta

C: Cyan

GY: Gray

VLM: Vivid Light Magenta

LC: Light Cyan

LGY: Light Gray

V: Violet

When the 4 notification icon is displayed, the corresponding ink color is running low. Tap the display area to check the model number of the ink cartridge.

5 Displays the amount of space remaining in the borderless maintenance box

When the ⁽¹⁾ notification icon is displayed, the corresponding box is almost full. Tap the display area to check the borderless maintenance box model number.

6 Displays the amount of space remaining in the maintenance box

When the ⁽¹⁾ notification icon is displayed, the maintenance box is almost full. Tap the display area to check the maintenance box model number.

7 Paper input/output

Accesses the paper feed settings to load and eject roll paper or poster board

8 Lock setting icon

Displays the login or log out screen when **Lock Setting** is enabled. You must enter the admin password to access any of the locked settings. See the online *Administrator's Guide* for more details.

9 Information icon

Displays consumable item information and a list of messages

10 Online manual icon

Displays a QR code that links to product videos

- 3. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > Language.

- 4. Select a language.
- 5. Press the \widehat{m} home button to exit.

Selecting the Date and Time

Before using your product, select the current date, time, and daylight saving phase in your area, and choose your preferred date and time format.

Note: This setting can be locked by an administrator. If you cannot access or change this setting, contact your administrator for assistance.

- 1. Press the \widehat{m} home button, if necessary.
- 2. Select the 🖪 Menu icon.
- 3. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > Date/Time Settings.
- 4. Select Date/Time.
- 5. Select the date format you want to use.
- 6. Use the on-screen keyboard to enter the current date and select **OK**.
- 7. Select the time format you want to use.
- 8. Use the on-screen keyboard to enter the current time and select OK.
- 9. Select Daylight Saving Time and select either Summer or Winter.
- 10. Press the \widehat{m} home button to exit.

Setting a Password and Locking the Control Panel

- 1. Press the \widehat{m} home button, if necessary.
- 2. Select the 🔜 Menu icon.
- 3. Select General Settings > System Administration > Security Settings > Admin Settings.
- 4. Select Admin Password > Change.
- 5. Do one of the following:
 - If you have set an administrator password before, enter the current password, then enter and confirm the new password in the fields provided.
 - If you have not set an administrator password before, enter the default password in the current password field, then enter a new password and confirm it in the fields provided.

Note: The default password is the product's serial number. Check the label on the back of the printer to locate the serial number. The default user name is blank.

- 6. Select **OK**.
- 7. Select Lock Setting > On to lock settings.

A prompt appears confirming that you want to enable locked settings. Select **Yes** to enable the setting and return to the home screen.

The lock setting icon is displayed on the home screen when the lock setting is enabled.

You must enter the admin password to access any of the locked settings.

Note: You can restore the administrator password to the default password by selecting **Restore Default Settings** on the **Admin Password** screen and entering the administrator password. If you forget your password, contact Epson for assistance. Parent topic: Using the Control Panel

Using Power Saving Settings

Your product enters sleep mode automatically and turns off the LCD screen if it is not used for a period of time. You can make the time period shorter and select other options to save energy and resources.

Changing the Sleep Timer Settings

You can adjust the time period before your product enters sleep mode and turns off the LCD screen.

Note: This setting can be locked by an administrator. If you cannot access or change this setting, contact your administrator for assistance.

- 1. Press the \widehat{m} home button, if necessary.
- 2. Select the 🛃 Menu icon.
- 3. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > Sleep Timer.
- 4. Do one of the following:
 - Press the + or button to increase or decrease the number of minutes.
 - Press the number to display the on-screen keypad, select the number of minutes (between 1 and 60), and select **OK**.

Note: The default setting is 4 minutes.

5. Select OK.

When your product enters sleep mode, the control panel's screen goes dark, but the ${}^{(\!\!\!\!)}$ power light remains on.

Changing the Power Off Timer Settings

You can have the product turn off automatically if it is not used for a specified period of time.

Note: This setting can be locked by an administrator. If you cannot access or change this setting, contact your administrator for assistance.

Note: The default setting is Off.

- 2. Select the 🖪 Menu icon.
- 3. Select General Settings > Basic Settings > Power Off Timer.
- 4. Select a time period between **30minutes** and **12h** (12 hours).

Note: Increasing the time will affect the printer's energy efficiency. Please consider the environment before making any changes.

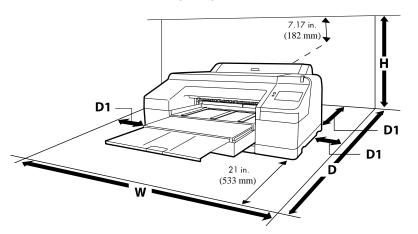

Installation Space

Make sure that you clear the following amount of working space so that you can eject paper and replace consumables as necessary for your model.

The following space is required behind the printer when printing on poster board of certain sizes:

- A2: approximately 14.56 inches (370 mm)
- A3+: approximately 10.23 inches (260 mm)
- A3: approximately 7.87 inches (200 mm)
- A4: approximately 2.75 inches (70 mm)

Using Your Printer

Follow these guidelines as you use your printer:

- Operate the printer only within the specified operating temperature and humidity range for your product and your media. For more information, see the documentation supplied with the media.
- Check to make sure you maintain the specified humidity range, especially in dry areas or air conditioned environments.

- Keep the printer out of direct sunlight.
- Do not install the printer next to heat sources or directly in the path of exhaust from a ventilator or air conditioner. Failure to observe this precaution could result in the print head nozzles drying out and clogging.
- Make sure the product work space is kept free of dust or lint that could damage your product or clog the print head nozzles.
- Perform maintenance operations according to usage frequency or at the recommended intervals. Failure to perform regular maintenance could reduce print quality or damage the print head.
- If an error occurs and the printer is turned off without first resolving the error, the print head may not be in the home (or capped) position, which may cause the print head to dry out. In this case, turn on the power and wait until the carriage is in the home position.
- When the printer is on, do not disconnect the power cable or cut the power at the circuit breaker. The print head may not be in the home (or capped) position. In this case, turn on the power and wait a while until the print head is in the home position.

Note: To keep the print head in the optimum operating condition, ink is used in maintenance operations such as head cleaning.

Storing Your Printer

Follow these guidelines if you need to store your printer for a long period:

- If the printer is not used for an extended period of time, the print head nozzles may become clogged. We recommend that you print once every week to prevent the nozzles from clogging.
- Remove any loaded media before storing the printer to prevent the pressure rollers from causing creases in the media, which may cause jams or damage to the print head.
- Make sure that the print head is in the home (or capped) position before storing the printer. If it is left away from the home position for a long time, the print quality may decline. Turn the printer on and then off again to move the print head to the home position.
- Close all the covers on the printer to prevent dust and debris from getting in. If the printer will be not be used for an extended period of time, protect it with an anti-static cloth or other cover. The print head nozzles can become clogged if fine dust gets on the print head, and you may not be able to print properly.
- If the printer is turned on after an extended period of time with the power off, run a nozzle check before you start printing and clean the print head, if necessary.

Network Security Recommendations

To help deter unauthorized access to your product over a network, you should protect your network environment using appropriate security measures.

Security measures such as these can help deter threats such as loss of user data, use of telephone and fax lines, and other intrusions:

· Enable security on your wireless LAN

Enable the appropriate security on the wireless LAN you plan to use with your product. Network security such as a network password can deter interception of traffic over the wireless LAN. Your router may already have a default password enabled by your Internet service provider (ISP). See your ISP and router documentation for instructions on how to change the default password and better secure your network.

Connect your product only to a network protected by a firewall

Connecting your product directly to the Internet may leave it vulnerable to security threats. Instead, connect it to a router or other network connection protected by a firewall. Your router may already have a firewall set up by your Internet service provider; check with your ISP for confirmation. For best results, set up and use a private IP address for your network connection.

Change the default administrator password on your product

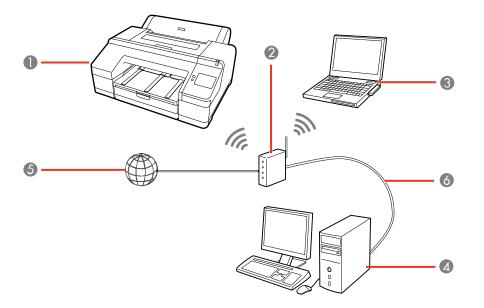
If your product has an option to set an administrator password, change the default administrator password to deter access by unauthorized users to personal data stored on your product, such as IDs, passwords, and contact lists.

Wi-Fi Infrastructure Mode Setup

You can set up your product to communicate with your computer using a wireless router or access point. The wireless router or access point can be connected to your computer over a wireless or wired network.

Note: You cannot connect to a wired and wireless network at the same time.

Selecting Wireless Network Settings from the Control Panel

Selecting Wireless Network Settings from the Control Panel

You can select or change wireless network settings using your product control panel.

To install your product on a wireless network, install the necessary software by downloading it from the Epson website. The installer program guides you through network setup.

Note: This setting can be locked by an administrator. If you cannot access or change this setting, contact your administrator for assistance.

- 1. Press the \widehat{m} home button, if necessary.
- 2. Select the **IT** I network icon.

Note: Icon may look different depending on connection status.

- 3. Select Router > Start Setup or Change Settings > Wi-Fi Setup Wizard.
- 4. Select the name of your wireless network or select **Enter Manually** to enter the name manually. Use the on-screen keyboard to enter your network name.

Note: If you enter the wireless network manually, select **Available** for **Password**, and then enter the password.

5. Select the Enter Password field and enter your wireless password using the on-screen keyboard.

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Note: The network name and password are case sensitive. Be sure to correctly enter uppercase and lowercase letters, and numeric or special characters.

- To move the cursor, press the left or right arrows.
- To enter numbers or symbols, select 123#.
- To change the case of letters, select .
- To delete the previous character, select
- To enter a space, select Space.
- 6. Select **OK** when you finish entering your password.
- 7. Confirm the displayed network settings and select **Start Setup** to save them.

A message appears when setup is complete.

- 8. Do one of the following:
 - If setup was successful, select **Close** to exit or wait for the message to disappear.
 - If setup was unsuccessful, select **Print Check Report** to print a network setup report or **Re-enter** to re-enter your network name and password.
- 9. Press the \widehat{m} home button to exit.

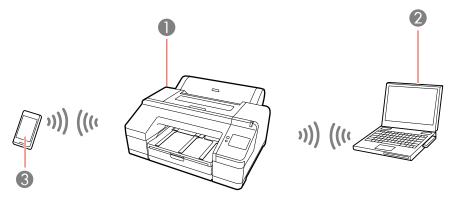
You see the I Wi-Fi icon on the LCD screen and should be able to connect to your product directly from your computer or device, and then print. If you are printing from a computer, make sure you installed the network software from the Epson website.

Note: If you don't see the **Wi-Fi** icon, you may have selected the wrong network name or entered the password incorrectly. Repeat these steps to try again.

Wi-Fi Direct Mode Setup

You can set up your product to communicate directly with your computer or another device without requiring a wireless router or access point. In Wi-Fi Direct Mode, the product itself acts as a network access point for up to 8 devices.

Enabling Wi-Fi Direct Mode

Parent topic: Wi-Fi or Wired Networking

Enabling Wi-Fi Direct Mode

You can enable Wi-Fi Direct mode to allow direct communication between your product and computer or other devices without a wireless router or access point.

Note: This setting can be locked by an administrator. If you cannot access or change this setting, contact your administrator for assistance.

1. Press the \widehat{m} home button, if necessary.

2. Select the **IIII** network icon.

Note: Icon may look different depending on connection status.

3. Select Wi-Fi Direct > Start Setup > iOS or Other OS Devices .

Wi-Fi Direct is enabled, and the Wi-Fi network name (SSID) and password are displayed.

Note: If Wi-Fi Direct is already enabled, the network name (SSID), password, number of connected devices, and general procedures for setting up other devices are displayed.

- 4. Use your computer or wireless device to select the Wi-Fi network name (SSID) displayed on the LCD screen, then enter the password shown.
- 5. When a connection is established, select **Complete** to finish.
- 6. Select **Close** on the LCD screen to close the network connection settings screen or press the \widehat{w} home button to exit.

You see the III Wi-Fi Direct icon on the LCD screen and should be able to connect to your product directly from your computer or device, and then print. If you are printing from a computer, make sure you installed the network software from the Epson website.

Note: If you don't see the Wi-Fi Direct icon on the LCD screen, you may have selected the wrong network name or entered the password incorrectly. Repeat these steps to try again.

Any connected devices will be disconnected when you turn off the printer. To reconnect after turning the printer back on, repeat these steps.

Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS)

If your network uses a WPS-enabled wireless router or access point, you can quickly connect your product to the network using Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS).

Note: To check if your router is WPS-enabled, look for a button labeled **WPS** on your router or access point. If there is no hardware button, there may be a virtual WPS button in the software for the device. Check your network product documentation for details.

Using WPS to Connect to a Network

Using WPS to Connect to a Network

If you have a WPS-enabled wireless router or access point, you can use Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) to connect your product to the network.

Note: This setting can be locked by an administrator. If you cannot access or change this setting, contact your administrator for assistance.

- 1. Press the \widehat{m} home button, if necessary.
- 2. Select the **IIII** network icon.

Note: Icon may look different depending on connection status.

- 3. Select Router > Start Setup or Change Settings > Push Button Setup (WPS).
- 4. Hold down the WPS button on your wireless router until the security light flashes.
- 5. Select **Start Setup** on the LCD screen within two minutes of activating WPS on your router.

If connection was successful, a confirmation message appears. Select **Close** or wait for the message to time out. If connection was unsuccessful, an error message appears. Select **OK** or **Close** and repeat these steps to try again.

6. Press the \widehat{m} home button to exit.

You see the I Wi-Fi icon on the LCD screen and should be able to connect to your product directly from your computer or device, and then print. If you are printing from a computer, make sure you installed the product software from the Epson website.

Note: If you don't see the I Wi-Fi icon, restart the access point, move it closer to the printer, and repeat these steps to try again. If it still does not work, print a network connection report and check the solution.

Printing a Network Status Sheet

You can print a network status sheet to help you determine the causes of any problems you may have using your product on a network.

Before you begin, make sure paper is loaded in the product.

- 3. Select **Print Status Sheet > Print**.

Examine the settings shown on the network status sheet to diagnose any problems you have.

Error Codes and Messages

Error code and message	Solution
E-1 Confirm that the network cable is connected and network devices such as a hub, router, or access point are turned on.	Make sure your router, access point, and/or hub are turned on, and the network cable is securely connected to your device and your product. If you are trying to set up Wi-Fi, remove the network cable and set up Wi-Fi again. Ethernet and Wi-Fi cannot be connected at the same time.

Error code and message	Solution
E-2, E-3, or E-7	Check the following:
No wireless network names (SSID) found. Confirm that the router/access point is turned on and the wireless network (SSID)	 Make sure your router or access point is turned on and is correctly connected to your computer or network device.
is set up correctly. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	 Turn off the router or access point, wait about 10 seconds, and turn it on again.
No wireless network names (SSID) found. Confirm that the wireless network name (SSID) of the PC you wish to connect is set up correctly. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	 Move your product closer to your router or access point, and remove any obstacles between them. Also move your product away from devices such as wireless phones or microwaves.
Entered security key/password does not match the one set for your router/access point. Confirm security key/password. Contact your network administrator for assistance.	 Confirm that the SSID shown on the network connection report matches the label on your router or access point. Also make sure your SSID uses only ASCII characters and symbols, or your product cannot display the SSID correctly.
	 If you are trying to connect using the WPS push button method, make sure your router or access point supports it.
	 If you are using a network password, check the label on your router or access point to confirm that you are using the correct password, or check with your network administrator or router/access point documentation.
	 If you are connecting to a smart device that generates an SSID, check the device documentation for the SSID and password you should use.

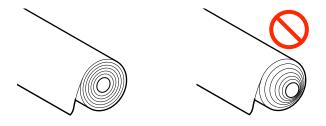

Media Handling Precautions

Follow these guidelines as you load media in your product and remove printed media:

- Maintain a constant room temperature when using Epson special media; optimal conditions are between 59 °F (15 °C) and 77 °F (25 °C), with 40 to 60% humidity. Changes in temperature and humidity may cause paper to become wavy or curled.
- Avoid touching the printable surface of the paper with your bare hands; moisture and oils from your hands can affect print quality.
- Handle paper by the edges but do not rub your hands along the edges of the media; the sharp edges could cut you. Wear cotton gloves when handling media, if possible.
- Do not fold the media or otherwise damage its printable surface; do not get the media wet.
- Make sure media is clean from debris and dust before loading.
- Do not throw away the paper packaging as you can use it to store the paper.
- If you are loading Epson UltraSmooth Fine Art Paper, disable the **Auto Loading** setting or the pressure roller may leave marks on the surface of the paper.
- Do not remove or insert the paper cassette while printing from the paper cassette. It may cause print quality to decline or cause a paper jam. If you remove the paper cassette while printing, wait until printing is complete to reinsert the paper cassette.
- When loading paper in the paper cassette, follow the steps on the LCD screen and always remove the paper cassette from the printer to load paper in it. If paper is loaded while the paper cassette is still in the printer, it could cause print quality to decline or cause a paper jam.

- Load media just before printing on it to avoid creases from the pressure rollers; creases may cause jams or cause the media to rub against the print head. Remove roll paper that is not in use from the printer; if roll paper is left in the printer for a long period of time, paper quality may decline. Rewind the media and store it in its original packaging.
- Do not load media if the edges are uneven on the roll; this could cause feeding problems. Rewind the media on the roll or use a different roll.



- Place unused media in its original packaging for storage. Keep the media dry and avoid storage locations that are subject to direct sunlight, excessive heat, or high humidity. Store cut sheets flat to prevent curling.
- Do not use media that is too thick, too thin, wrinkled, torn, cut, folded or creased, curled, or has a sticker or tape on it; otherwise, the media may jam or the prints may be soiled. (See the link below for paper specifications.) Flatten the paper before use by bending it in the opposite direction. For roll paper, cut off any damaged ends and reload the roll. For cut sheets, use new paper.
- Make sure to remove any protective tape from the media before loading, otherwise paper jams could occur.
- Dry printed media completely before folding or stacking it. Do not touch, rub, or scratch the printed surface, otherwise you may damage the print.
- Do not place prints in an album before they are completely dry, otherwise you may blur the ink.
- Do not use a dryer to dry the prints.
- Display and store printed media as instructed in the media documentation.
- Avoid placing prints in direct sunlight.
- Typically, prints and photos can fade over time due to the effects of light and various environmental factors. This also applies to Epson special media, however, the degree of color distortion can be minimized by following proper storage procedures. See the documentation supplied with Epson special media for detailed information on handling the paper after printing.

Note: The colors of photos, posters, and other printed materials may appear different under different lighting conditions.

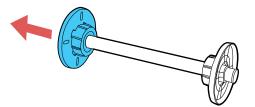

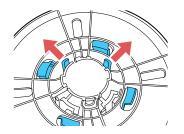
For roll canvas media with a 2-inch core, you need to remove the roll media adapter from the paper stop to match the core size of your roll canvas media.

Note: Thin media (less than 250 gsm) is not supported for this core size.

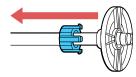
1. Remove the black paper stop from the spindle.



2. Push out the two hooks on the black paper stop and remove the gray adapter from the paper stop.



3. To remove the gray adapter from the other paper stop, slide it off the spindle.

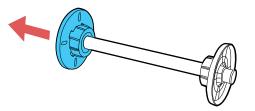

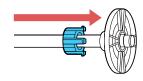

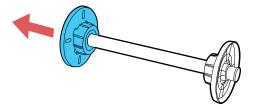

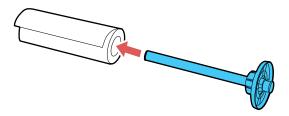

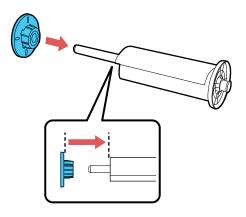
3. Insert the spindle into the roll paper core so that the end of the roll paper is facing towards you.

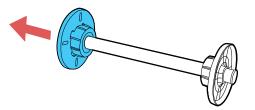

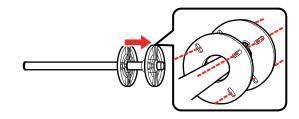

1. Remove the black paper stop from the spindle.



- 2. Remove any roll media adapters from the black and gray paper stops, if necessary.
- 3. Slide the spacer all the way onto the spindle until it reaches the gray paper stop on the other end. Make sure the holes in the spacer and paper stop line up exactly.



To remove the spacer, remove the black paper stop from the spindle and then remove the spacer by holding its outer edge and pulling it straight off.

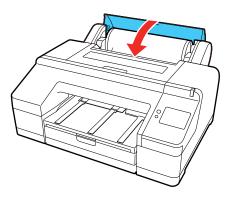

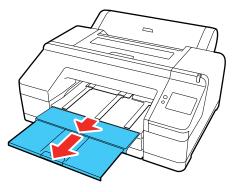
You can load roll paper with a 2- or 3-inch core and a width of up to 17 inches (43 cm).

- 1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
- 2. On the control panel, select the 🔟 icon.
- 3. Select **How To...** and follow the on-screen instructions to load roll paper.
- 4. Close the roll paper cover.

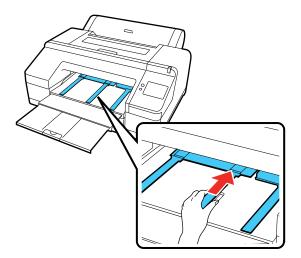


Note: To prevent dust from accumulating inside the printer, always keep the roll paper cover closed unless you are loading or unloading media.

5. Slide out the output tray. Do not raise the paper stopper or the roll paper may not eject correctly.



Note: If you are printing on plain paper or thin media types, raise the paper eject support. This prevents paper from curling up in the output tray, which can cause paper jams and print head strikes.



When you are done loading roll paper, the paper setting screen appears.

6. Set the paper settings for the roll paper you loaded.

Note: The output tray can only hold one sheet of roll paper at a time. Remove each sheet as it is ejected without letting the sheets stack up on the output tray. Do not allow cut sheets and roll paper to stack up together.

Cutting Roll Paper

The printer has a built-in cutter that can automatically cut most paper types or you can cut your prints manually. When **Auto Cut** is turned on, paper is automatically cut after each page prints, or if the roll paper leading edge is not straight.

To switch between automatic or manual cutting methods, select Annual Settings > Paper Source Settings > Roll Paper Setup > Cut Settings > Auto Cut on the control panel or adjust the auto cut settings in the printer driver. The setting selected in the printer driver overrides the control panel setting.

Caution: Do not use the built-in cutter with these paper types or you may damage or dull the blade:

- · Fine art paper
- Canvas
- Matte poster board

When you print on these paper types, you need to disable the **Auto Cut** setting and cut the print manually. You can print cutting guidelines to help you.

Note: If the **Quick Cut** setting is enabled, the top area may become slightly uneven depending on the image since the print stops while the leading edge of the roll paper is cut. If you do not want to have an uneven leading edge, disable **Quick Cut**.

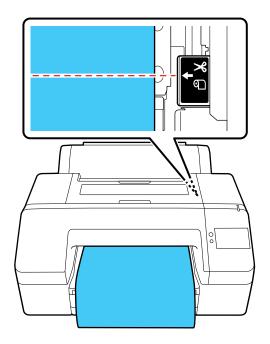
You can disable the Auto Cut option to keep your prints on the roll until you manually cut them using the built-in cutter.

- 1. Turn off the **Auto Cut** setting in the printer driver or the control panel, depending on the situation:
 - If you want to cut the paper manually, turn off the setting in the printer driver. Select Advanced > Roll Paper Option > Auto Cut.

Note: The **Auto Cut** setting in the printer driver takes priority over the setting in the control panel. The printer driver setting returns to automatic cutting when you close the application.

- If you are using a paper type that cannot be cut with the built-in cutter, turn off the setting in the control panel. From the roll paper information area, select Advanced Paper Settings > Auto Cut > Off.
- 2. Print your file.
- 3. Select the 🔤 cut icon.

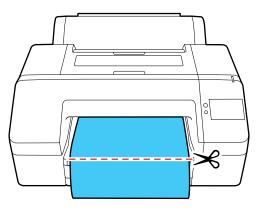
- 4. Do one of the following:
 - If you want to move the paper into a different cutting position, press and hold the 🖬 or 🛄 icon until the cut location reaches the cutting position labeled on the printer, and then select **Cut**.



• If you don't need to reposition the paper, select **Cut** to cut the paper with the built-in cutter.

Note: The minimum length of paper you can cut with the built-in cutter is 3.15 in. (80 mm) or 5 inches (127 mm), depending on the paper type. These minimum lengths cannot be changed. Paper is automatically fed if the length is shorter than the minimum. Cut any excess paper by hand, as necessary.

Note: If the paper cannot be cut by the built-in cutter, press the **w** icon until your print is clear of the printer, then cut the print by hand.

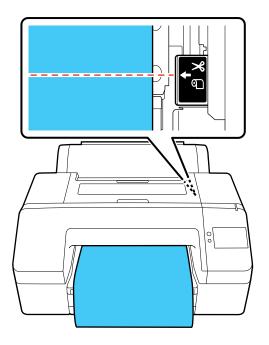

When you disable the Auto Cut setting, you can print a cutting guideline between print jobs as a guide for manual cutting.

- 1. Do one of the following to disable the **Auto Cut** setting:

 - Select Off as the Auto Cut setting from the printer driver's Main tab.
- 2. Print your file.
- 3. Select the 🜌 cut icon and do one of the following:

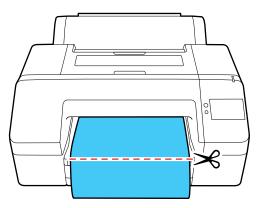

When you finish printing on roll paper, remove it from the printer to avoid indenting or creasing the paper.

Note: If you enabled **Remaining Amount Management**, the printer prints a barcode on the leading edge of the roll when you remove the roll paper. When you reload the paper, the printer reads the barcode and automatically sets the paper type and amount remaining.

1. Confirm that **Ready to print** appears on the LCD screen and then select **Eject Paper**.

Note: If printed paper is not cut and remains loaded in the printer, a confirmation message appears. You can print on a variety of paper types and sizes from 8×10 inches (203×254 mm) to A2 (16.5×23.4 inches [420×594 mm])/ 17×22 inches (432×559 mm), 8 to 17 in. (203 to 432 mm) wide, 10 to 23.4 in. (154 to 594 mm) long, and 0.003 to 0.01 in. (0.08 to 0.27 mm) thick from the paper cassette.

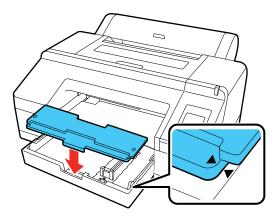
Note:

- Do not load the following paper types in the paper cassette. Instead, feed and print these types of paper as **Cut Sheet** or **Poster Board**:
 - Epson Legacy Baryta II, Epson Legacy Platine, Epson Legacy Fibre, Epson Legacy Etching, or Epson Legacy Textured
 - Epson Exhibition Fiber Paper or Epson Exhibition Canvas Matte
 - Epson Hot Press Bright or Epson Hot Press Natural
 - Epson Cold Press Bright or Epson Cold Press Natural
 - Epson Velvet Fine Art Paper
 - Epson UltraSmooth Fine Art Paper
 - Epson Watercolor Paper Radiant White
- We recommend refilling the paper cassette once paper has completely run out, rather than adding on top of paper already in the cassette.
- If the paper eject support is raised, lower it before printing.
- The output tray can hold up to 50 cut sheets when printing on paper from the paper cassette. However, when a paper's maximum number of sheets that can be loaded in the paper cassette is less than 50, the maximum number of sheets the output tray can hold is the same as the number of sheets in the paper cassette. Do not allow more than 50 cut sheets to stack up on the output tray and do not mix roll paper and cut sheets on the output tray.
- 1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
- 2. On the control panel, select 🖪 Menu > Paper Setting.
- 3. Select **Paper Cassette** and then select **How To Load**.

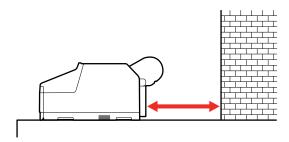

Note: When printing on media loaded from the front manual feeder, part of it comes out from the back of the printer during printing. Depending on the size of the cut sheet or poster board you are printing on, make sure there is enough space behind the printer:

- A3+ (13 × 19 inches [329 × 483 mm]): approximately 10.2 in. (260 mm)
- A3 (11.7 × 16.5 inches [297 × 420 mm]): approximately 7.9 in. (200 mm)
- A4 (8.3 × 11.7 inches [210 × 297 mm]): approximately 2.75 in. (70 mm)
- 1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
- 2. On the control panel, select Honu > Paper Setting.

You can use the printer control panel or Epson Media Installer to create and store up to 16 custom media settings for printing on paper types that are not already in your product's control panel and printer driver by default.

Note: Once you create and register a custom media setting, the registered setting can only be edited from the source it was created with. For example, you cannot use the control panel to edit a **Custom Paper Setting** that was created using Epson Media Installer.

You can create custom paper settings from the printer control panel.

Note: If you are using non-Epson paper or media, consult the paper manufacturer for suggested reference papers and print settings for use with the paper or media.

- 1. Load the type of paper that you want to configure in the printer.
- 2. Select Amenu > General Settings > Printer Settings > Custom Paper Setting.
- 3. Select an open custom paper setting from the list.

Note: To modify an existing custom paper setting, select it from the list. You cannot change a custom paper setting that was registered using Epson Media Installer.

4. Enter the name for the custom paper setting.

5. Select Change Reference Paper.

A confirmation message appears.

- 6. Select **Yes** and do one of the following:
 - Select the reference paper recommended by the paper manufacturer.
 - If no reference paper is available, follow these suggestions to select a paper preset that is similar to the paper that you loaded:
 - Photo paper: Baryta
 - Fine art paper: UltraSmooth Fine Art
 - Canvas: Canvas Satin or Canvas Matte
 - Plain paper: Plain Paper
 - Glossy paper: Photo Paper
 - Thick, non-glossy paper: Matte Paper
 - Thin, soft, non-glossy paper: Plain Paper
 - Canvas-like paper: **Canvas**
 - Cotton paper with a rough surface: UltraSmooth Fine Art
 - Special media such as film, cloth, poster board, or tracing paper: Others
- 7. Select Advanced Paper Settings and enter a value for the following settings:
 - Paper Thickness (check the Specification Sheet for the paper, if available)
 - Roll Core Diameter (roll paper only)
 - Paper Feed Offset (leave at 0 unless you see horizontal banding)

Note: The **Paper Feed Offset** setting allows you to adjust the difference between the data size and the print size. For example, if you are printing at a data size of 3.9 inches (100 mm) and a print size of 4 inches (101 mm), the offset is 1.0%. Therefore, you would enter a value of -1.0%. If you change even one item set in the Paper menu, you need to perform **Paper Feed Offset** again.

8. Select any additional settings in the Advanced Paper Settings menu, as necessary.

After you create a new custom paper setting, it will appear in the list of available paper types. You should perform a manual feed adjustment before printing on the custom media. Selecting Custom Paper Configurations

Epson Media Installer downloads selected paper type settings from an online server and then registers those settings to your printer and printer driver.

You can use Epson Media Installer to download settings for a paper type or use the settings as a starting point for a similar paper and then edit them, as needed.

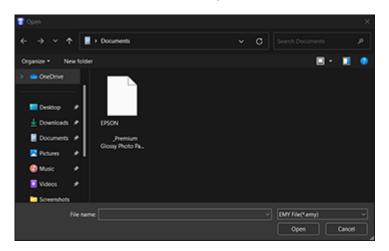

4. Select the **Media Type** setting that matches the paper you loaded.

Note:

- Click **Acquire Info** to refresh the settings if you loaded or changed paper after opening the print window.
- When printing from the printer driver on a stored Custom Paper Setting, make sure the Media Type in the printer driver matches the paper type selected for the Custom Paper Setting you are using.
- 5. If you are using non-Epson paper or media and you need to fine-tune its performance, select the **Media Type** setting that is closest to the paper you loaded, click the **Paper Config** button, and adjust the paper configuration options as necessary.
- 6. Select a **Color** option:
 - To print a color document or photo, select the **Color** setting.
 - To print high quality black and white photos, select the **Advanced B&W Photo** setting.
 - To print text and graphics when plain paper is the selected media type, select the **Black** setting.
- 7. For the **Level** setting, select a print quality setting or select **Quality Options** and choose the quality option that matches the print quality you want to use.

Note: The available Level settings depend on the Media Type you selected.

8. Select **Black Enhance Overcoat** to increase the black density by overcoating light gray ink on the dark parts of printouts.

Note: The **Black Enhance Overcoat** setting may not be available depending on the selected paper type.

- 9. Select the desired color management option as the **Mode** setting.
- 10. Select the **Source** setting that matches the paper feeding method you are using.
- 11. Select the size of the paper you loaded as the **Document Size** setting.

Note: You can also select the User Defined setting to create a custom paper size.

12. If you are printing on roll paper, click the **Roll Paper Option** button and adjust the settings as necessary.

- 13. When **Auto Cut** is enabled, select the **Save Roll Paper** checkbox to have the printer cut the roll paper at the end of the image as it is positioned on the page.
- 14. If you want to print a photo without borders, select Borderless.

Note: You must select a compatible borderless paper type and size to print without borders. Check the borderless paper compatibility list for details.

- 15. To see a preview of how your document or photo will print, select **Print Preview**. (The preview appears after you click **Print** but before printing starts.)
- 16. To layout multiple print jobs for printing all at once, select Layout Manager.

Adjusts the ink saturation level.

Advanced B&W Photo Options - Windows

If you select **Advanced B&W Photo** as the **Print Mode** option, you can easily produce neutral and toned black-and-white prints. Whether your photo is color or grayscale, you can use this screening and color management technology to create stunning black-and-white prints. Select any **Mode** setting except **ICM** and then click **Advanced** and select any of the available options. You can also use **Black Enhanced Overcoat** to print darker tones of black.

Color Toning

Adds tone (hue) to your black-and-white output. The default is **Neutral**, which provides a neutral tonal scale print. You can also choose other popular presets such as **Cool**, **Warm**, and **Sepia**. Note that the presets affect the target in the tone color circle.

Tone

Changes the entire tonal scale of your black-and-white output. While **Darker** is the default setting, you may see better results if you choose **Dark**. The tone color circle adjusts the hue of your black-and-white print. Click on any portion of the color wheel or enter corresponding values to customize the tone (hue) to add to your print. The closer you select to the edge of the wheel, the more color you add.

Brightness

Adjusts the overall lightness and darkness of your image.

Contrast

Adjusts the difference between the light and dark areas of your image.

Shadow Tonality

Controls tonality only in the shadow areas of your image.

Highlight Tonality

Controls tonality only in the highlight areas of your image.

Max Optical Density

Adjusts the overall density or focus of the print. Create a soft focus print by lowering the density setting.

Highlight Point Shift

Helps reduce gloss differential on glossy media by adding density to the highlights of your image.

You can use the Speed/Quality slider to set the desired quality level and select any of the available **Level** options to fine-tune the quality of your print. Some settings may be unavailable, depending on the paper type and border setting you have chosen.

High Speed

Speeds up printing but may reduce print quality.

Edge Smoothing

Smooths jagged edges in low-resolution images such as screen captures or images from the Web.

Finest Detail

Sharpens edges on vector-based data including text, graphics, and line art. (This setting does not affect photographs.)

Note: Enabling Finest Detail may decrease the print speed.

Black Enhance Overcoat

Prints darker tones of black by overcoating the black ink with gray.

Note: Printing with Black Enhance Overcoat increases the edge margins.

You can adjust the **Mode** setting to fine-tune the colors in your printout or turn off color management in your printer software.

EPSON Standard (sRGB)

Increases the contrast in images.

Note: This is the standard mode for most photos and documents when not using an ICC profile.

Adobe RGB

Matches image colors to the Adobe RGB color standard. Use this setting if your source file was captured in Adobe RGB.

ICM

Automatically adjusts colors based on the printer's ICC profile and the selected **Media Type** setting, using the Image Color Matching system. Click the **Advanced** button to choose the input profile and other settings.

Note: In most cases, you get better results by applying color management in your application, rather than in the printer driver.

Off (No Color Adjustment)

Turns off color management in your printer software so you can manage color using only your application software.

Note: An ICC profile is required if color management is turned off.

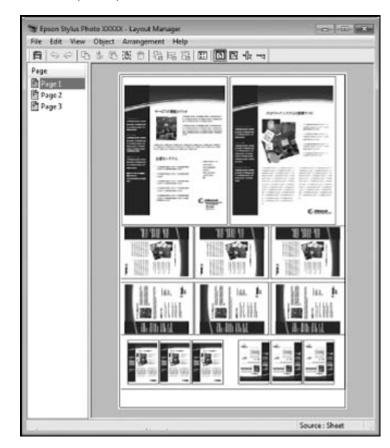

Color Toning

Adds tone (hue) to your black-and-white output. The default is **Neutral**, which provides a neutral tonal scale print. You can also choose other popular presets such as **Cool**, **Warm**, and **Sepia**. Note that the presets affect the target in the tone color circle.

Tone

Changes the entire tonal scale of your black-and-white output. While **Darker** is the default setting, you may see better results if you choose **Dark**. The tone color circle adjusts the hue of your black-and-white print. Click on any portion of the color wheel or enter corresponding values to customize the tone (hue) to add to your print. The closer you select to the edge of the wheel, the more color you add.

Brightness

Adjusts the overall lightness and darkness of your image.

Contrast

Adjusts the difference between the light and dark areas of the overall image.

Shadow Tonality

Controls tonality only in the shadow areas of your image.

Highlight Tonality

Controls tonality only in the highlight areas of your image.

Max Optical Density

Adjusts the overall density or focus of the print. Create a soft focus print by lowering the density setting.

Highlight Point Shift

Helps reduce gloss differential on glossy media by adding density to the highlights of your image.

When the 4 notification icon appears above an ink color on the LCD screen, the ink color is low or expended. If one of the installed ink cartridges is expended, printing cannot be performed until the expended ink is replaced. If an ink cartridge is expended while printing, the print job will stop and you can continue printing after replacing the ink.

If you proceed to print with an ink cartridge that is running low, you may be required to replace the ink while the print job is still in progress. If you have to install a new ink cartridge during a print job, colors in your printout may look different depending on how the ink dries. To avoid this, Epson recommends that you replace any low ink cartridges with new ones before printing large jobs. The removed ink can be reinstalled later and used until the remaining ink is expended.

The maintenance box stores ink that gets flushed from the system during print head cleaning. If a message appears or the ⁽¹⁾/₍₂₎ notification icon appears above a maintenance box icon on the LCD screen, the amount of available space in the maintenance box is low. When a maintenance box is full, you need to replace it.

Note: Please dispose of your used Epson branded ink cartridges and maintenance boxes responsibly and in accordance with local requirements. If you would like to return your used ink cartridges and maintenance boxes to Epson for proper disposal, please go to epson.com/recycle for more information.

Ink Safety Precautions

Follow these guidelines as you handle the ink and maintenance boxes.

Ink Cartridge Handling Precautions

- Keep ink cartridges out of the reach of children and do not drink the ink.
- When using the installation ink cartridges included with the printer, most of the ink is consumed during initial ink charging. Be sure to have replacement cartridges handy.

- Store ink cartridges at room temperature, out of direct sunlight, and use them before the expiration date printed on the packaging.
- Allow ink cartridges that have been stored at low temperatures for an extended period of time to return to room temperature over a period of three hours.
- To ensure print quality, use ink cartridges within six months of installing them.
- Do not shake the ink cartridges too hard, otherwise ink may leak.
- The green IC chip on each ink cartridge retains a variety of cartridge-related information, such as the ink cartridge status, so that the cartridge may be removed and reinserted freely. Do not touch the green IC chip on the ink cartridges. This may prevent normal operation and printing.
- Install ink cartridges in all the ink cartridge slots. You cannot print if any of the slots are empty.
- Do not leave the printer without ink cartridges installed. The ink in the printer will dry out and the printer will not function as expected. Leave ink cartridges in all slots even when you are not using the printer.
- If you remove an ink cartridge for later use, protect the ink supply area from dirt and dust and store it in the same environment as the product. Note that there is a valve in the ink supply port, making covers or plugs unnecessary, but care is needed to prevent the ink from staining items that the cartridge touches. Do not touch the ink cartridge ink supply port or surrounding area.
- Dried ink on the supply port may cause ink leaks when the cartridge is reinserted and used. Wipe off any excess ink before reinserting.
- Do not dismantle or alter ink cartridges. This could damage the print head and may prevent the product from printing properly. Ink could also get on your skin or in your eyes.
- Do not drop ink cartridges or subject them to impacts, otherwise ink may leak.
- The ink cartridges may contain recycled materials; this does not affect printer functions or performance.
- To maintain the quality of the print head, this product stops printing before ink cartridges are completely expended.
- If ink gets on your skin, wash it thoroughly with soap and water. If ink gets into your eyes, flush them immediately with water. If discomfort or vision problems persist, see a doctor immediately. If ink gets into your mouth, spit it out and see a doctor right away.
- Epson's warranties do not extend to any damage caused by the use of third-party ink or ink not designed for your printer.

• Keep maintenance boxes out of the reach of children. Do not allow children to drink from or handle the maintenance boxes.

- Do not reuse maintenance boxes that have been removed from the printer and exposed to the air for a long period of time. The box will not absorb any more ink.
- Do not disassemble the maintenance box; otherwise ink may get into your eyes or on your skin.
- Do not touch the chip on the side of the maintenance box or you may prevent normal operation and printing.
- Be careful not to touch any ink when you handle the maintenance boxes.
- If ink gets on your skin, wash it thoroughly with soap and water. If ink gets into your eyes, flush them immediately with water. If discomfort or vision problems persist, see a doctor immediately. If ink gets into your mouth, spit it out and see a doctor right away.
- Do not replace the maintenance box while printing, otherwise ink may leak.
- When using the installation maintenance box included with the printer, some of the ink is absorbed during initial ink charging. Be sure to have replacement maintenance boxes handy.

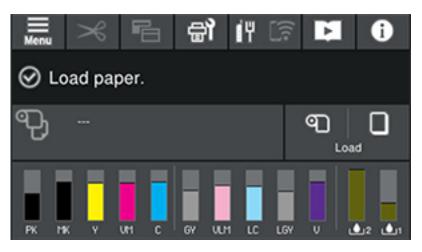

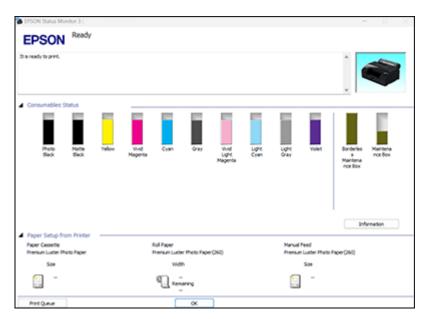

Removing and Installing Ink Cartridges

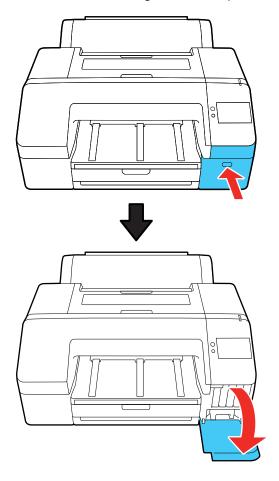
Make sure you have your replacement cartridges handy before you begin. You must install new cartridges immediately after removing the old ones. Replace all expended ink cartridges. You cannot print if any of the ink cartridges are expended or any ink slots are empty.

Note: If the remaining ink in a cartridge falls below the minimum amount, you can continue printing after replacing the ink cartridge. If the remaining ink level is below the minimum amount and printing is continued, then you may need to replace the ink cartridge during printing. If you replace it while printing, colors may look different depending on how the ink dries. We recommend first replacing the ink cartridge with a new one before printing. The removed ink cartridge can be reinstalled and used until the remaining amount falls below the minimum amount.

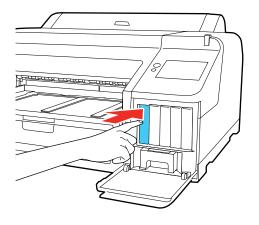

1. Turn on your product.

2. Press the ink cartridge cover to open it.



3. Press in on the ink cartridge you want to replace.

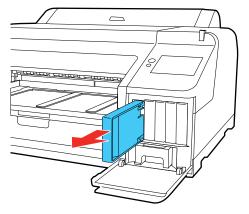


Note: Used ink cartridges may have ink around the ink supply port, so be careful not to get any ink on the surrounding area when removing the cartridges. Dispose of used cartridges carefully. Do not take the used cartridge apart or try to refill it.

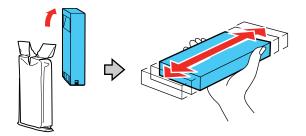

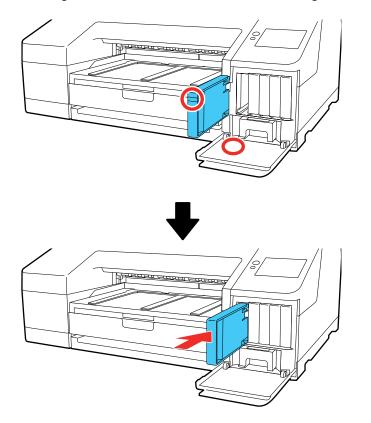

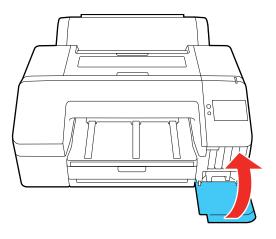

Replacing the Borderless Maintenance Box

The borderless maintenance box (maintenance box 2) absorbs ink during borderless printing. When you see a message on the LCD screen, replace the borderless maintenance box.

Note:

- Do not replace the borderless maintenance box while printing. Printing stops if the lock on the borderless maintenance box is released, which may result in color variation and a decline in print quality once printing is resumed.
- Do not reuse a borderless maintenance box you have removed from the printer and exposed to air for a long period of time. The box will not absorb any more ink.

If running these utilities does not solve the problem, you may need to replace the ink cartridges, clean the roll paper feeder, or run a Power Cleaning.

Print Head Maintenance

Print Head Maintenance

Print head maintenance ensures the best print quality.

Perform the following maintenance functions as necessary:

- **Print Head Nozzle Check**: Check for clogged nozzles before each print job or if you have not used the printer for an extended period of time. Inspect the printed check pattern and clean the print head if you notice faint or missing areas.
- Print Head Cleaning: Clean the print head if you notice faint areas or gaps in your printouts.
- **Print Head Alignment**: Adjust the position of the print head if your printouts are grainy or out of focus.
- **Paper Feed Adjust**: Adjust the paper feed if you are unable to resolve banding issues even after cleaning and aligning the print head.

Print Head Cleaning

If print quality has declined and the nozzle check pattern indicates clogged nozzles, you can clean the print head.

Consider the following when preparing to clean the print head:

- Ink is consumed during print head cleaning. Clean the print head only if the print quality declines.
- Print head cleaning and Power Cleaning consume ink from all cartridges, even if you print primarily in black and white.
- You cannot clean the print head if an ink cartridge is expended, and may not be able to clean it when a cartridge is low. You must replace the ink cartridge first.
- Power Cleaning consumes more ink than print head cleaning. Check the remaining ink level in advance, and prepare a new ink cartridge before you start cleaning if the ink is low. If the nozzles are still clogged after performing Power Cleaning, turn off the printer and leave it off overnight. If the nozzles are still clogged, contact Epson for support.
- Prepare a new maintenance box if the current maintenance box is low on space. Because ink used during cleaning does not evaporate quickly, repeated head cleanings can fill the maintenance box.
- You cannot clean the print head if the temperature conditions are not within specifications. See the link below.
- The printer may automatically perform head cleaning to help maintain print quality.

Media Setting Optimization

Optimize the media settings when you have registered media settings or when you have changed any Advanced settings for saved media settings. This helps correct any individual differences between the media and the printer settings.

Be sure to run both a Paper Feed Adjust and a Print Head Alignment.

Before you make adjustments, note the following:

- Adjustment varies depending on the loaded media. Make adjustments using the media on which you want to print and select the paper type that matches the paper in the printer. When adjusting using non-Epson paper, make sure you register the custom paper in advance.

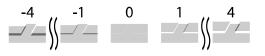

 A confirmation screen is displayed.
- 7. Select OK.

Cleaning Your Product

To keep your product working at its best, you should clean it regularly (about once a month).

Note: Do not use a hard brush, benzene, alcohol, or paint thinner to clean the product or you may damage it. Do not use oil or other lubricants inside the product or let water get inside.

- 1. Remove any paper from the product.
- 2. Turn off the product.
- 3. Make sure the printer and the LCD screen have turned off and then unplug the power cable.
- 4. Disconnect any connected cables.
- 5. Use a soft, clean cloth to remove any dust or dirt from the outside of the product.
- 6. If your product is still dirty, dampen the cloth with a small amount of water and a mild detergent, firmly wring it out, and then wipe the printer's surface. Then wipe away any remaining moisture with a soft, dry cloth.

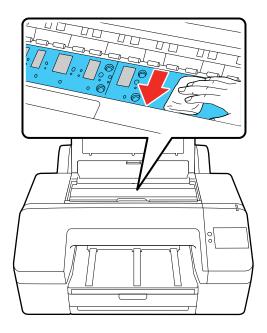

Cleaning the Platen

You should clean the interior of the printer about once a month to prevent ink and paper particles from accumulating in the printer. Carefully follow the steps here to clean the platen to remove ink, paper particles, and lint.

Caution: If ink remains on these parts, it could transfer to your printouts. Continued use of your product with ink, paper particles, or lint on these surfaces could damage the print heads or clog the nozzles.

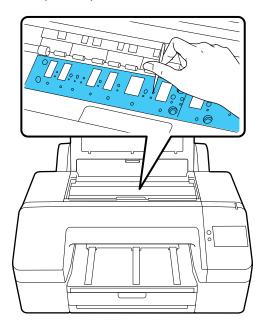
- 1. Turn off the product, wait for the LCD screen to turn off, and unplug the power cable from the electrical outlet.
- 2. Wait for one minute before continuing.
- 3. Open the printer cover.
- 4. Use a soft, lint-free cloth to thoroughly remove dust and dirt from the platen as shown here. Wipe from the back to the front of the platen to avoid spreading the dirt.



Caution: Do not touch the ink tubes inside the printer or the printer may be damaged. Do not touch the rollers or ink absorption parts (parts in gray above) or prints may be soiled.

Note: For stubborn dirt, dampen a soft cloth with neutral detergent. Wring it out and clean the platen as shown above. Dry the platen with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth when you are finished.

5. If any paper particles have accumulated in the holes shown here, use a pointed object such as a toothpick to push the material into the holes.



6. Close the printer cover, plug in the power cord, and turn the product back on.

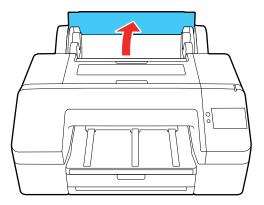

Note: You can use a cleaning sheet only once.

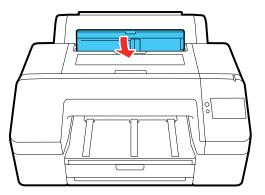

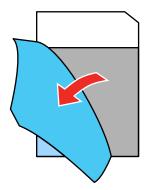

Note: Close the paper support if it is open.

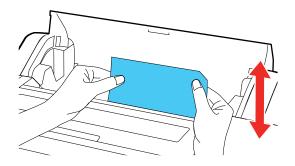


4. Remove the protective film from the cleaning sheet.



Note: Do not touch the adhesive on the sheet (the dark gray area).

5. With the adhesive facing toward you, insert the cleaning sheet on the left side of the printer until it reaches the end of the roll paper feed slot, then pull it out. Repeat this two to three times. Repeat for the center and right side of the roll paper feed slot.



Note: If the cleaning sheet gets fed through the printer, select the **1** icon and then remove the cleaning sheet.

6. Select **Cancel** on the LCD screen.

Note: If you want to stop a pending job, press the 0 power button to turn off the printer. If you want to continue a job, load the correct paper to print on.

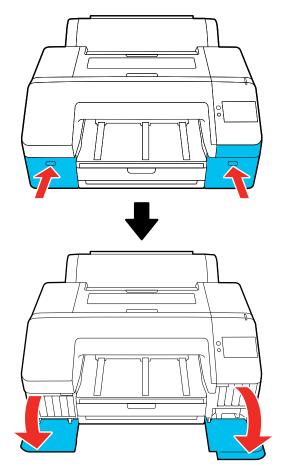
Replacing the Cutter

If you notice that your paper does not cut cleanly, you may need to replace the cutter.

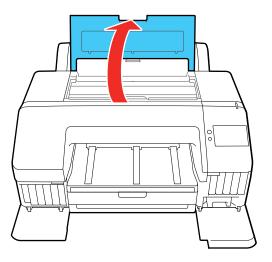
Note: Take care not to damage the cutter blade. Dropping it or knocking it against hard objects may chip the blade.

- 1. Turn off the printer.
- 2. Remove any paper from the printer.

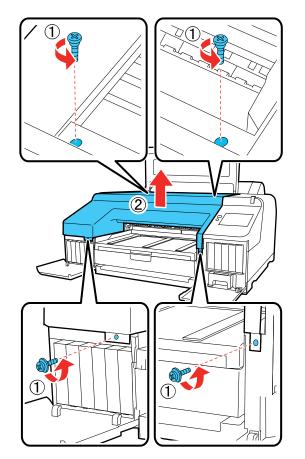
3. Open the left and right ink cartridge covers.



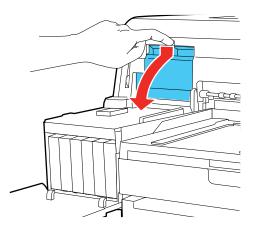
4. Open the printer cover.



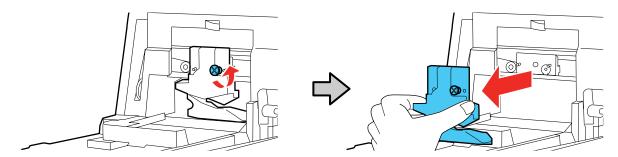
5. Use a Phillips-head screwdriver to remove the four screws securing the front cover, then remove the front cover.



6. Press in on the tab on the cutter cover, release it, and pull down on the cutter cover to open it.

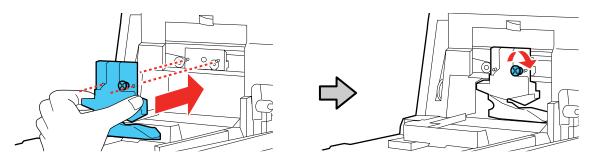


7. Loosen the screw holding the cutter in place and carefully remove the cutter.

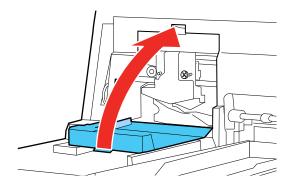


Warning: Keep the cutter out of the reach of children. The blade is sharp and can cause injury.

8. Align the pin on the new cutter with the hole in the product and insert it. Tighten the cutter screw securely.

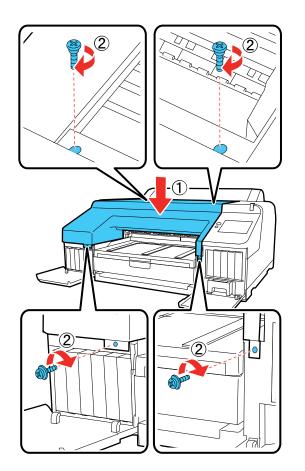


9. Close the cutter cover as shown and press it in until it clicks into place.



10. Replace the front cover. Insert and tighten the four screws.

Note: Use the screws with washers to secure the front section of the cover.



Note: If the front cover is not properly replaced, an error occurs and the printer does not respond.

- 12. Close the left and right ink cartridge covers.

Cleaning the Print Head Cap Area

If the print head is clogged and automatic cleaning does not fix the issue, you can clean the print head and the area around the caps using the optional cleaning sticks (part number C13S090013).

Caution: Before beginning the cleaning process, note the following:

- Do not touch any circuit boards or any parts inside the printer besides those which need to be cleaned. Doing so may cause the printer to malfunction or print quality may decline.
- Always use new cleaning sticks, or dirt may be transferred into the printer.
- Do not touch the tip of the cleaning stick. This may reduce the cleaning effect.
- Touch a metal object before cleaning to discharge any static electricity.
- Do not use an organic solvent such as alcohol to wipe the caps, as it may damage the print head.
- Do not move the print head by hand. Doing so could damage the printer.
- If paper is loaded in the printer, remove it.
- 1. On the LCD screen, select the administration is a maintenance icon > Capping Station/Wiper Cleaning > Start. The print head moves to the cleaning position.
- 2. Select **How To...** and then follow the on-screen instructions.
- 3. Select **Done** to return the print head to its home position.

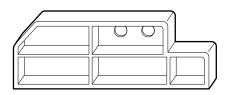
Caution: During transportation and storage, follow these guidelines:

• Avoid tilting the product, placing it vertically, or turning it upside down; otherwise ink may leak.

- Only hold the printer from the areas outlined below or you may damage the product.
- Leave the ink cartridges installed. Removing the cartridges can dry out the print head and may prevent the product from printing, or ink may leak.

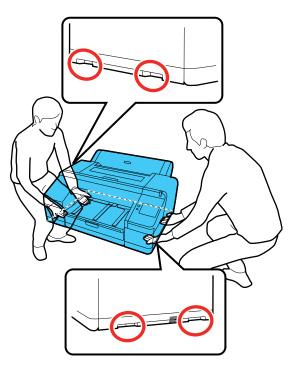
Note: Before storing your product for a long period, replace low, expended, or expired ink to help prevent the print head from drying out. Store your product in a cool, dry place.

- 1. Remove all the paper from the product.
- 2. Turn off the product.
- 3. Unplug the power cable.
- 4. Disconnect any connected cables.
- 5. Make sure to reinstall the plastic protective piece you removed during setup so that the print head is secure. See the printer's *Start Here* sheet and attach it in its original position in the reverse order of removing it.



6. Close any open covers on the printer.

7. Have two people lift the printer by placing their hands in the indentations on the left and right sides as shown.



Warning: This product is heavy and requires two people to move it.

- 8. Place the product in its original packing materials, if possible, or use equivalent materials with cushioning around the product. Make sure the box adequately protects the product control panel.
- 9. After transporting the product, remove the plastic protective piece from the print head, connect the power cable, and turn on the product.

10. Run a print head nozzle check and clean the print head, if necessary.

If the product does not turn on or turns off unexpectedly, try these solutions:

- Make sure the power cable is securely connected.
- Make sure the power outlet works by connecting the power cable for another electronic device.

- If the product turned off due to a power outage or was unplugged before being turned off, the printhead may not be correctly capped. If the printhead is left uncapped for a long time, the print quality may decline. Turn on the printer and then turn it off to make sure the printhead is capped (returns to the home position).

Product Cannot Connect to a Wireless Router or Access Point

If your product has trouble finding or connecting to a wireless router or access point, try these solutions:

- If you are connecting the product via Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) and the Wi-Fi icon on your
 product's LCD screen is not lit or does not appear, make sure you select one of the WPS options from
 the product control panel within 2 minutes of pressing the WPS button on your router.
- Make sure to place your product within contact range of your router or access point. Avoid placing your product near a microwave oven, cordless phone, or large metal object, such as a filing cabinet.
- Verify that your router or access point is operating correctly by connecting to it from your computer or another device.
- Print a network connection report and check the codes and messages on the report to help determine the cause of the problem.
- You may need to disable the firewall and any anti-virus software on your wireless router or access point.
- Try restarting your router following the instructions in your router documentation.

Note: If you are reading these instructions online, you will lose your Internet connection when you restart your router.

- Check to see if access restrictions, such as MAC address filtering, are set on the router or access
 point. If access restrictions are set, add your product's MAC address to your router's address list. To
 obtain your product's MAC address, print a network status sheet. Then follow the instructions in your
 router or access point documentation to add the address to the list.
- If your router or access point does not broadcast its network name (SSID), follow the instructions that came with your product to enter your wireless network name manually.
- If your router or access point has security enabled, determine the kind of security it is using and any
 required password or passphrase for connection. Then make sure to enter the exact WEP key or WPA
 passphrase correctly.
- Check if your computer is restricting the available wireless channels. If so, verify that your wireless access point is using one of the usable channels and change to a usable channel, if necessary.

When you connect the product to a wired network using a router or access point that supports IEEE 802.3az (Energy Efficient Ethernet), the connection may become unstable, you may be unable to connect to the product, and the communication speed may become slow. If you experience any of these issues, follow the steps below to disable IEEE 802.3az and then connect your product again.

- 1. Disconnect the Ethernet cables connected to the computer and your product.
- 2. Disable IEEE 802.3az for the computer's network adapter if it is enabled (check your operating system's Ethernet connection settings).
- 3. Connect the computer and your product directly with an Ethernet cable.
- 4. Print a network connection report from your product.
- 5. Check the printer's IP address on the network connection report.
- 6. On the computer, open a web browser and enter your product's IP address from the network connection report.
- 7. Select Network Settings > Ethernet.
- 8. Select OFF for IEEE 802.3az. and click Next.
- 9. Click **Settings** and remove the Ethernet cable connecting the computer and your product.
- 10. If you disabled IEEE 802.3az for your computer's network adapter, enable it.
- 11. Reconnect the Ethernet cables from the router or access point to your computer and product.

If problems still occur, other devices on the network may be causing them.

Cannot Print Over a Network

If you cannot print over a network, try these solutions:

- Make sure that your product is turned on.
- Make sure you install your product's network software as described in your product documentation.

- Print a network status sheet and verify that the network settings are correct. If the network status is **Disconnected**, check any cable connections and turn your product off and then on again.
- Print a network connection report and check the codes and messages on the report to help determine the cause of the problem.

- Make sure that the latest version of your product's Epson printer driver is installed. If a genuine Epson printer driver is not installed, the available functions are limited. If the printer driver is not correctly installed, uninstall and reinstall the printer driver.
- If network printing is slow, print a network status sheet and check the signal strength. If it is poor, place your product closer to your router or access point. Avoid placing your product near a microwave oven, cordless phone, or large metal object, such as a filing cabinet.
- Try restarting your router following the instructions in your router documentation.

Note: If you are reading these instructions online, you will lose your Internet connection when you restart your router.

- Connect your product directly via USB and try to print. If you are able to print, there is a problem with the network settings. Verify your network settings before reconnecting your product to the network.
- Check to see if your wireless router or access point has an enabled Privacy Separator function that is preventing printing from a device over the network. See your router or access point documentation for instructions on disabling the Privacy Separator function.
- Check your wired LAN router or access point to see if the LED for the port to which your product is connected is on or flashing. If the link LED is off, try the following:
 - Make sure the Ethernet cable is securely connected to your product and to your router, access point, switch, or hub.
 - Try connecting your product to a different port or a different router, access point, switch, or hub.
 - Try connecting with a different Ethernet cable.
 - Try printing to your product from another computer on the network.

Nothing Prints

If you have sent a print job and nothing prints, try these solutions:

- Make sure your printer is turned on.
- Make sure there are no error messages on the product's LCD screen.
- Make sure any interface cables are connected securely at both ends. If you have a spare cable, try connecting with the spare cable.
- Check the model and specifications of the interface cable to see if the cable is appropriate for your computer and printer.
- If you connected your printer to a USB hub, make sure it is a first-tier hub. If it still does not print, connect your printer directly to your computer instead of the hub.
- Make sure the USB hub is recognized correctly on the computer. Disconnect all USB hubs from the computer and connect the printer directly to the computer's USB port.
- Make sure the USB cable length does not exceed 10 feet (3 m).
- If you are printing from a computer running a Windows operating system, make sure that the printer is turned on and in ready status. Load paper A4-size or larger and then try printing a test page from the printer driver (right-click on the printer icon, then select **Properties** > General tab > **Print Test Page**). If you are able to print a test page, check the application you are trying to print from. If you are unable to print a test page, re-check the items above.

Note: The "Driver Version" shown on the test page is the version number of the Windows internal driver. This differs from the Epson printer driver version that you installed.

Paper Feeding Problems

If you have problems feeding paper, try these solutions:

- Make sure paper is loaded in the correct orientation. Load cut sheets vertically (short edge first).
- For best results, follow these guidelines:
 - Use new, smooth, high-quality paper that is not damp, curled, creased, old, too thin, or too thick.
 - · Follow any special loading instructions that came with the paper.
 - · Load paper just before printing.
- If roll paper does not feed, cut the end straight across and uncurl it by rolling it backward, if necessary. Then reload the paper.
- If wrinkles appear on roll paper, adjust the Back Tension setting.
- If you cannot insert paper easily into the paper feed slot, make sure the paper is perfectly flat and not curled.
- Do not load more than one piece of cut sheet paper.
- Make sure your paper meets the specifications for your product.

- If paper feeds at an angle, make sure **Detect Paper Skew** is set to **On** in the **Printer Settings** menu.
- If paper does not eject correctly, decrease the **Paper Suction** setting for the loaded paper type.
- Make sure that paper is not jammed inside the product.
- Make sure you are using the product at the proper room temperature.
- If you are using paper that curls easily, make sure you are in an environment with a room temperature of 73 °F (23 °C) or higher.

Image Is Not Positioned Correctly On the Media

If the printed image is not positioned correctly on your media, try these solutions:

- Make sure you loaded the media correctly and selected the correct margin and start positions for it on the product control panel.
- Check the print area in the settings of your print application and the printer.
- Make sure the correct Page Size option is selected in the print settings. If the option selected for Roll
 Width or Paper Size in the printer driver does not match the paper that is loaded in the printer, the
 print may not be in the correct position or some of the data may be printed off of the paper.
- If **Paper Size Check** is set to **Off**, the printer may print outside the bounds of the paper. Change the setting to **On**.
- Check the **Top Margin** settings in the Paper Settings on the control panel. The **Top Margin** settings on the control panel are given priority over the margin settings of your print application.

Nozzle Check Pattern Prints Incorrectly

If the nozzle check pattern does not print correctly, try these solutions:

- Clean the print head and print the check pattern again. If cleaning the print head several times does not solve the problem, run a **Power Cleaning**.
- If nozzles are still clogged after head cleaning at the strongest level, leave the product turned off overnight and check the nozzles again. If you still cannot clear the nozzles, contact Epson support.
- If the printer has not been used for a long time, nozzles may be dried and clogged. Turn the printer on at least once every few weeks and print a nozzle check pattern to prevent the nozzles from clogging.

Overall Print Quality is Poor

If you notice that your print quality is uneven, too light, too dark, or there are lines in the print (banding), try these solutions:

• Run a nozzle check to see if any of the print head nozzles are clogged. Then clean the print head, if necessary.

- If clogs are not cleared after cleaning the print head three times, run a Power Cleaning. If the situation
 does not improve after running a Power Cleaning, clean the capping station and wiper, and then clean
 the print head again. If you cleaned the print head another three times and the situation has not
 improved, turn off the product and leave it off overnight or longer. When turned off for some time, the
 clogged ink may dissolve. Turn on the printer and check the results. If the print quality still has not
 improved, contact Epson Support.
- · Align the print head.
- Adjust the paper feed.
- Make sure you are using genuine Epson ink cartridges. If you use non-Epson ink cartridges, printouts
 may be faint, or the color of the printed image may be uneven because the remaining ink level is not
 correctly detected.
- Make sure your ink cartridges have not expired. For best results, use ink cartridges before the expiration date printed on the package (within six months of installation in the printer). Replace expired cartridges with new ones.
- Shake the cartridges before installing them in the printer.
- Make sure you selected the correct **Media Type** setting in the printer driver that matches the paper loaded in the printer.
- Compare the print result with the image on your computer screen. Since monitors and printers produce colors differently, printed colors and screen colors do not always look the same.
- Make sure that the printer cover is closed during printing.
- Check the ink levels on the LCD screen. Replace any cartridges that are low on ink. If there is a difference in color after replacing the ink cartridge, try cleaning the print head a few times.
- Enable color management in the software application or in the printer driver.
- If you are using non-Epson media, make sure you create a custom paper configuration for the media.
- If you have registered settings for non-Epson media, perform uni-directional printing. Follow the steps below to clear the checkbox for **High Speed** in the printer driver.
 - Windows: On the Main tab, select Quality from Level.
 - Mac: Select **Print Settings** from the list, and then select the **Advanced Color Settings** tab.
- Check the quality setting that you selected in the printer driver. Using a faster printing method may decrease the overall print quality. Select **Level** options that prioritize quality over speed.

With bidirectional printing, the print head prints while moving left and right. If the print head is misaligned, ruled lines may be misaligned as a result. If you see vertical lines in the (bidirectional) print output, align the print head.

Prints are Scuffed or Smeared

If your prints are scuffed or smeared, try these solutions:

- Make sure your paper meets the specifications for your product.
- Do not use paper with folds or creases and always use new media.
- If you are using cut sheet paper, check that changes in humidity and temperature have not made the paper wavy or curled up on the edges. Load the paper just before printing and do not use wavy or curled paper. For roll paper, cut off any wavy or curled parts and then load the roll again. For cut sheets, use new paper.
- If the surface of the paper is scuffed, select a wider Platen Gap setting. If results do not improve, set Paper Setting or Custom Paper Setting > Paper Eject Roller to Use (Heavy Load) or Use (Light Load).

Caution: The Paper Eject Roller setting may damage glossy paper.

If your prints are still scuffed, try selecting a wider **Platen Gap Offset** setting.

Note: The Platen Gap Offset setting cannot be set wider or narrower than the value set for Platen Gap.

If ink is smeared on your prints, clean the rollers and the paper cassette printing path. For roll paper, load blank A2 or 17-inch wide paper and select → Forward to feed it through the printer. Paper is fed as long as the icon is pressed. Once the paper comes out clean, cleaning is complete. Then select → to cut the paper. For the paper cassette printing path, load several sheets of A2 (16.5 × 23.4 inches [420 × 594 mm]) or 17-inch wide paper in the paper cassette. On the Home screen, select the maintenance icon > Paper Guide Cleaning and then select Start. Select Run Again as needed

maintenance icon > Paper Guide Cleaning and then select Start. Select Run Again, as needed, until the sheets come out clean, and then select Done.

- If you are using non-Epson media, make sure you create a custom paper configuration for the media.
- Lower the **Color Density** setting in the Paper Configuration dialog in the printer driver.
- Make sure the **Paper Size Check** setting is set to **On**, or the printer may print outside the edges of the loaded paper and smear ink on the back of the print.
- Depending on the print density and type of paper you are using, the ink may take a while to dry. Do not stack the prints until the ink is completely dry.
- Make sure that the printer driver's **Media Type** settings match the paper that you are using.
- If the bottom edge is scuffed, try widening the bottom margin.
- If the trailing edge is scuffed while printing, create your data with a wider margin.
- If the printhead is scuffing the edge of the paper, set a larger **Top Margin** in the paper settings.
- If the left or right edges of the paper are scuffed while printing, create your data with a wider left or right margin. If the situation does not improve, rotate the data 90 degrees in the printer driver or your software before you print.
- If you are printing multiple pages and **Auto Cut** is set to **Never Cut**, the area between pages may be scuffed. Widen the margin between pages.
- Try cleaning inside of the printer and the roll paper feeder.

Prints are Wrinkled

If you see wrinkles on your prints, try the following to solve the problem:

- Dry the paper after printing.
- Roll out the paper and stretch it.
- Lower the ink density in the **Paper Configuration** dialog in the printer driver.
- Lower the resolution in the Level setting in the printer driver.
- Make sure you are operating the printer at normal room temperature. The normal operating range for Epson special media is 59 to 77 °F (15 to 25°C), 40 to 60% humidity. For information about other paper types, see the documentation supplied with the paper.
- Make sure you selected the correct **Media Type** setting in the printer driver that matches the paper loaded in the printer.
- If you are using non-Epson media, make sure you create a custom paper configuration for the media.

Margins Appear in Borderless Prints

If borderless prints still have margins, try these solutions:

- Check the print settings selected in your print application you are using, as well as the printer driver.
- Make sure that the paper settings on the LCD screen match the paper you loaded.
- Make sure borderless enlargement is not set to Min in the printer driver.
- Paper that is stored incorrectly may expand or contract. Make sure you have stored the paper according to the manufacturer's specifications.
- Check that the paper you are using supports borderless printing.
- If you are using roll paper, change the **Adjust Cut Position** setting. This may reduce the margins at the top and bottom of the print.

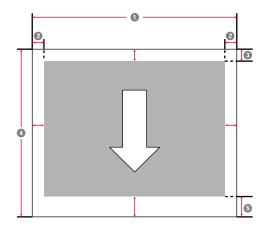

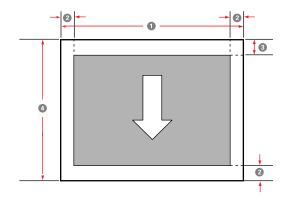

You and Epson also agree, notwithstanding Section 1.6, that a court, not an arbitrator, may decide if a claim or cause of action is for an IP Claim.

1.2 **Binding Arbitration**. You and Epson agree that all Disputes shall be resolved by binding arbitration according to this Agreement. **ARBITRATION MEANS THAT YOU WAIVE YOUR RIGHT TO A JUDGE OR JURY IN A COURT PROCEEDING AND YOUR GROUNDS FOR APPEAL ARE LIMITED**. Pursuant to this Agreement, binding arbitration shall be administered by JAMS, a nationally recognized arbitration authority, pursuant to its code of procedures then in effect for consumer related disputes, but excluding any rules that permit joinder or class actions in arbitration (for more detail on procedure, see Section 1.6 below). You and Epson understand and agree that (a) the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. §1, et seq.) governs the interpretation and enforcement of this Section 1, (b) this Agreement memorializes a transaction in interstate commerce, and (c) this Section 1 shall survive termination of this Agreement.

1.3 **Pre-Arbitration Steps and Notice**. Before submitting a claim for arbitration, you and Epson agree to try, for sixty (60) days, to resolve any Dispute informally. If Epson and you do not reach an agreement to resolve the Dispute within the sixty (60) days), you or Epson may commence an arbitration. Notice to Epson must be addressed to: Epson America, Inc., ATTN: Legal Department, 3131 Katella Ave., Los Alamitos, CA 90720 (the "Epson Address"). The Dispute Notice to you will be sent to the most recent address Epson has in its records for you. For this reason, it is important to notify us if your address changes by emailing us at EAILegal@ea.epson.com or writing us at the Epson Address above. Notice of the Dispute shall include the sender's name, address and contact information, the facts giving rise to the

Dispute, and the relief requested (the "Dispute Notice"). Following receipt of the Dispute Notice, Epson and you agree to act in good faith to resolve the Dispute before commencing arbitration.

1.4 **Small Claims Court**. Notwithstanding the foregoing, you may bring an individual action in the small claims court of your state or municipality if the action is within that court's jurisdiction and is pending only in that court.

1.5 WAIVER OF CLASS ACTIONS AND CLASS ARBITRATIONS. YOU AND EPSON AGREE THAT EACH PARTY MAY BRING DISPUTES AGAINST THE OTHER PARTY ONLY IN AN INDIVIDUAL CAPACITY, AND NOT AS A PLAINTIFF OR CLASS MEMBER IN ANY CLASS OR REPRESENTATIVE PROCEEDING, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION FEDERAL OR STATE CLASS ACTIONS, OR CLASS ARBITRATIONS. CLASS ACTION LAWSUITS, CLASS-WIDE ARBITRATIONS, PRIVATE ATTORNEY-GENERAL ACTIONS, AND ANY OTHER PROCEEDING WHERE SOMEONE ACTS IN A REPRESENTATIVE CAPACITY ARE NOT ALLOWED. ACCORDINGLY, UNDER THE ARBITRATION PROCEDURES OUTLINED IN THIS SECTION, AN ARBITRATOR SHALL NOT COMBINE OR CONSOLIDATE MORE THAN ONE PARTY'S CLAIMS WITHOUT THE WRITTEN CONSENT OF ALL AFFECTED PARTIES TO AN ARBITRATION PROCEEDING.

1.6 Arbitration Procedure. If you or Epson commences arbitration, the arbitration shall be governed by the rules of JAMS that are in effect when the arbitration is filed, excluding any rules that permit arbitration on a class or representative basis (the "JAMS Rules"), available at http://www.jamsadr.com or by calling 1-800-352-5267, and under the rules set forth in this Agreement. All Disputes shall be resolved by a single neutral arbitrator, and both parties shall have a reasonable opportunity to participate in the selection of the arbitrator. The arbitrator is bound by the terms of this Agreement. The arbitrator, and not any federal, state or local court or agency, shall have exclusive authority to resolve all disputes arising out of or relating to the interpretation, applicability, enforceability or formation of this Agreement, including any claim that all or any part of this Agreement is void or voidable. Notwithstanding this broad delegation of authority to the arbitrator, a court may determine the limited question of whether a claim or cause of action is for an IP Claim, which is excluded from the definition of "Disputes" in Section 1.1 above. The arbitrator shall be empowered to grant whatever relief would be available in a court under law or in equity. The arbitrator may award you the same damages as a court could, and may award declaratory or injunctive relief only in favor of the individual party seeking relief and only to the extent necessary to provide relief warranted by that party's individual claim. In some instances, the costs of arbitration can exceed the costs of litigation and the right to discovery may be more limited in arbitration than in court. The arbitrator's award is binding and may be entered as a judgment in any court of competent jurisdiction.

You may choose to engage in arbitration hearings by telephone. Arbitration hearings not conducted by telephone shall take place in a location reasonably accessible from your primary residence, or in Orange County, California, at your option.

a) Initiation of Arbitration Proceeding. If either you or Epson decides to arbitrate a Dispute, both parties agree to the following procedure:

(i) Write a Demand for Arbitration. The demand must include a description of the Dispute and the amount of damages sought to be recovered. You can find a copy of a Demand for Arbitration at http://www.jamsadr.com ("Demand for Arbitration").

(ii) Send three copies of the Demand for Arbitration, plus the appropriate filing fee, to: JAMS, 500 North State College Blvd., Suite 600 Orange, CA 92868, U.S.A.

(iii) Send one copy of the Demand for Arbitration to the other party (same address as the Dispute Notice), or as otherwise agreed by the parties.

b) Hearing Format. During the arbitration, the amount of any settlement offer made shall not be disclosed to the arbitrator until after the arbitrator determines the amount, if any, to which you or Epson is entitled. The discovery or exchange of non-privileged information relevant to the Dispute may be allowed during the arbitration.

c) Arbitration Fees. Epson shall pay, or (if applicable) reimburse you for, all JAMS filings and arbitrator fees for any arbitration commenced (by you or Epson) pursuant to provisions of this Agreement.

d) Award in Your Favor. For Disputes in which you or Epson seeks \$75,000 or less in damages exclusive of attorney's fees and costs, if the arbitrator's decision results in an award to you in an amount greater than Epson's last written offer, if any, to settle the Dispute, Epson will: (i) pay you \$1,000 or the amount of the award, whichever is greater; (ii) pay you twice the amount of your reasonable attorney's fees, if any; and (iii) reimburse you for any expenses (including expert witness fees and costs) that your attorney reasonably accrues for investigating, preparing, and pursuing the Dispute in arbitration. Except as agreed upon by you and Epson in writing, the arbitrator shall determine the amount of fees, costs, and expenses to be paid by Epson pursuant to this Section 1.6d).

e) Attorney's Fees. Epson will not seek its attorney's fees and expenses for any arbitration commenced involving a Dispute under this Agreement. Your right to attorney's fees and expenses under Section 1.6d) above does not limit your rights to attorney's fees and expenses under applicable law; notwithstanding the foregoing, the arbitrator may not award duplicative awards of attorney's fees and expenses.

1.7 Opt-out. You may elect to opt-out (exclude yourself) from the final, binding, individual arbitration procedure and waiver of class and representative proceedings specified in this Agreement by sending a written letter to the Epson Address within thirty (30) days of your assent to this Agreement (including without limitation the purchase, download, installation of the Software or other applicable use of Epson Hardware, products and services) that specifies (i) your name, (ii) your mailing address, and (iii) your request to be excluded from the final, binding individual arbitration procedure and waiver of class and representative proceedings specified in this Section 1. In the event that you opt-out consistent with the procedure set forth above, all other terms shall continue to apply, including the requirement to provide notice prior to litigation.

1.8 **Amendments to Section 1**. Notwithstanding any provision in this Agreement to the contrary, you and Epson agree that if Epson makes any future amendments to the dispute resolution procedure and

class action waiver provisions (other than a change to Epson's address) in this Agreement, Epson will obtain your affirmative assent to the applicable amendment. If you do not affirmatively assent to the applicable amendment, you are agreeing that you will arbitrate any Dispute between the parties in accordance with the language of this Section 1 (or resolve disputes as provided for in Section 1.7, if you timely elected to opt-out when you first assented to this Agreement).

1.9 Severability. If any provision in this Section 1 is found to be unenforceable, that provision shall be severed with the remainder of this Agreement remaining in full force and effect. The foregoing shall not apply to the prohibition against class or representative actions as provided in Section 1.5. This means that if Section 1.5 is found to be unenforceable, the entire Section 1 (but only Section 1) shall be null and void.
