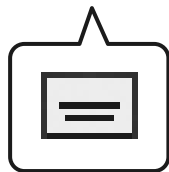

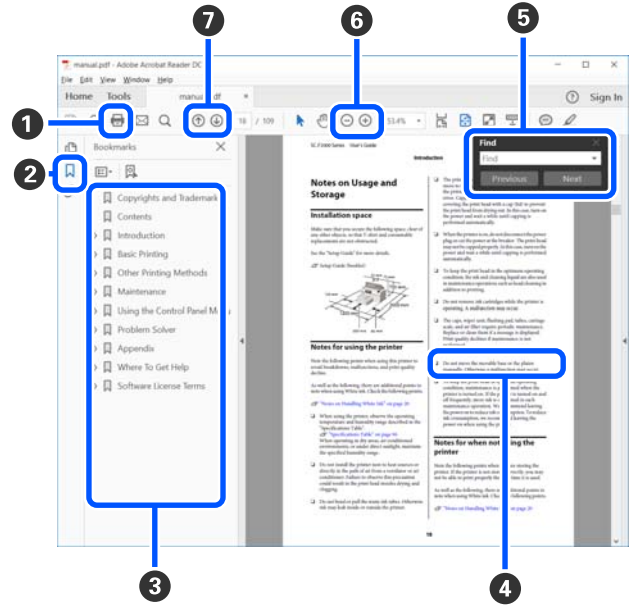

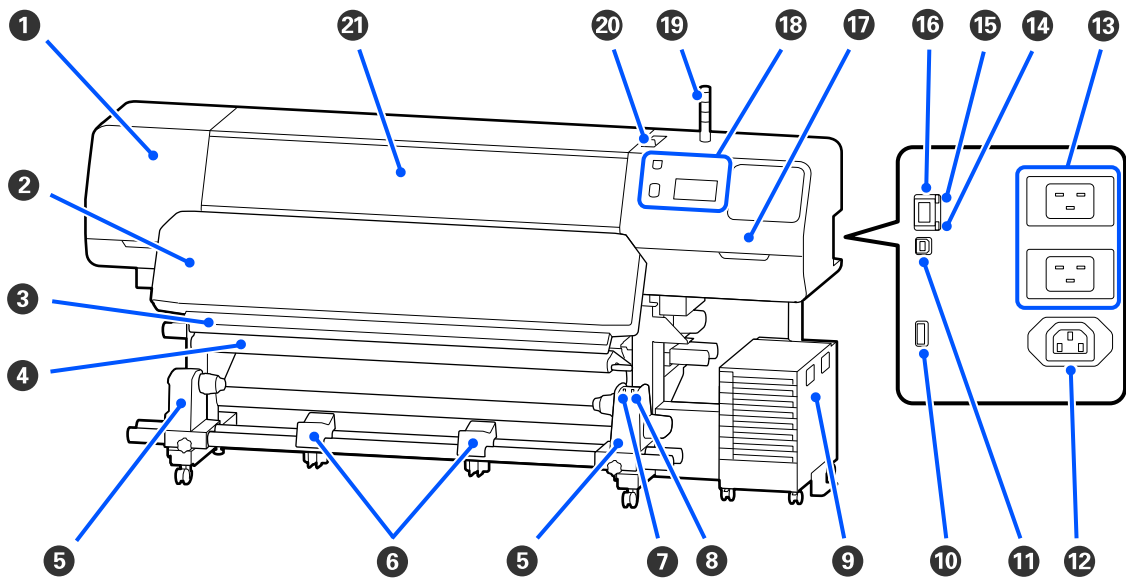

## Printer Parts

### Front Section

The illustration shows the SC-R5000 Series.



#### 1 Maintenance cover (left)

Open this cover to clean the area around the print head. Normally closed when using the printer.

#### 2 Curing heater

Cures and fixes the ink in the printouts. If you touch print outs containing ink that has not been cured, your hands will be soiled with ink.

#### 3 Cutter groove

Pass the blade of a cutter (available in the market) down this groove to cut media.

#### 4 Tension bar

The tensioner maintains tension to prevent the media sagging as it is taken up.

### 5 Media holder

Place the roll core for media take-up on these holders. There are same parts on both the left and the right.

### 6 Media support

Rest media temporarily on these supports when removing the take-up roll. There are same parts on both the left and the right.

### 7 Auto switch

Use this switch to select the auto take-up direction. If Off is selected, the paper is not taken up.

### 8 Manual switch


Use this switch to take-up manually. You can use this when the Auto switch is in the Off position.

### 9 Ink unit

### 10 Optional port

Connect the connection cable supplied with the ink unit.

### 11 USB port

Connect to your computer with a USB cable.

### 12 AC outlet #3

Connect the power cable supplied with the ink unit.

### 13 AC inlet #1/AC inlet #2

Connect the power cable supplied with the printer. Be sure to connect both cables.

### 14 Data lamp

The data lamp lights or flashes to indicate the network connection status and whether the printer is receiving data.

On : Connected.

Flashing : Connected and receiving data.

## Introduction

### 15 Status lamp

The color indicates the network's communication speed.

Red : 100Base-TX

Green : 1000Base-T

### 16 LAN port

Connects the LAN cable. Use a shielded twisted pair cable (category 5 or higher).

### 17 Maintenance cover (right)

Open this when replacing the wiper unit or when cleaning around the caps. Normally closed when using the printer.

### 18 Control panel

### 19 Signal lamp

The status of the printer is indicated by whether or not the three color lamps are lit or flashing. When all of the lamps are off, the printer is off.

The following explains the basic meanings for the color of the lamps.



Red : Cannot print as an error has occurred.

Yellow : The printer is being operated while a warning message is displayed, maintenance is being performed, or the printer is paused.

Green : Ready to print or currently printing.

The combination of lamp colors and whether they are lit or flashing provides detailed information about the status of the printer.

### 20 Media loading lever

Once media has been loaded, move the media loading lever to the front to press down on the media. Move the media loading lever to the back to release the media prior to removal.

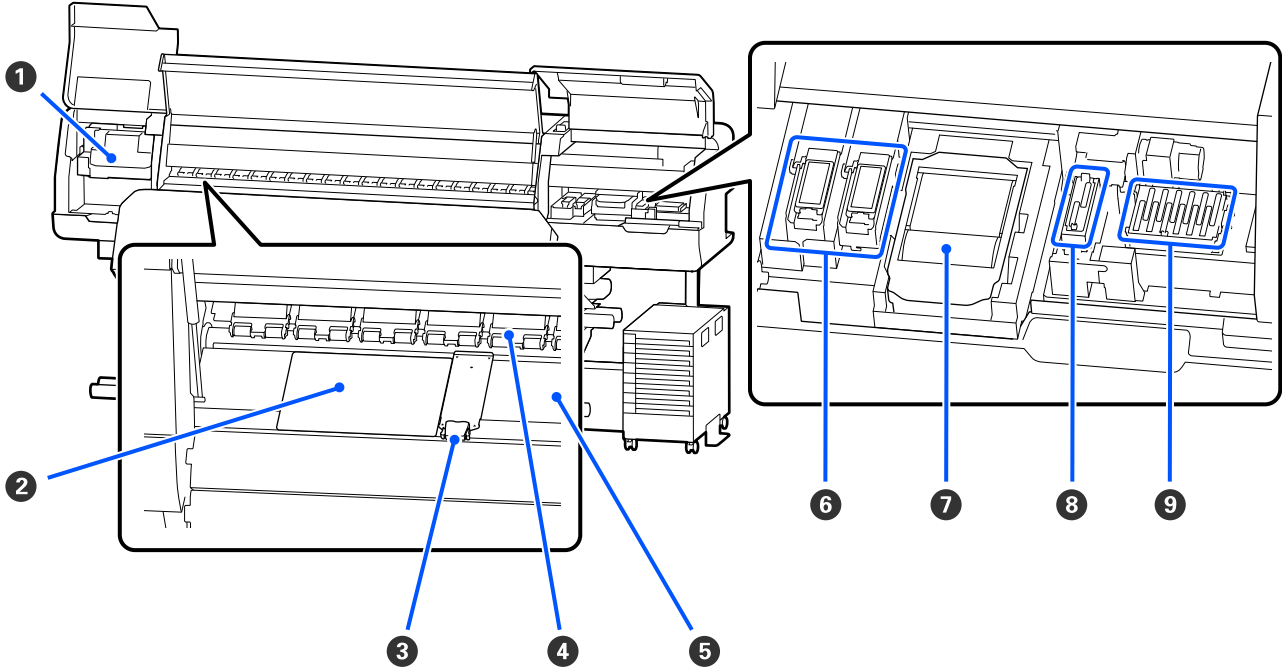
### 21 Printer cover

Open when loading media, cleaning the inside of the printer, or removing jammed media. Normally closed when using the printer.

## Introduction

### Inside

Dirt on any of the following parts may reduce print quality. Regularly clean or exchange these parts as described in the chapters listed in the reference sections below.



#### 1 Print head

The print head prints by moving left and right while emitting ink. Follow the messages on the control panel to perform cleaning.

#### 2 Thermal sheet

Prevents uneven heat distribution in the platen heater thereby preventing poor quality prints. Make sure you use a thermal sheet if the width of the loaded media is 54 inches or less.

#### 3 Media edge plates

The media edge plates prevent the media riding up and keeps fibers on the cut edge of the media from touching the print head. Position the plates at either side of the media before printing.

#### 4 Pressure rollers

These rollers press down on the media during printing. These moves up and down in conjunction with the media loading lever.

## Introduction

### 5 Platen heater

The platen heater ensures that the ink adheres evenly. If lint, dust, or ink adheres to this, it could cause clogged nozzles or ink drops to occur, so be sure to clean it daily.

### 6 Flushing pad

Color ink and Optimizer (OP) are discharged onto this pad during flushing. The right side is for OP, and the left side is for ink. Check this during regular cleaning and clean it if it is dirty.

### 7 Wiper Unit

Used to wipe off ink that is stuck to the surface of the print head nozzles. The wiper unit is a consumable item. Replace when a message is displayed on the control panel prompting you to do so.

### 8 Suction Cap

Use this cap to suck the ink out of the print head. Follow the messages on the control panel to perform cleaning.

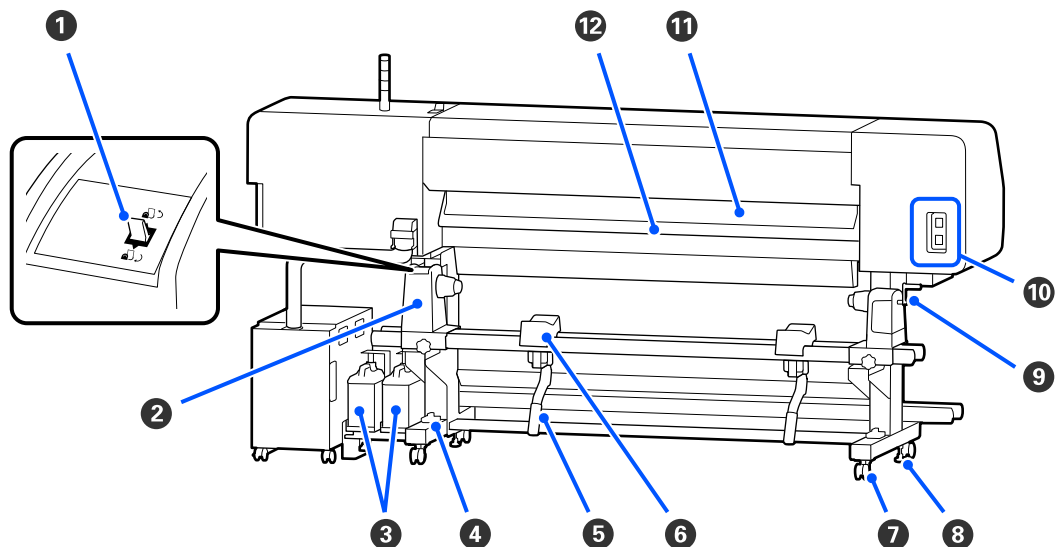
### 9 Anti-drying caps

Except during printing, these caps cover the print head nozzles to prevent them drying out. Clean when a message is displayed on the control panel prompting you to do so.

## Back



## Introduction

### 1 Drive switch

Rewinds media during media replacement.

### 2 Media holder

Place media on these holders. There are same parts on both the left and the right.

### 3 Waste Ink Bottle


Waste ink collects in this bottle. There are two waste ink bottles; for color ink on the left and Optimizer (OP) on the right.

Replace it with a new waste ink bottle when a message is displayed on the control panel prompting you to do so.

### 4 Level gauge

When installing on a carpeted floor or a sloping floor, check the horizontal level of the printer. There are same parts on both the left and the right.

### 5 Lift lever

If the media to be mounted on the media holder seems heavy, use these levers to raise the media to the level of the media holder. There are same parts on both the left and the right.

### 6 Media support

Rest media on these supports before placing it on the media holder. There are same parts on both the left and the right.

### 7 Casters

There are two casters on each leg. Once installation is complete, the casters should be kept locked while the printer is in use.

### 8 Adjusters

There are two adjusters on each leg. When installing on a carpeted floor or a sloping floor, check level gauge of the printer and adjust these to keep the printer stable. If you perform horizontal adjustment during installation, make sure you raise the levelers above the casters before moving the printer.

### 9 Handle

After placing media on the right media holder, rotate the handle to press the media holder and apply pressure to the roll core.

### 10 AC outlet #4/AC outlet #5

Connect the power cable supplied with the curing heater. Be sure to connect both cables.

### 11 Media cleaner

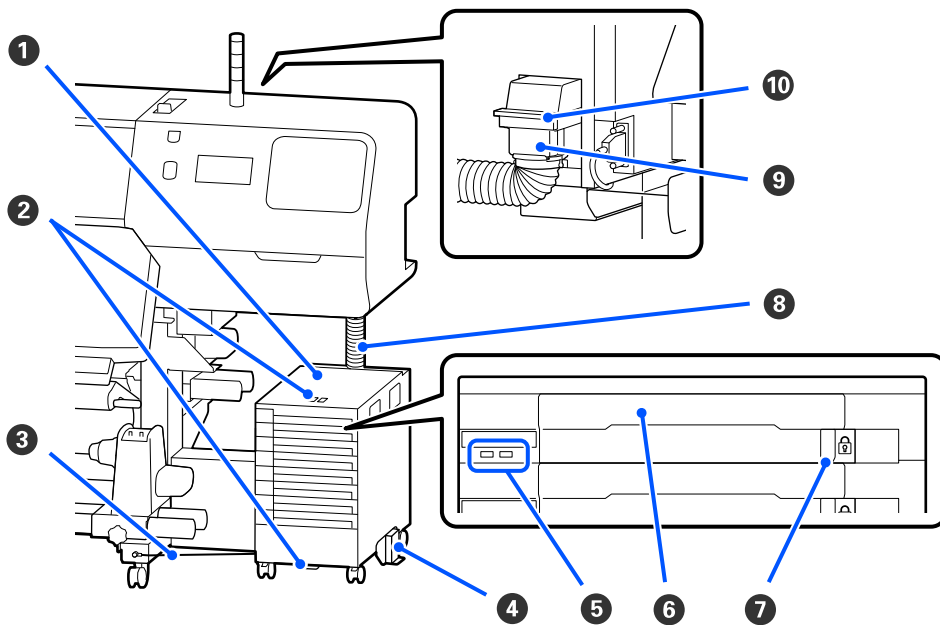
Removes lint and dust from the surface of the media.

### 12 Pre-heater

Heats the media before printing so that the print area is not subject to sudden changes in temperature.

## Ink Unit

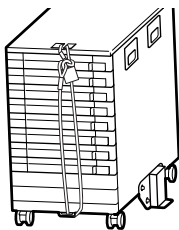


### 1 Ink unit

The ink unit supplies ink to the printer. Insert ink supply units into all the ink supply unit trays.

### 2 Security cable bracket

Pass a commercially available security cable through the upper and lower mounting parts to prevent the ink supply unit from being stolen.



## Introduction

### 3 Ink unit wire

When in use, be sure to use screws to fasten the ink unit wire to the front and back of the printer's legs. The ink tube may break if you move the ink unit while it is connected to the printer without being fastened with the ink unit wire.

### 4 Overturn-prevention plate


Make sure the ink unit is used with an overturn-prevention plate attached to both sides to prevent the ink unit from overturning.

### 5 LED light

The LED lamp indicates, by lighting or flashing, the ink supply units inserted into their ink supply unit trays and the ink unit, as shown below.

Lit blue : Ink is being supplied to the printer. Do not pull out the ink supply unit tray.

Flashing blue : It is time to shake the ink supply unit. Pull out the ink supply unit tray and shake it.

Lit or flashing orange: An error or warning has occurred. The type of error or warning is indicated by how the lamp lights or flashes. You can check the details of the error or warning on the control panel's screen.

Off : No error. You can pull out the ink supply unit tray if necessary.

### 6 Ink supply unit tray

Insert the ink supply unit for the color indicated on the label. Place all of the ink supply unit trays in the ink unit.

### 7 Lock switch

To pull out an ink supply unit tray, unlock it by moving the lock switch to the right. After placing the ink supply unit tray in the ink unit, lock it by moving the lock switch to the left.

### 8 Ink tube

This tube supplies ink from the ink supply unit to the printer.

### 9 Ink tube connector

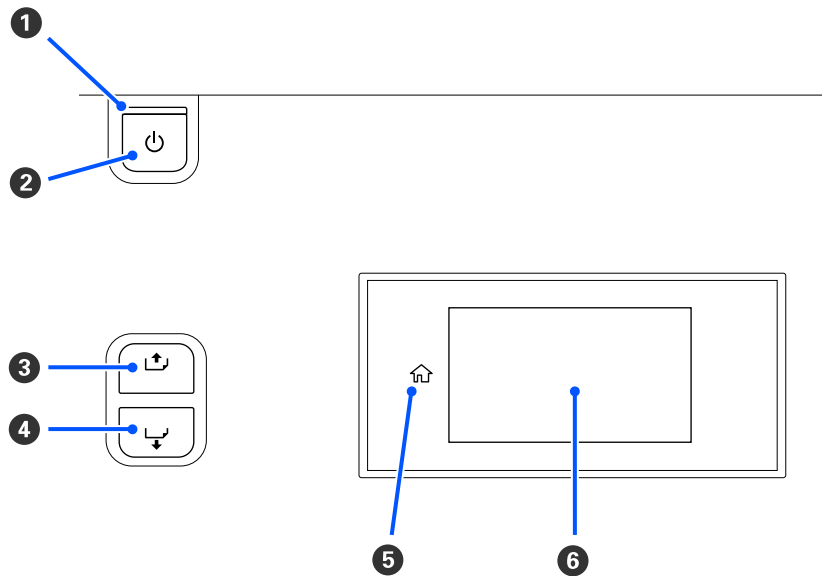
This connector connects the ink tube and the printer. This is used with the ink tube and printer connected normally, except for when transporting the printer.

### 10 Connector lock levers

Locks the ink tube connector. Do not use this after it is locked during setup.

# Control panel




**1  light (power light)**

The printer's operational status is indicated by a lit or flashing light.


On  : The power is on.

Flashing : The printer is operating such as receiving data, shutting down, or performing Print Head Cleaning.

Off  : The power is off.

**2  button (power button)**

Turns the power on and off.

**3 [  ] button (rewind button)**

Depending on the status of the media loading lever, operations differ as shown below.

- When the media loading lever is moved to the front  
You can rewind the media by holding down the button. Rewinding stops when the leading edge of the media reaches the print start position. Rewind can be resumed by releasing the button and then pressing it again. Press and hold the button to speed up the rewinding. This is useful when fine-tuning media alignment as you can rewind the media in increments of 0.4 mm by pressing the button briefly.
- When the media loading lever is moved to the back  
You can rewind media that has been loaded with the printable side out by holding down the button.

**4 [  ] button (feed button)**





## Introduction

Depending on the status of the media loading lever, operations differ as shown below.


- ❑ When the media loading lever is moved to the front  
You can feed the media by holding down the button. Press and hold the button to speed up the feeding. This is useful when fine-tuning media alignment as you can feed the media in increments of 0.4 mm by pressing the button briefly.
- ❑ When the media loading lever is moved to the back  
You can rewind media that has been loaded with the printable side in by holding down the button.

### 5 (Home)

Press to return to the home screen during menu operations and so on (when  is lit).

 (Home) is not lit when it cannot be used

# Understanding and Operating the Display

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## Understanding the Display


This section explains how to view the following two screens.

### Home screen

You can check the current status of the printer.

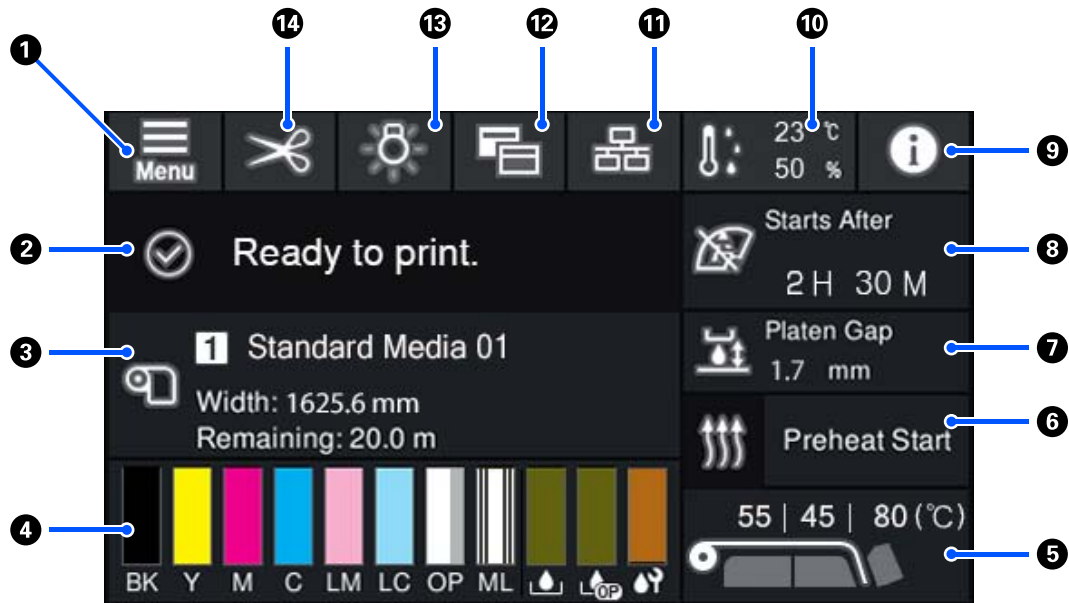
### Startup adjustment screen

You can quickly change the major adjustment values. This is useful when you need to make frequent adjustments to stabilize the print quality, such as when you start using new media.

You can switch between the home screen and the startup adjustment screen each time you press .

## Introduction

### Home screen



#### 1 (Menu)

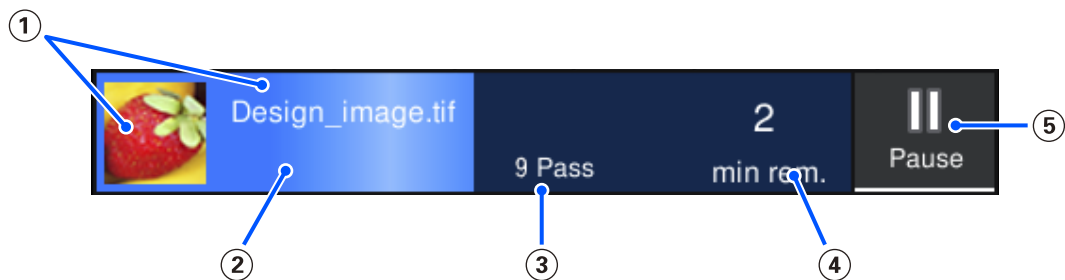
The settings menu will be displayed.

#### 2 **Status display area**

Displays the printer's status and warning messages. Only the most recent notifications are shown in this area. You can check all warning notifications by pressing .

When a print job is received, the displayed content changes as shown below. The following provides an explanation of each display.



① Displays a preview of the image being printed and the file name.

② Displays a progress bar showing the printing progress.

③ Displays the number of print passes.

④ Displays the estimated time until printing is complete. This includes the heating time necessary for the heater to reach the set temperature, the curing time after printing, and, depending on the settings, the warm-up time for the print head.

## Introduction

- ⑤ This is the Pause (Suspend) button.

Press this button and select whether to stop printing immediately (**Immediate pause**) or stop after printing the current page (or job if it is a single page) (**Pause between pages**). Pressing **Resume** on the screen during a pause resumes printing. However, if you select **Immediate pause**, printing may become disrupted when printing restarts.

Appears as the **Cancel** button while warming up, until the heater reaches the set temperature. Press this button to cancel the job. This button appears as **Start** while warming up when printing an adjustment pattern, and you can press this to start printing even if the temperature of the heater is low.

### ③ Media info

Displays the name and number of the currently selected registered media, as well as the width of the currently loaded media. When **Remaining Amount Management** is set to **On**, the remaining amount of the loaded media is also displayed. Pressing this area displays the **Media Settings** from the settings menu where you can change to a different registered media number or change the settings for the media number that is currently selected.

### ④ Status of consumables

Displays the approximate amount remaining and the status of consumables such as the ink supply unit. Pressing this area allows you to check details for the amount remaining and the part number of each consumable.

If you are using the SC-R5000L Series, pressing this area allows you to perform the following checks and settings.

- Check which ink supply unit is currently operating or supplying ink
- Check the status of non-operational ink supply units
- Manually switch the operational ink supply unit

The following provides an explanation of each display.



#### Ink supply unit status

Indicates the approximate amount of ink remaining. The bar goes lower as the remaining ink runs low. The letters under the bar are abbreviations of the colors. The relation of the abbreviations and the ink colors is shown below.

BK : Black

Y : Yellow

M : Magenta

C : Cyan

LM : Light Magenta

LC : Light Cyan

OP : Optimizer

ML : Maintenance Liquid

Depending on the status of the ink supply unit, the display of the bar changes as shown below.

## Introduction



: Ink is low. You need to prepare a new ink supply unit.

If you are using the SC-R5000L Series, the ink supply automatically switches to another ink supply unit of the same color, so make sure that the ink supply unit that is being switched to has enough ink.



: Ink is expended. Replace the old ink supply unit with a new one.

If you are using the SC-R5000L Series, when ink is expended, the ink supply automatically switches to another ink supply unit of the same color.



: It is time to shake the ink supply unit. Remove the ink supply unit tray for any ink unit whose LED light is flashing blue, and then shake the tray. Do not pull out the ink supply unit tray if the light is lit blue.



: Only displayed when using the SC-R5000L Series.

An ink supply unit tray without an ink supply unit attached has been installed in the ink unit. Attach the ink supply unit as soon as possible, otherwise the ink unit could malfunction.



: Only displayed when using the SC-R5000L Series.

Make sure all of the ink unit lock switches are locked, and then follow the instructions displayed on the screen.



: The cleaning ink supply unit is installed.



### Waste Ink Bottle status

Indicates the approximate amount of space available in the waste ink bottle. The bar goes lower as the amount of remaining space decreases. The letters under the bar are identification abbreviations of the waste ink bottles. The meanings of the abbreviations are shown below.



: Waste ink bottle for color ink



: Waste ink bottle for Optimizer (OP)

Depending on the status of the waste ink bottle, the display of the bar changes as shown below.



: The waste ink bottle is almost full. Ready a new Waste Ink Bottle.



### Wiper unit status

Indicates the approximate amount of wiper unit remaining. The bar goes lower as the remaining ink runs low.





: The wiper unit is running low, so you need to prepare a new wiper unit.

## Introduction

### 5 Heater temperature

Displays the temperature set for each heater. The temperatures are displayed in the following order from the left: pre-heater, platen heater, curing heater. The icon under the number changes as shown below depending on the temperature of each heater.

 : Heating.

 : Cooling.

### 6 Preheat Start/Stop

Each heater starts heating when a job is sent, and printing starts when all heaters reach a set temperature.

Press **Preheat Start** to start pre-heating each heater, and then the pre-heater and platen heater maintain a constant set temperature. The curing heater maintains a standby temperature.

Pre-heating allows you to start printing quickly once a job has been sent.

You can start/stop pre-heating for all heaters each time you press this area. Additionally, all heaters turn off after the time set in **Heater Off Timer** in the settings menu has elapsed. Heating starts when a print job is sent, but you can still press **Preheat Start** if necessary.

Also, if **Heater** from **Temperature** is set to **Off** in the settings menu, pressing **Preheat Start** does nothing and pre-heating does not start. Heaters that are set to **Off** do not heat up even if a job is sent. You can make **Heater** settings for each heater.

### 7 Platen Gap

Displays the Platen Gap settings for the current media information (3). Press this area to display the settings screen where you can change the values.

### 8 Notice on when to perform maintenance or Periodic Cleaning

Displays the remaining print time until maintenance or Periodic Cleaning is performed.



The printer estimates how long it will take to print the job, and if the print time is longer than the displayed time, Print Head Cleaning is automatically performed before printing starts.

You can press this area to perform Print Head Cleaning if necessary.

Depending on the temperature around the print head and the status of ink ejection during printing, this may be performed sooner to protect the print head.

Also, maintenance cleaning may be performed regardless of the notification when the printer is turned back on.

### 9 (Printer Status)

If a warning notification has been generated,  is displayed on the right just like . Press **Message List** on the screen displayed when you press this area to display a list of warning notifications. You can check detailed information and the handling procedure for each item by pressing it in the list. Items are removed from the list as those actions are taken.


## Introduction


### 10 (environmental temperature and humidity)

Displays the current temperature and humidity. Press this area to view a range of the printer's operating temperature and humidity. You may not be able to print correctly unless you use the printer under the appropriate environmental conditions.

### 11 (Switch connection status)

The following icons indicate the connection status between the computer and the printer.

Connection :   
on

Connection :   
off

The connection turns on or off every time this area is pressed.

For example, you can finish work more efficiently by turning the connection off to prevent jobs from being received before performing maintenance such as printing a nozzle check pattern or executing Print Head Cleaning after cleaning around the print head.

Note that you may not be able to switch depending on the operating status of the printer. In this situation, the icon is grayed out indicating that the function is disabled.

### 12 (Switch screens)

Switch between the home screen and the startup adjustment screen every time this area is pressed.

### 13 (Inside light)

Switches the internal lamp on or off. Press this area to turn off the inside light, when it is on. Pressing it while the inside light is off, turns it on.

You may not be able to turn this on/off depending on the operating status of the printer. In this situation, the icon is grayed out indicating that the function is disabled.

### 14 (feed media to cutting position)

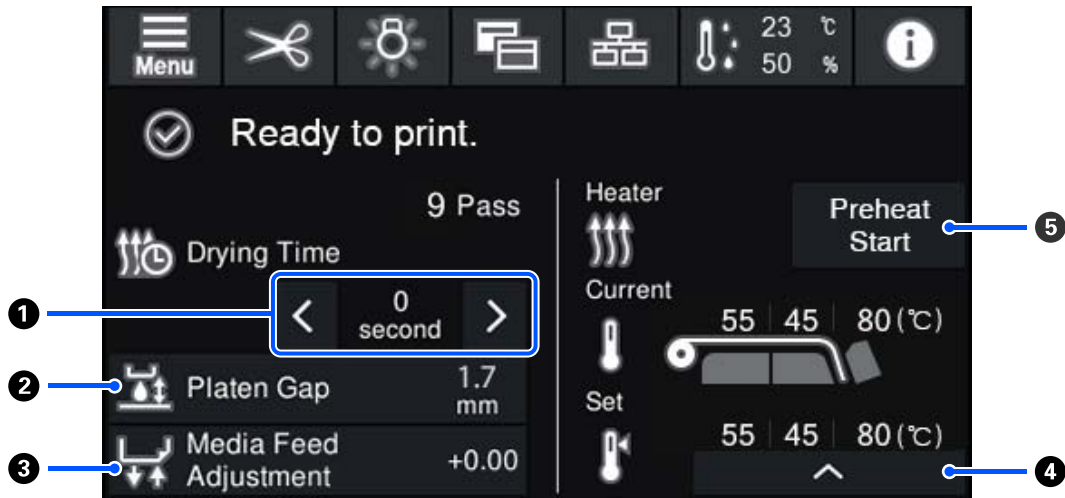
Depending on the settings for the currently selected registered media, the end of the print may be on the platen after printing is complete.

If you want to send the end of the print to the cutting position, you can press this area to feed the media to the cutting position. Furthermore, if you perform an operation to feed the end of the print to the cutting position while it is in the cutting position, the print start position on the platen is fed to the cutting position.

## Introduction

### Startup adjustment screen

The following section only describes parts that differ from the home screen. You can change the value for each adjustment item even while printing. Results of the adjustments are registered to the currently selected media settings.



#### 1 Adjusting the Drying Time

When **Drying Action** is set to **Follow Drying Time Setting**, the **Drying Time** setting for the selected Pass Mode for the currently selected registered media number is displayed. Press the following to change the value.

◀ : To reduce the display time

▶ : To increase the display time

#### 2 Adjusting the Platen Gap

Displays the Platen Gap setting for the current media settings. Press this area to change the setting.

#### 3 Correcting the media feed

To correct banding that occurs during printing, press this area to perform media feed corrections.

If the feed amount is too small, black bands (dark stripes) appear; correct the feed amount upwards (+).

In contrast, if the feed amount is too large, white bands (pale stripes) appear; correct the feed amount downwards (-). The value indicates the amount of feed that has been corrected as a percentage or as a positive (+) or negative (-) value.

#### 4 Adjusting the heater temperature

Press ▲ to change the set temperature for the pre-heater, platen heater, or curing heater. Depending on the media loaded and the current number of print passes, if the temperature for curing heater is too low, the ink will not be cured correctly and the back of the media will be stained with ink when winding. On the other hand, if the temperature is too high, it will cause the media to shrink and warp. If the temperature of the platen heater is raised too high, the nozzles may become clogged. When changing the temperature, make sure you adjust to an appropriate temperature.

## Introduction

### 5 Preheat Start/Stop

Each heater starts heating when a job is sent, and printing starts when all heaters reach a set temperature.

Press **Preheat Start** to start pre-heating each heater, and then the pre-heater and platen heater maintain a constant set temperature. The curing heater maintains a standby temperature.

Pre-heating allows you to start printing quickly once a job has been sent.

You can start/stop pre-heating for all heaters each time you press this area. Additionally, all heaters turn off after the time set in **Heater Off Timer** in the settings menu has elapsed. Heating starts when a print job is sent, but you can still press **Preheat Start** if necessary.

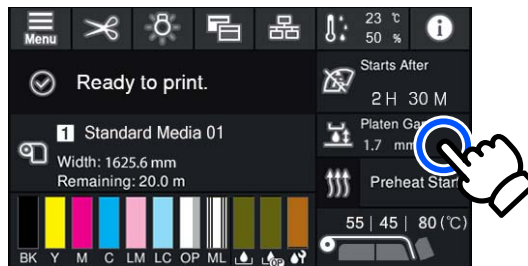
Also, if **Heater** from **Temperature** is set to **Off** in the settings menu, pressing **Preheat Start** does nothing and pre-heating does not start. Heaters that are set to **Off** do not heat up even if a job is sent. You can make **Heater** settings for each heater.

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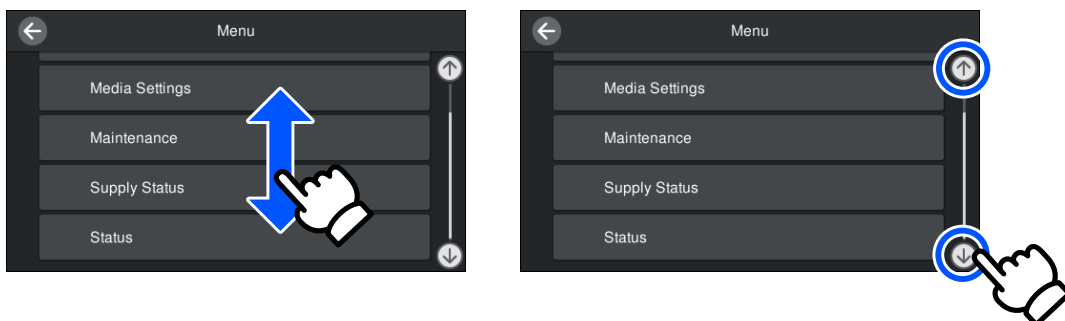
## Operating procedure

The black background area on the home screen and the startup adjustment screen does not respond even if you press it. When you press the gray tiled area in the operation area, the screen or the value changes.

Depending on the printer's operating status, you may not be able to perform the function for every button displayed at the top of the screen. If the function is unavailable, the icon is grayed out and the button does not respond.



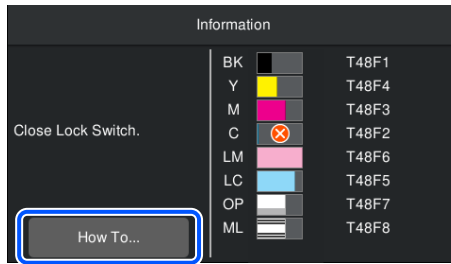
Operation areas do operations when pressed. However, when a scroll bar is displayed as shown below, you can scroll the screen by moving (sliding) your finger up and down on the screen. You can also scroll by pressing on the up and down icons on the scroll bar.

## Understanding the Signal Lamps

The status of the printer is indicated by whether or not the three color lamps are lit or flashing. The lamp colors are red, yellow, and green from top to bottom. When red or yellow is lit or flashing, an error or warning has occurred on the printer. You can check the details of the error or warning on the control panel's screen.

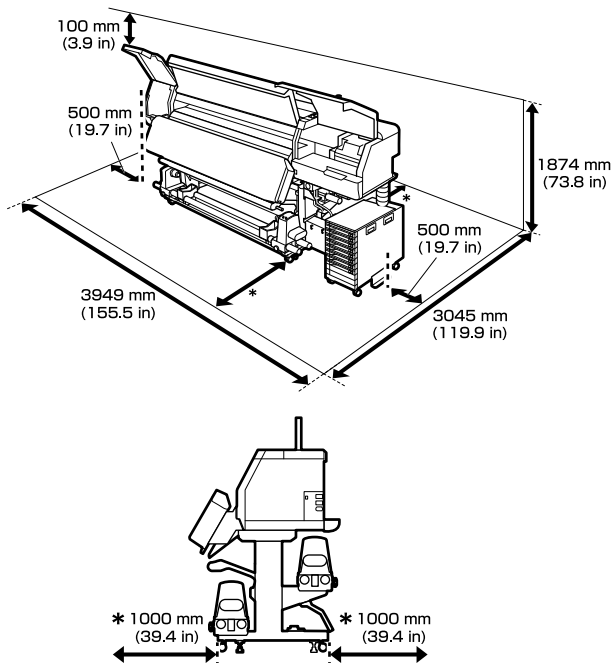
## Notes on Usage and Storage

### Installation space

Make sure that you secure the following space, clear of any other objects, so that paper ejection and consumable replacement are not obstructed.



### Notes when using the printer

Note the following points when using this printer to avoid breakdowns, malfunctions, and print quality decline.

- ❑ We recommend keeping the printer turned on at all times to prevent the print head from clogging. If the printer is turned off, make sure you turn it on once a week.

- ❑ When using the printer, observe the operating temperature and humidity range described in the "Specifications Table".  ["Specifications Table" on page 143](#)

Note, however, that the desired results may not be achieved if the temperature and humidity are within the limits for the printer but not within those for the media. Be sure the operating conditions suit the media. For more information, see the documentation supplied with the media.

Also, when operating in dry areas, air conditioned environment, or under direct sunlight, maintain the appropriate humidity.

- ❑ Avoid using the printer in locations with heat sources or that are exposed to direct draughts from ventilators or air conditioners. The print head nozzles could dry out and clog.

- ❑ Do not bend or tug the waste ink tube. Ink could spill inside or around the printer.

- ❑ Maintenance such as cleaning and replacement must be performed according to usage frequency or at recommended intervals. Failure to perform regular maintenance could result in loss of print quality. In the absence of the appropriate maintenance, continued use could damage the print head.

- ❑ The print head may not be capped (the print head may not return to the right side) if the printer is turned off when media is jammed or an error has occurred. Capping is a function that automatically covers the print head with a cap (lid) to prevent the print head from drying out. In this case, turn on the power and wait a while until capping is performed automatically.

- ❑ When the power is on, do not remove the power plug or cut the power at the breaker. Otherwise, the print head may not be capped properly. In this case, turn on the power and wait a while until capping is performed automatically.

- ❑ Print Head Cleaning is performed automatically for the print head at a fixed interval after printing to keep the nozzles from clogging. Be sure that the Waste Ink Bottle is placed whenever the printer is on.

## Introduction

- ❑ As well as being expended during printing, ink is used during Print Head Cleaning and other maintenance operations required to keep the print head in working order.

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### Notes when not using the printer

If you are not using it, note the following points when storing the printer. If it is not stored correctly, you may not be able to print properly the next time it is used.

- ❑ If the printer will not be used for more than two weeks (and will be turned off at this time), use the cleaning ink supply unit (sold separately) and perform pre-storage maintenance. Leaving the heads unwashed causes permanent clogs. See the following for more information.

- ❑ If you do not print for a long time and do not perform pre-storage maintenance, turn the printer on at least once a week.
 

If you do not print for a long time, the print head nozzles may become clogged. Print Head Cleaning will be performed automatically after the printer is turned on and started. Print Head Cleaning prevents clogged print heads and maintains print quality. Do not turn the printer off until Print Head Cleaning is complete.
- ❑ If you have not used the printer for a long time, check the print head for clogging before you start printing. Perform Print Head Cleaning if the print head is clogged.

- ❑ When storing the printer in an environment below -15°C (5°F), make sure you execute **Keeping Preparation** in the settings menu. If the printer is stored without executing this procedure, the print head could be damaged.
  - 🔗 [“Long-term Storage \(Pre-storage Maintenance\)” on page 97](#)
- ❑ The pressure rollers may crease media left in the printer. The media may also become wavy or curled, causing jams or resulting in the media coming into contact with the print head. Remove the media before putting the printer in storage. After removing the media, move the media loading lever to the front.

- ❑ Store the printer after confirming that the print head has been capped (the print head is positioned at the far right). If the print head is left uncapped for a long time, the print quality may decline.

**Note:**

*If the print head is not capped, turn the printer on, and then turn it off.*

- ❑ Close all covers before placing the printer in storage. If you are not using the printer for a long time, put an anti-static cloth or cover on the printer to prevent dust. The print head nozzles are very small, and they can become clogged easily if fine dust gets on the print head, and you may not be able to print properly.
- ❑ When storing the printer, be sure that it is level: do not store it on an angle, on end, or upside down.



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### Notes on handling the ink supply units

Note the following points when handling ink supply units to maintain good print quality.

- ❑ Extra ink is required to fully charge the print head nozzles the first time the printer is used; therefore, replacement ink supply units will be needed earlier than usual.
- ❑ Store ink supply units at room temperature out of direct sunlight.
- ❑ To ensure print quality, we recommend using all of the ink before whichever of the following dates is earlier:
  - ❑ The expiry date shown on the ink supply unit packaging
  - ❑ One year from the date the ink supply unit was installed in the ink unit
- ❑ If you move the ink supply units from a cold place to a warm place, leave them at room temperature for more than four hours before using them.
- ❑ Do not touch the ink supply unit IC chip. You may not be able to print properly.

## Introduction

- ❑ Do not leave the ink unit without any ink supply units installed. The ink in the printer will dry out and the printer will not function as expected. Leave ink supply units installed even when the printer is not in use.
- ❑ Because the IC chip manages the ink supply unit's own information, such as the remaining ink level, you can still re-insert and use them if you removed them before the replacement message appears.
- ❑ Before you store ink supply units that you remove during use, use a cleaning stick from the supplied Cleaning Kit to absorb any ink stuck to their ink supply ports. Dried ink on the supply port may cause ink leaks when the ink cartridge/ink supply unit is reinserted and used. See the following for more information on cleaning methods.

 While ink cartridges/ink supply units are in storage, keep the ink supply ports free of dust. The ink supply port has a valve in it so it does not need to be capped.
- ❑ Removed ink supply units may have ink around the ink supply port, so be careful not to get any ink on the surrounding area when removing the ink supply units.
- ❑ To maintain the quality of the print head, this printer stops printing before ink supply units are completely expended.
- ❑ Although the ink supply units may contain recycled materials, this does not affect printer function or performance.
- ❑ Do not dismantle or remodel ink supply units. You may not be able to print properly.
- ❑ Do not drop or knock an ink supply unit against hard objects; otherwise, the ink may leak from the ink supply unit.
- ❑ Remove the ink supply units installed in the ink unit once a week and shake them thoroughly. You do not need to shake the ink supply units for OP or ML.

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## Notes on handling the ink unit

- ❑ Use the ink unit wire to fasten the ink unit to the front and back of the printer's legs. The ink tube may break if you move the ink unit while it is connected to the printer without being fastened with the ink unit wire.
- ❑ Do not remove the ink tube connector once it has been connected during setup. Ink may leak if you remove this without paying close attention.

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## Precautions When Handling and Storing Media

Note the following when handling or storing media. Media that are in poor condition will not produce good quality prints.

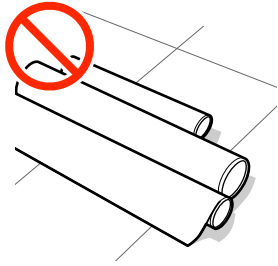
Be sure to read the documentation provided with each type of media.

## Precautions when handling and storing

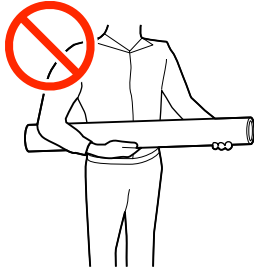
- ❑ Do not fold the media or damage the printable surface.
- ❑ Do not touch the printable surface. Moisture and oils from your hands can affect print quality.
- ❑ When handling media, hold it by both edges. We recommend wearing cotton gloves.
- ❑ Keep the media dry.
- ❑ Packaging materials can be used to store media and should not be thrown away.
- ❑ Avoid locations that are subject to direct sunlight, excessive heat, or humidity.
- ❑ When not in use, media should be removed from the printer, rewound, and inserted in its original packaging for storage.

## Introduction

- ❑ Do not place exposed media directly on the floor. Media should be rewound and inserted in its original packaging for storage.



- ❑ Do not carry media with the media surface pressed against clothing. Handle media in its individual packaging until just before loading the media in the printer.



- ❑ Do not store the media uncovered. Otherwise, the edges of the media may become wavy or curled resulting in the media coming into contact with the print head during printing which could cause a malfunction to occur.
- ❑ Leaving media in the printer for extended periods may cause it to deteriorate.

## Handling Media After Printing

To maintain long lasting, high quality print results, note the following points.

- ❑ Do not rub or scratch the printed surface. If they are rubbed or scratched, the ink may peel off.
- ❑ Do not touch the printed surface, as this may remove the ink.
- ❑ Avoid direct sunlight.
- ❑ To prevent discoloration, display and store prints as instructed in the documentation supplied with the media.



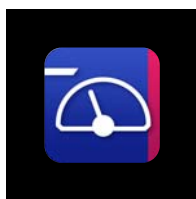
## Starting Procedure

Epson Edge Dashboard is a Web application.

- 1 The application can be launched using either of the following two methods.

### Windows

- ❑ Click the **Epson Edge Dashboard** icon on the Desktop toolbar and select **Show Epson Edge Dashboard**.



- ❑ Click **Start-All Programs (or Programs)-Epson Software-Epson Edge Dashboard**, in this order.

### Mac

- ❑ Click the **Epson Edge Dashboard** icon on the menu bar of the Desktop and select **Show Epson Edge Dashboard**.



### Linux

Click **Applications-Other-Epson Edge Dashboard**.

- 2 Epson Edge Dashboard starts.

## Registering the Printer

The Epson Edge Dashboard can monitor, manage, and copy media settings to registered printers.

On Windows computers, printers are registered automatically. This allows you to monitor and manage them immediately after starting the Epson Edge Dashboard. If your printer is not automatically registered, check that you are using it under the following conditions, and then register it manually.

- ❑ A communication driver provided with the printer has been installed on a computer
- ❑ The computer and printer are connected
- ❑ The printer is on standby

Printers are not registered automatically for Mac or Linux. Register your printer manually from the Register Printer screen. This screen is displayed when you start Epson Edge Dashboard for the first time.

### Manual registration procedure

### Printing with the appropriate settings for the media being used (printing using EMX)

You must register the print information and the media setting values that are appropriate for the media you are using to the printer and the Epson Edge Print to print correctly on the media you are using.

This is because media has various unique characteristics. For example, there is media that needs large amounts of ink or that requires time to dry. If you do not print with the settings that match the media, the print results will not be satisfactory.

However, to do the settings to get the optimum printouts on the media you are using by finding the optimum values for each of the multiple setting items is complicated, and requires an extreme amount of time and work.

Here, we use the print files (EMX files) provided free from Epson to explain a method to easily print and get the print quality of the expert settings.

### Preparing to print

#### Checking the operating environment

Check the following points.

- The printer and Epson Edge Print are connected correctly, and the power is on.
- The computer on which the RIP server (Epson Edge Print) is installed is connected to the Internet.
- Epson Edge Print is running.
- The printer is registered in Epson Edge Print.
- Media is loaded in the printer and it is ready to print.

#### Preparing the print data

Prepare print data in a data format that is compatible with Epson Edge Print.

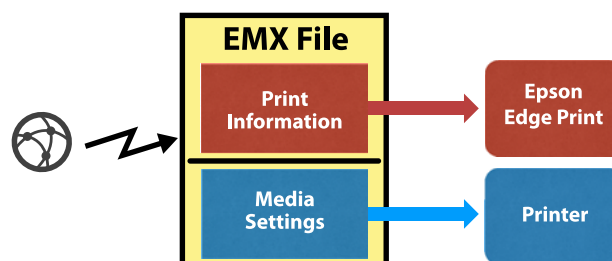
For details on supported data formats, see the Epson Edge Print help.

Generally, we recommend PDF for the following reasons.

- There are no broken links to images or disrupted layouts.
- Text does not need to be outlined.
- The appearance does not change, even for different versions of image processing software.

### Preparing EMX files

An EMX file is a print settings file for each media type and includes the following information that is necessary to print appropriately on commercially available media.



#### Print Information

The settings that are registered in Epson Edge Print, such as the media's ICC profile, number of passes, and resolution.

#### Media Settings

The settings that are registered to the printer's Media Management for the heater temperature, Platen Gap, Feeding Tension, and so on, that are appropriate for the media you are using.

In this section, we explain the procedure to acquire and register EMX files in Epson Edge Print.

To acquire an EMX file, the RIP server must be connected to the internet.

- 1 Click Tool menu - **Manage Preset** - (Manage Print Info) in this order.

The screen changes to the Manage Print Info screen.

- 2 Click (Add).

Adding Print Information starts.

**3** Select **Acquire EMX File** and click **Proceed**.  
A list of the EMX files provided for free by Epson is displayed.

**4** Select the EMX file that is compatible with the media you are using.

Select one EMX file. You cannot select multiple EMX files at one time.

The EMX files that you have already acquired are greyed out and cannot be selected.

The ones that show **Update Available** in **Status** indicate that an EMX has been updated after you acquired it.

If you select and acquire an EMX that shows **Update Available**, the file that was already acquired is overwritten.

**5** Click **Proceed**.

You can copy the media setting value for the acquired EMX file to the printer. To copy the file, select **Copy Media settings** and proceed to step 6.

If you are not copying the file, then proceed to step 7.

**6** Select where to copy the media setting values within the EMX file, and then click **Execute**.

The media numbers (1 to 50) that are registered to the selected printer are displayed. Specify where to copy the media setting values (media numbers) within the EMX file acquired in step 4.

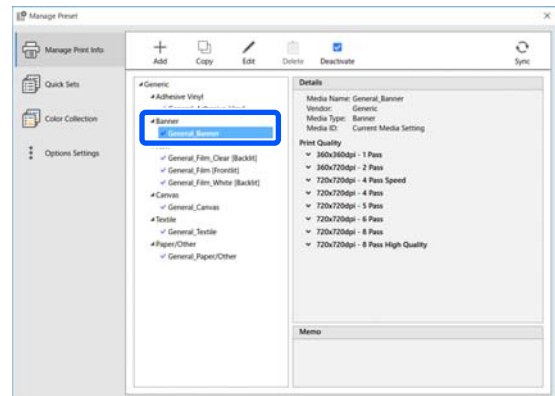
Selecting a number that is blank adds the values. Selecting a number that has already been registered overwrites the registered information.


**7** Click **Finish**.

Acquisition and registration are done.

When registration is finished, the registered print information is added to the print information list.

Print information is identified by the media name.



The  on the left of the media name indicates that it is enabled. You can select enabled print information by using its **Media Name** in  (Basic Settings) in the Job Settings menu. If there are so many items displayed for a **Media Name** that it becomes difficult to choose, select print information that is not needed on this screen, and then click  (Deactivate). The  on the left side of the media name disappears and the print information is disabled.

You can customize settings based on acquired print information or create new print information.

See the Epson Edge Print help for detailed information about editing and adding print information.

## Preparing the printer

After copying the media settings for the acquired EMX file to the printer, perform Print Adjustments from the printer's Settings menu.

Print Adjustments optimizes the media settings to correct individual differences in your media and printer so that you can perform optimal printing using your media and printer combination.

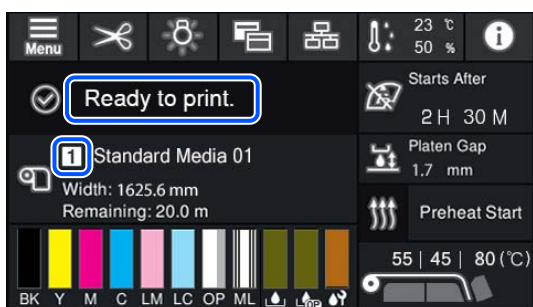
If you do not execute Print Adjustments, banding or graininess may appear in the print results.

**1** Load the media you are actually using on the printer.

When you have finished loading the media, the settings screen for the media you have loaded is displayed on the control panel screen.

- 2 Select the number selected in step 6 from "Preparing EMX files".  
When the media information settings are complete, the home screen is displayed.  
Check that the specified media number is displayed, and that the message **Ready to print.** is displayed.



- 3 Execute **Print Adjustments** in the Settings menu.

## Printing procedure

- 1 Click (Add) in the Job toolbar and add the print data to the Job List.  
Or, drag and drop the print data onto the Job List.  
The name of the data and a thumbnail for the print data that was added appear in the Job List.

**Note:**

When you click (Add) and select the print data, you can also select Quick Sets at the same time.



Quick Sets are a saved batch of print job settings. Jobs are generated according to these settings.

- 2 Select a job to print from the Job List.  
An image of the printout appears in the preview area.
- 3 Click (Basic Settings) in the Job Setting menu.  
The setting area changes to Basic Settings, and you can set the media size, media name (print information), and print quality (resolution and number of passes).  
For details, see the Epson Edge Print help.
- 4 Click (Print) in the Job toolbar to start printing.

### To print large jobs

While it depends on the performance of your server, with large jobs, such as long jobs or nested jobs, the print heads may stop and start during printing. In this situation, we recommend performing RIP processing before printing.  
For details, see the Epson Edge Print help.

### When you want to print jobs in order in batches

When there are multiple jobs in the Job List, you can decide on an order and then specify batch printing.  
When you have specified batch printing, you can sort the Job List in the order for printing.

During printing, **Printing** appears in the **Status** column in the Job List. A progress bar for the remaining print time also appears in the preview area.

**Note:**

Check the status of the switch printer tab before starting to print. You cannot print if the status icon is one of the following.

: Error has occurred.

: Currently performing an operation other than printing, such as Print Head Cleaning or operating the control panel.

: The power is off or not connected.

Prepare the printer for printing.

Jobs that are finished printing are automatically moved to the Printed Job list.

### Stopping printing

- 1 Select the job to stop printing from the Job List, and click  (Cancel) in the Job toolbar. Or, open the right click menu on the name of the job to stop printing and select **Cancel**.
- 2 When the confirmation screen appears, click **Yes**.

### Dividing a large image into parts to print it (tiling)


This section explains the typical features of Epson Edge Print.

When printing a large image that is wider than the media on which you are printing, you can divide the large image into several parts and print it on the media.

You can also add overlaps for pasting so that after printing the image can be pasted together into one image.

The procedure for dividing an image is explained below.

### How to divide an image

- 1 Select a job to divide from the Job List.
- 2 Click  (Tiling) in the Job Setting menu. The setting area changes to Tiling settings.
- 3 Select **Enable Setting**. The settings items are enabled.

- 4 Set the size of the divisions in **Tiling Setting**. Each of the divided images are called “tiles”.

To set the number of pieces in which to divide the image, select **Specify by Number of Tiles**.

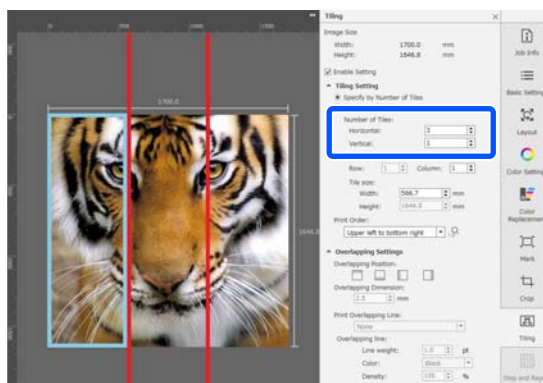
To set the size of tiles and then divide the image, select **Specify by Tile Size**.

To set the number of tiles, advance to step 5.

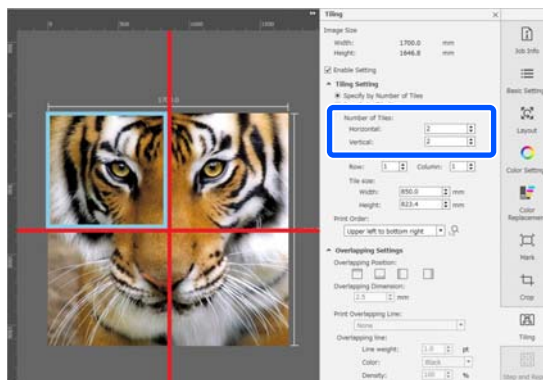
To set the size of tiles, advance to step 7.

- 5 Set how many divisions to make in **Number of Tiles**.

- 6 You can make fine adjustments to the size of tiles that you are dividing.

If you want to avoid generating a pasted edge in any position, such as where the eye is located in the example of 3 divisions in Horizontal in step 5, use the following procedure to select the upper left tile and adjust the tile size.

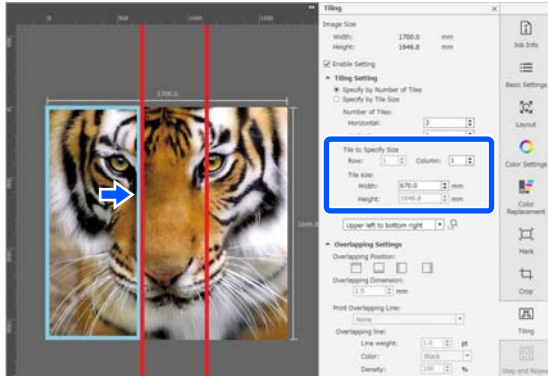

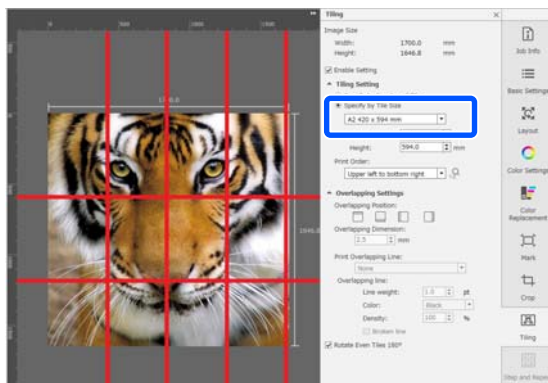
The tile targeted to be adjusted is indicated by a light blue frame.

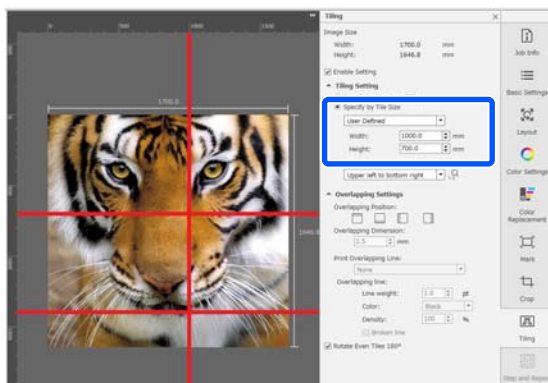

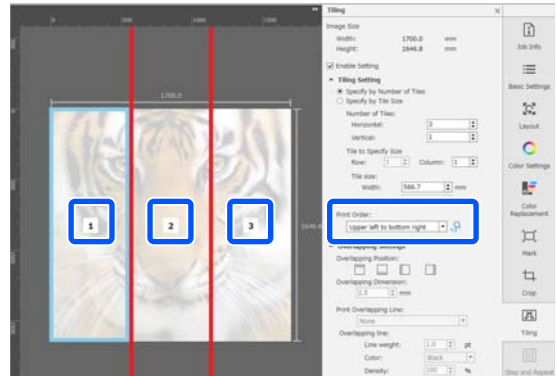

- 8** Set the order in which tiles are printed in **Print Order**.

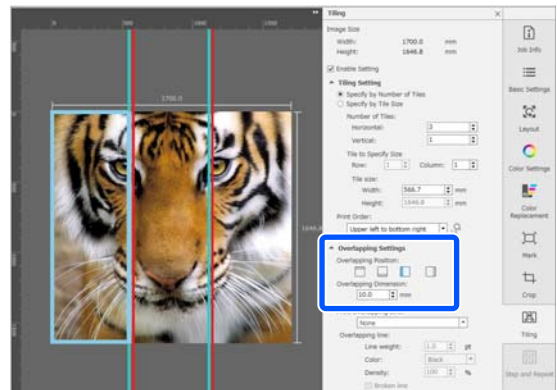
When you select **Print Order** and then click , a number indicating the print order is displayed on each tile in the preview area.



- 9** Set the overlap for pasting the images together in **Overlapping Settings**.

- (1) Set where to set the overlap in **Overlapping Position**.
- (2) Set the width of the overlap in **Overlapping Dimension**.

Example: **Overlapping Dimension** is 10 mm and the **Overlapping Position** is on the left side



If you want to print boundary lines between the image and the overlap, go to step 10.

If you do not want to print boundary lines between the image and the overlap, go to step 11.

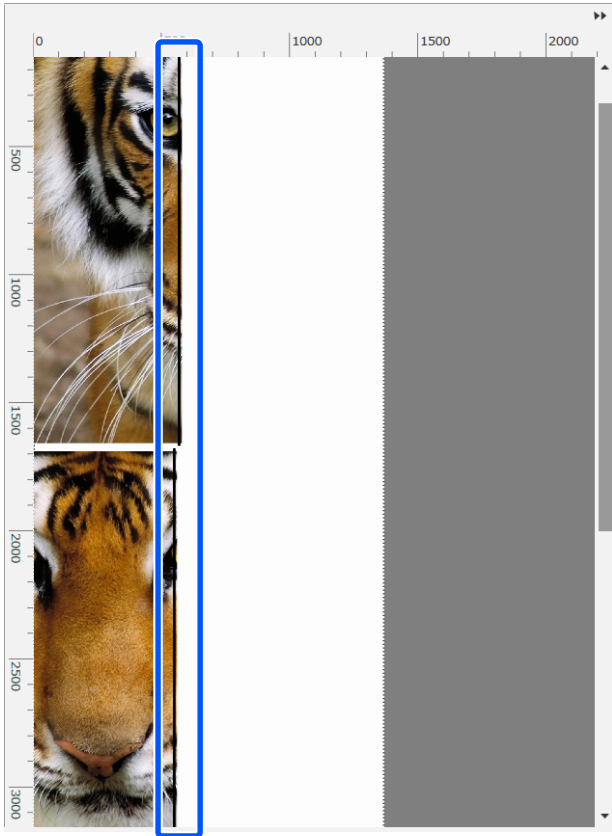
- 10** In **Print Overlapping Line**, select **Print on Image and Margins** or **Print only on Margins**.

Boundary lines are printed between the image and the overlap and can be used as guides to paste the image together.

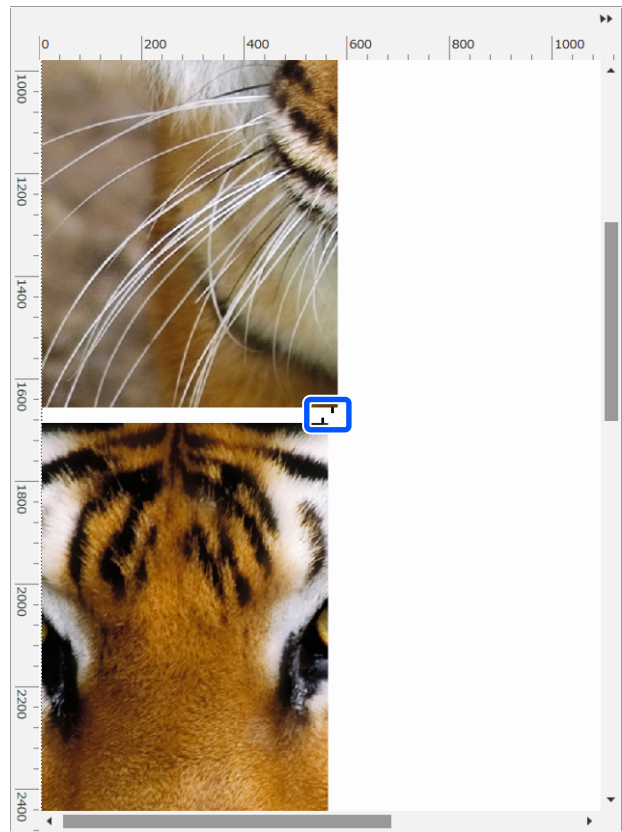

You can use **Overlapping line** to change the thickness, color, and density of the boundary lines to make them easier to see. If you select **Broken line**, you can change the boundary line from a solid to a broken line.

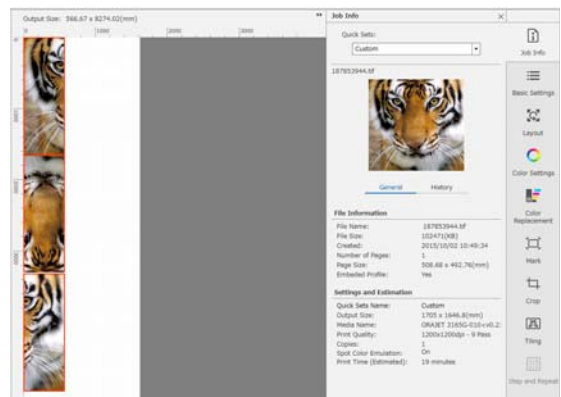

Click  (Layout) in the Job Settings menu to change the tile arrangement.

For example, you can reduce wasted media by arranging tiles horizontally that were initially arranged vertically to match the width of the media, and then printing.

However, depending on the arrangement of the tiles, there may be color deviation at the seams when the images are pasted together.

### When not printing a specified tile

You can cancel printing with the following procedure when you do not want to print a specific tile after an image is divided in the **Tiling** settings.

- 1 Open the right click menu on the tile not to print.
- 2 Clear the **Print** checkbox.  
When you clear the **Print** checkbox, an icon is displayed on the tile.  
Select the checkbox to print the tile.

**Note:**

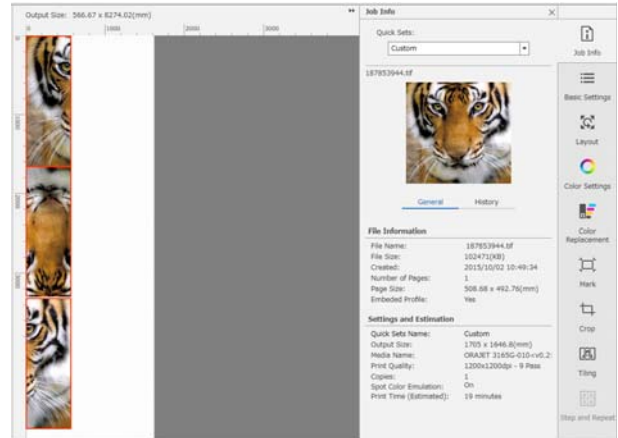
If you right-click on a tile and select **Clear All** from the menu displayed, none of the tiles are printed.

If you only want to print one tile, right-click on the tile you want to print, select **Clear All** from the menu displayed, and then select **Print**.

### When color deviation at the seams stands out

When images are pasted together and the color deviation at the seams is conspicuous, check if the **Rotate Even Tiles 180°** checkbox in the **Tiling** settings is cleared.

When this is selected, the tiles are alternately printed top to bottom so the discoloration becomes less conspicuous.



You can also improve the issue of color deviation by setting **Print Head Warm Up** to **On** in the printer's settings menu.

## Notes on loading media

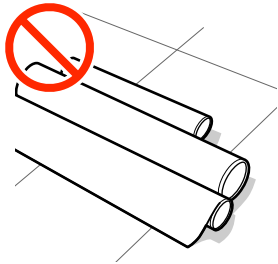
When storing and handling media, be sure to observe the following points to keep the surface of the media free of dust and lint. Using media when there is dust or lint on it can cause nozzles to clog and ink to come off in the print results.

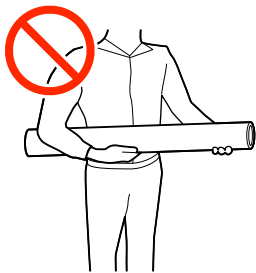
### Do not place exposed media directly on the floor.

Media should be rewound and inserted in its original packaging for storage.



### Do not carry media with the media surface pressed against clothing.

Handle media in its individual packaging until just before loading the media in the printer.



## Notes on Loading Media

### **Caution:**

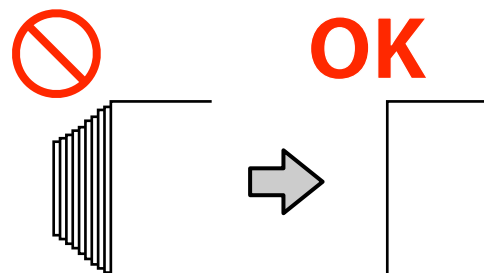
- The curing heater, heaters, and media edge plates may be hot; observe all necessary precautions. Failure to observe the necessary precautions could result in burns.*
- Because the media is heavy, it should not be carried by one person.*
- Be careful not to trap your hands or fingers when opening or closing the printer cover. Failure to observe this precaution could result in injury.*
- Do not rub your hands along the edges of the media. The edges of the media are sharp and can cause injury.*

### Load the media just before printing.

Media left in the printer may also become wavy or curled, causing jams or resulting in the media coming into contact with the print head. This could cause the printer to malfunction or print quality to decline.

### Do not load media if the right and left edges are uneven.

If media is loaded and the right and left edges of the roll are uneven, media feeding problems may cause the media to move around during printing. Either rewind to align the edges or use a roll without any issues.



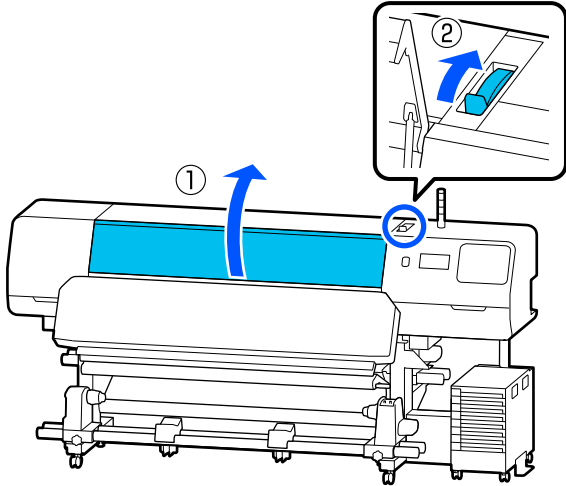

- Always position the media edge plates so that the edges of the media are at the centers of the holes. Incorrect positioning causes banding (horizontal banding, tint unevenness, or stripes) during printing.

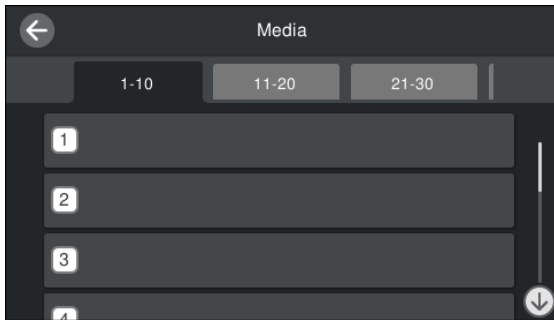

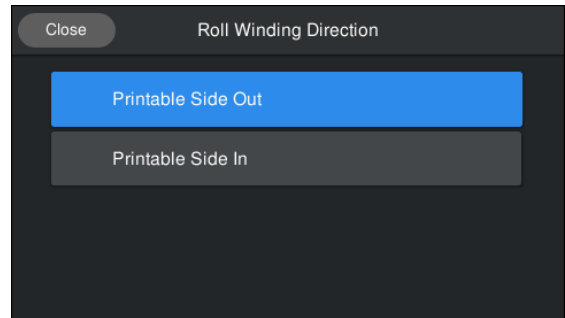

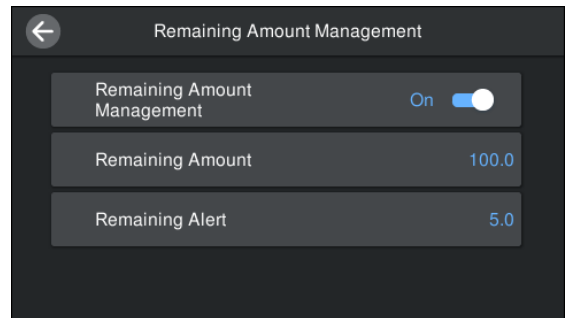

*The control panel display shows the approximate amount of media remaining based on the length set for the media and the amount used during printing.*
- Remaining Alert**  
*A warning is displayed when the amount of media remaining reaches a specified level.*

### **Caution:**

- ❑ Follow the instructions in the manual when loading media or roll cores or removing media from the take-up roll. Dropping media, roll cores, or take-up rolls could result in injury.

## Optimizing Media Settings (Automatic Adjustment)

You should optimize the media settings in the following situations. To optimize the media settings, perform **Automatic Adjustment** from **Print Adjustments**.

### When registering media settings in the EMX file to the printer

When the media settings of an EMX file downloaded from Epson Edge Print/Epson Edge Dashboard are registered to the printer, the media settings are optimized to correct individual differences in your media and printer so that you can perform optimal printing using your media and printer combination.

### When changing Advanced Settings after saving media settings

## Precautions when performing Print Adjustments

**Adjustments are made according to the media loaded in the printer.**

- ❑ Using the actual printing conditions, correctly load the media that needs to be adjusted in the printer. If you are attaching the Auto Take-up Reel Unit to print, place the media on the Auto Take-up Reel Unit during Print Adjustments.
- ❑ When registering the media settings to the printer, make sure you select the name set in **Media Management** from the Settings menu in **Select Media**.

### Make sure nozzles are not clogged before adjusting.

If nozzles are clogged, adjustments will not be performed correctly.

Print to visually inspect the check pattern (Standard), and then perform Print Head Cleaning if necessary.

**Make sure that the media remaining is approximately 1.6 m (63 in) or more.**

If there is less than approximately 1.6 m (63 inches) of media remaining, a media end error may occur during the curing process and so on. If this error occurs, you may not be able to make adjustments, so always check the amount of media remaining before making adjustments.

## Automatic Adjustment Procedure




Automatic Adjustment performs Media Feed Adjustment and Print Head Alignment automatically while printing the pattern.

The approximate length of the media required to print the test pattern is given below.

Approximately 300 mm (11.8 inches)

You may not be able to perform Automatic Adjustment depending on the media you are using. If an error occurs, or if you notice banding or graininess in the print results even after performing Automatic Adjustment, perform **Manual Adjustment** from the Print Adjustments menu.

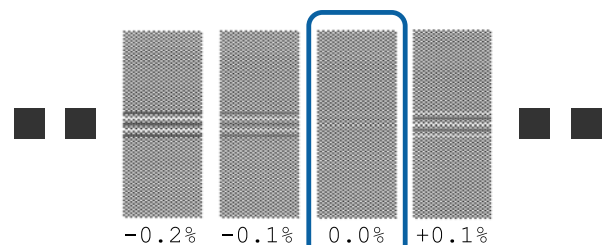

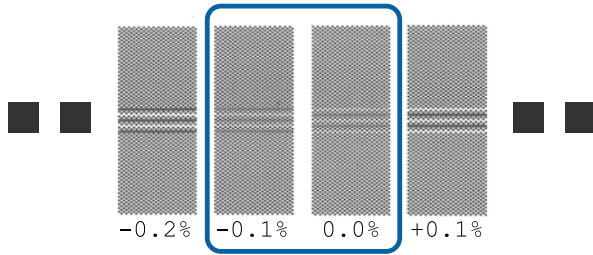

**7** Select whether or not to make the same adjustments again.

Select **Yes** if there are rows of patterns with the same overlap or misalignments in step 5. You can make adjustments again using the adjustment pattern that reflects the measurements you entered.

Press **No** to finish **Media Feed Adjustment**. If you also select **Print Head Alignment**, the **Print Head Alignment** adjustment pattern print confirmation screen is displayed.

If you do not select **Print Head Alignment**, **Manual Adjustment** closes.

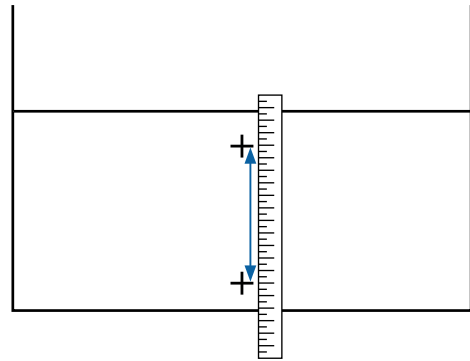

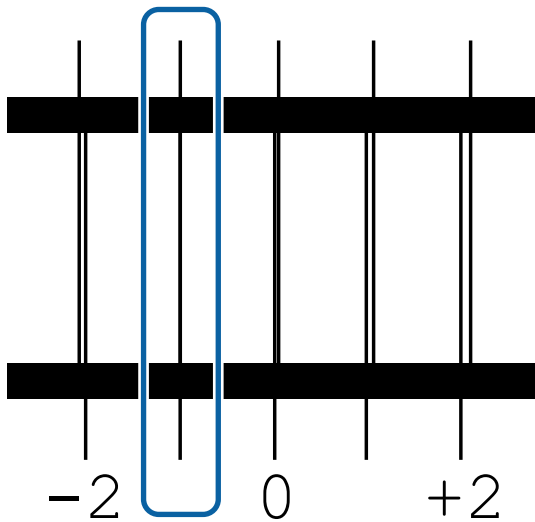

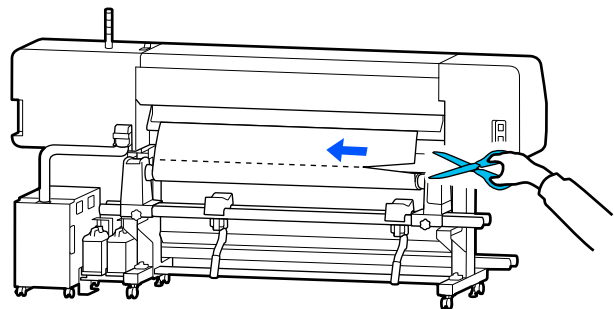

**Move to the back, and then use scissors to cut off the roll media. is displayed**

Use commercially available scissors to cut the media just above the roll core at the back of the printer.

### Printing the amount of media remaining

If the following two settings are set to **On** in advance, when an operation to feed the media to the cutting position is performed, the remaining length of the media and the printer's information is printed and then the media end is fed to the cutting position. You can print the length of the unprinted media on the media that you will remove, and then the next time you load this media, you can enter the printed length in the Remaining Amount Management setting for accurate management of the amount of media remaining.

## Before Printing

To maintain print quality, perform the following inspection before starting work each day.

### Checking the amount of ink remaining: (for the SC-R5000 Series)

If ink is expended while printing, printing can be resumed once the affected ink supply unit has been replaced. However, if you replace it while printing, colors may look different depending on how the ink dries. If you know that the print job will be a large one, we recommend that you use new ink supply units to replace those that are running low before you start. You can still use the removed ink supply unit in the future until the ink supply unit is expended.

### Checking the amount of ink remaining: (for the SC-R5000L Series)

When ink is expended, the ink supply automatically switches to another ink supply unit of the same color. Since printing continues as it is, replace the ink supply unit for which ink is expended while there is still enough ink remaining in the ink supply unit that is currently operating. You cannot print if the amount of ink remaining in both ink supply units of the same color are expended.

Press the ink status icon area on the home screen to check how much ink is remaining in the operational and non-operational ink supply units.

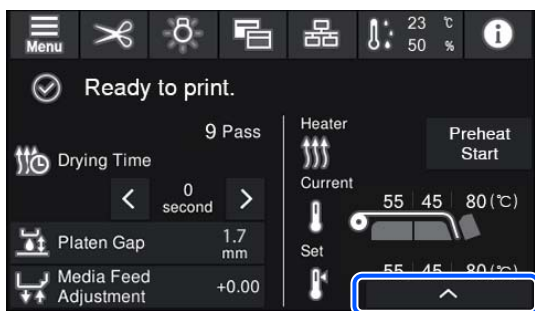

## Changing the temperature for each heater

- 1** Press  in the **Settings** area of the startup adjustment screen.

The area for changing the temperature for each heater is displayed.



When you want to correct banding during printing, correct the media feed amount.



- 1** During printing, press the following area on the startup adjustment screen.







If the startup adjustment screen is not displayed, press  (switch screens) on the home screen.

- 2** Press  /  on the screen, or press the  /  buttons on the control panel to change the value.


If the feed amount is too small, black bands (dark stripes) appear; press the  (or  button) to adjust the feed amount upwards.

In contrast, if the feed amount is too large, white bands (pale stripes) appear; press the  (or  button) to adjust the feed amount downwards.

The setting for the currently selected registered media number is updated.

- 4** Press  to return to the home screen.

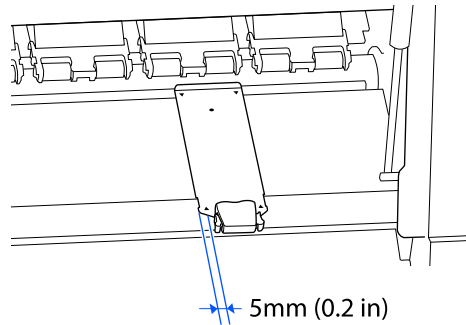

# Printable area

**The left and right edges of media recognized by the printer varies as shown below according to the Width Detection settings.**

**Width Detection On** : The printer automatically detects the left and right edges of the loaded media.

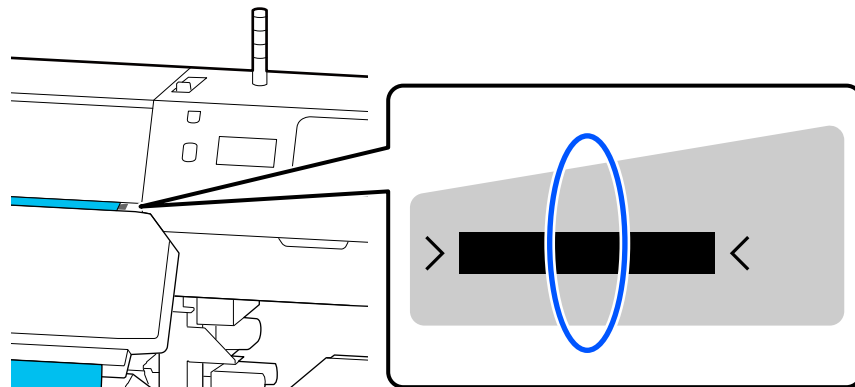
When media edge plates are attached, the area within 5 mm (0.2 inches) of the left and right edges of the media is recognized as the media edge.



The edges of the media are not detected correctly if the media edge plates are not attached correctly.

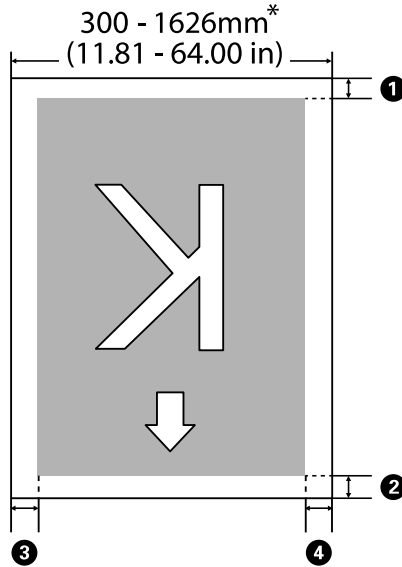

**Width Detection Off** : The center of the black rectangle on the label below is the standard position for the right edge of the media. The left edge of the media is the value set (300 to 1625.6 mm [11.81 to 64.00 in]) in **Width Detection - Off** in the settings menu, regardless of the width of the media that is loaded.

#### Metal or plastic (PP or PE) tray (available in the market)

Use when putting cleaning utensils, removed consumables, or cleaning fluid moved to the container supplied with the printer.

#### Media cleaner brush (supplied with the printer)

#### Soft cloth (commercially available)

Use when cleaning inside the printer. We recommend an item that is not likely to generate lint or static electricity.

# Precautions regarding maintenance

Note the following points when cleaning and replacing parts.

### **Caution:**

- ❑ Store ink supply units, cleaning ink supply units, cleaning liquid, and waste ink out of the reach of children.
- ❑ During maintenance, wear protective clothing, including protective eyewear, gloves, and a mask.  
*If ink, waste ink, or cleaning liquid come into contact with your skin or enter your eyes or mouth, take the following actions.*
  - ❑ If fluid adheres to your skin, immediately wash it off using large volumes of soapy water. Consult a physician if the skin appears irritated or is discolored.
  - ❑ If fluid enters your eyes, rinse immediately with water. Failure to observe this precaution could result in bloodshot eyes or mild inflammation. If problems persist, consult with a physician.
  - ❑ If fluid enters your mouth, consult a physician immediately.
  - ❑ If fluid is swallowed, do not force the person to vomit, and consult with a physician immediately. If the person is forced to vomit, fluid may get caught in the trachea which can be dangerous.
- ❑ After replacing the waste ink bottle or using the cleaning liquid, wash your hands and gargle thoroughly.

- ❑ Remove the media from the printer before proceeding.
- ❑ Never touch the belts, circuit boards, or any parts that do not require cleaning. Failure to observe this precaution could result in malfunction or reduced print quality.
- ❑ Use only the supplied cleaning sticks or sticks contained in a maintenance kit. Other types of sticks that produce lint will damage the print head.

- ❑ Always use fresh cleaning sticks. Re-using sticks can make stains even harder to remove.
- ❑ Do not touch the tips of the cleaning sticks. Oil from your hands could damage the print head.
- ❑ Only use the specified cleaning liquid to clean around the print head or the suction cap. Using a liquid other than that specified could cause the printer to malfunction or print quality to decline.
- ❑ Touch a metallic object before starting work to discharge any static electricity.

## Performing Regular Cleaning

### Daily Cleaning

When lint, dust, or ink adheres to the platen heater or the media edge plates, it could cause clogged nozzles or ink drops to occur.

To maintain optimum printing quality, we recommend cleaning before starting work every day.

### **Caution:**

- ❑ The curing heater, heaters, and media edge plates may be hot; observe all necessary precautions. Failure to observe the necessary precautions could result in burns.
- ❑ Do not put your hand inside the curing heater. Failure to observe the necessary precautions could result in burns.
- ❑ Be careful not to trap your hands or fingers when opening or closing the printer cover. Failure to observe this precaution could result in injury.

### **Important:**

When cleaning the platen heater, do not use cleaning liquid. Failure to observe this precaution could result in damaged parts.

**Maintenance**

**1** Make sure the printer is turned off and the screen has turned off, and then unplug the power cable from the outlet.

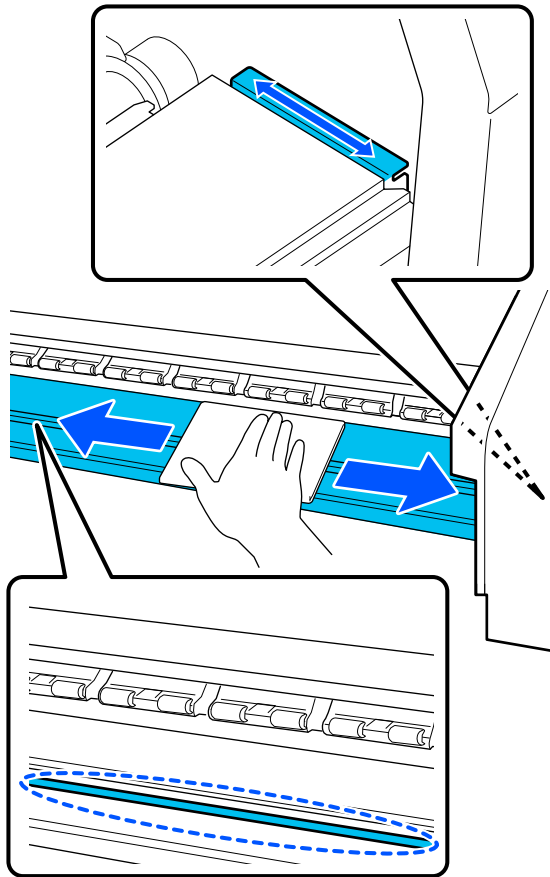
Disconnect both of the power cables.

**2** Leave the printer for a minute.

**3** Open the printer cover.

**4** Soak a soft cloth in water, wring it out thoroughly, and then wipe off any ink, lint, or dust that has adhered to the platen heater and the right side of the platen.

Carefully remove lint and dust stuck in the groove of the platen.



**5** Soak a soft cloth in water, wring it out thoroughly, and then wipe off any lint, or dust that has adhered to the media edge plates.

**! Important:**

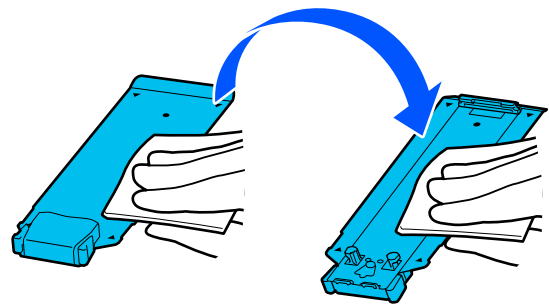
*When media with glue has been used, wipe away glue using a diluted neutral detergent. If you continue printing while glue is stuck to the rear, it may rub against the print head.*

**When using media with glue and when ink adheres**

Remove the media edge plates from the printer, and clean the front and back of the plates.

When stains are removed, be sure to attach the plates to their original positions.

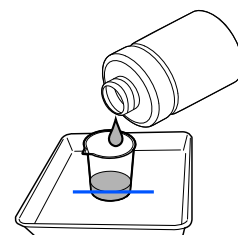

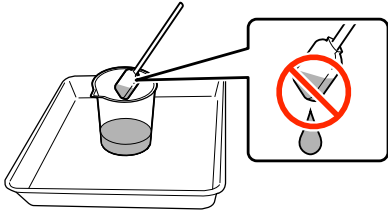

**1** Put the cup supplied with the Cleaning Kit on the tray, and pour approximately 10 ml (0.33 oz.) of cleaning liquid into the cup.

# Shaking and Replacing Ink Supply Units

## Shaking

### Timing and frequency of shaking

**!** **Important:**

Due to ink characteristics, the ink supply units of this printer are prone to sedimentation (components settling to the bottom of the liquid). If ink settles, tint unevenness and nozzle clogs occur.

Shake a new ink supply unit before installing it. After installing it in the ink unit, remove and shake it periodically.

- When replacing

Approx. 10 times in 10 seconds

You do not need to shake the OP, ML, or cleaning ink supply units.

- Once every week  
Remove any tray whose LED light is flashing blue, and then shake the ink supply unit tray. To maintain print quality, do not continue using them when they are flashing blue.

Approx. 5 times in 5 seconds

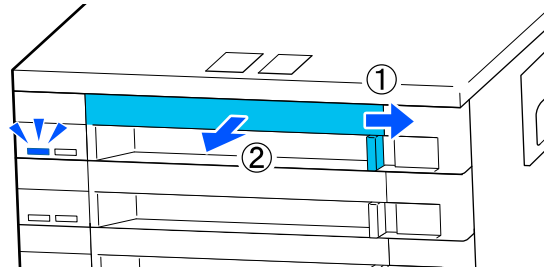
### Shaking method

- 1 Make sure the printer is on, and then pull the ink supply unit tray that needs to be shaken out of the ink unit.

Any ink supply unit whose LED light is flashing blue needs to be shaken.

**!** **Important:**

Place your hand on the bottom of the ink supply unit tray while removing it. If you use only one hand, the weight of the ink supply unit tray may cause it to fall, and be damaged, as you remove it.

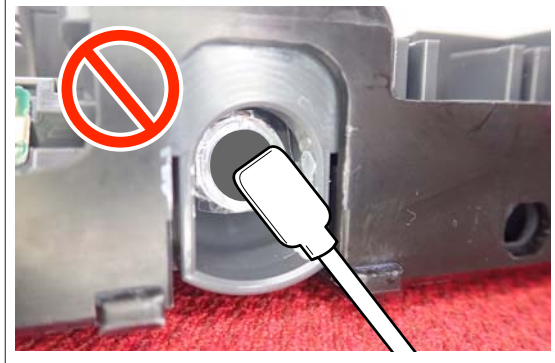


**Note:**

While the ink supply unit tray is pulled out, check the ink supply ports of the ink supply units. If ink has dripped from the port or accumulated at the bottom as shown in the photo, wipe it off using a cleaning stick.

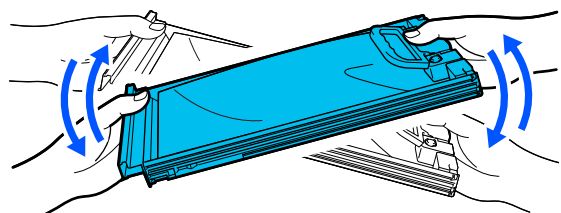


Do not touch the ink supply ports while wiping.



- 2 While the ink supply unit is in the ink supply unit tray, as shown in the illustration below, shake it thoroughly by tilting it up and down at about a 60 degree angle 5 times in 5 seconds.



- Do not forcefully shake or swing ink supply units or ink supply unit trays holding an ink supply unit. Ink could leak.



- Removed ink supply units may have ink around the ink supply port, so be careful not to get any ink on the surrounding area when removing the ink supply units.

Replacement procedure

**! Important:**

Epson recommends the use of genuine Epson ink supply units. Epson cannot guarantee the quality or reliability of non-genuine ink. The use of non-genuine ink may cause damage that is not covered by Epson's warranties, and under certain circumstances, may cause erratic printer behavior. Information about non-genuine ink levels may not be displayed, and use of non-genuine ink is recorded for possible use in service support.

SC-R5000 Series

If one of the installed ink supply units is expended, printing cannot be performed. If ink is expended while printing, you can continue printing after replacing the ink supply unit. If you continue to use an ink supply unit that is running low, you may need to replace the ink supply unit while printing. If you replace it while printing, colors may look different depending on how the ink dries. If you want to avoid issues such as this, we recommend replacing the ink supply unit before printing. You can still use the removed ink supply unit in the future until the ink supply unit is expended.

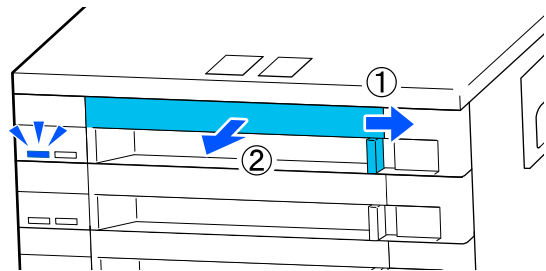

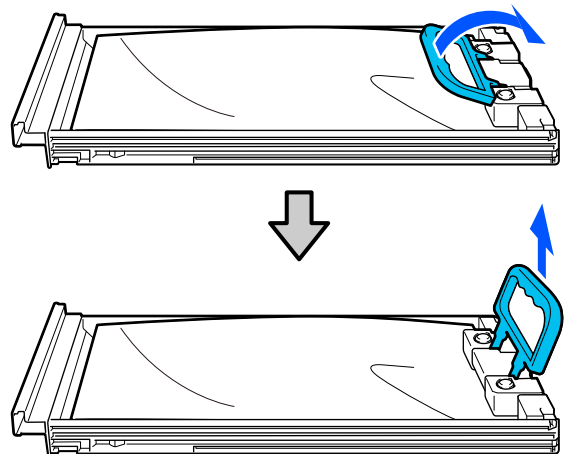
When ink is expended, the ink supply automatically switches to another ink supply unit of the same color. Since printing continues as it is, replace the ink supply unit for which ink is expended while there is still enough ink remaining in the ink supply unit that is currently operating. If one ink supply unit is operating, you can replace the other ink supply unit while printing. You cannot print if the amount of ink remaining in both ink supply units of the same color is expended.

The following procedure explains how to replace ink supply units and cleaning ink supply unit.

- 1 Make sure the printer is on.
- 2 Pull the ink supply unit tray of the ink supply unit you want to replace out of the ink unit.



- 3 Remove the ink supply unit from the ink supply unit tray.



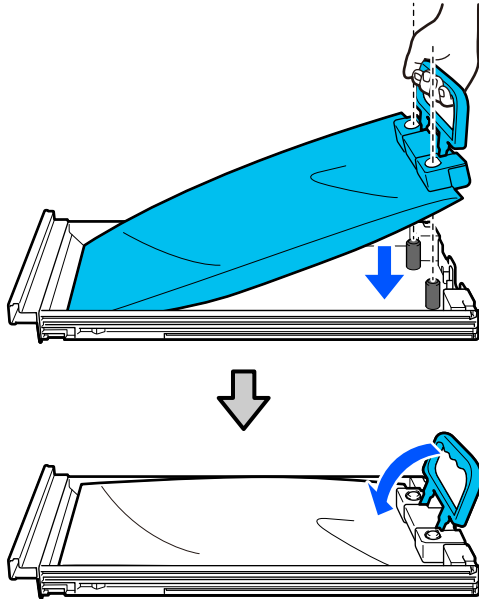

**Note:**  
 Note the following points when transferring waste ink from the Waste Ink Bottle to another container.

- ❑ Use a container made of PE (polyethylene) when transferring the waste ink.
- ❑ Attach the spout included with the printer to the rim of the Waste Ink Bottle and transfer the waste ink.
- ❑ Pour the waste ink carefully. Pouring the waste ink quickly may cause it to spill and splatter.
- ❑ Securely close the lid of the container to which you transferred the waste ink and store it in a location that is not exposed to open flames.
- ❑ Mixing waste ink from color ink and from OP is not toxic. However, if they are mixed they will solidify and sedimentation will occur.

## Print Head Nozzle Check

We recommend that you check the print head nozzles for clogs each time before you print to ensure quality results.

### Types of Nozzle Checks

There are the following two ways to check the print head for clogged nozzles.

#### On-Demand Nozzle Pattern

If you want to check the condition of the nozzles before printing, or if you see stripes or unevenness in the print results, you can print out a check pattern and visually check it to see the condition of the nozzles.

Depending on the width of the loaded media, you can save media by printing additional test patterns in the space beside an existing pattern:

- If the width is 51 to 64 inches, up to three patterns can be printed (one on the left, one in the center, and one on the right).
- If the width is equal to or greater than 34 inches but less than 51 inches, up to two patterns can be printed (one on the left and one on the right).
- If the width of the media is less than 34 inches, you cannot print side by side.


#### Nozzle Check between Pages

When printing for the set number of pages\* is complete, the next page is printed across the printed check pattern. When all printing is complete, you can visually inspect the pattern to determine whether there may be faint or missing colors in the preceding or following printout.

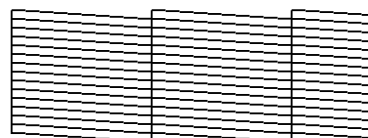

#### Perform Print Head Cleaning periodically

This printer comes with a built-in automatic maintenance function that automatically performs Print Head Cleaning periodically (approximately once every three hours) or when it is determined to be necessary based on the results of automatically monitoring the nozzles.

You can change the Print Head Cleaning frequency for the automatic maintenance function to a shorter period of time when necessary, for example, if you are using media that scuffs easily.

## Performing Print Head Cleaning

### Cleaning levels and order of execution


There are three levels of cleaning available: **Cleaning (Light)**, **Cleaning (Medium)**, and **Cleaning (Heavy)**.

Perform **Cleaning (Light)** first.

If you print a nozzle check pattern (Standard) after cleaning and the nozzles are still clogged, perform **Cleaning (Medium)**.

Print the **Standard** nozzle check pattern again; if the nozzles are still clogged, perform **Cleaning (Heavy)**.

### Procedure

- 1 Check that the printer is ready to print, and then press  (Menu) - **Maintenance** - **Print Head Cleaning**.
- 2 Select the cleaning level.  
First, select **Cleaning (Light)**, and then proceed to step 5.  
Next, select **Cleaning (Medium)**.  
And finally, select **Cleaning (Heavy)**.
- 3 Select the row of nozzles you want to clean.  
**All Nozzles**  
Select this option if all patterns in the printed nozzle check results (Standard) contain faint or missing segments. After making your selections, proceed to Step 5.  
**Select Nozzles**  
Select this if there are faint or missing segments in only some of the numbered patterns (nozzle arrays) in the nozzle check pattern (Standard). You can select multiple nozzle arrays.
- 4 Select the row of nozzles you want to clean, and then press **OK**.
- 5 Cleaning starts.  
A confirmation message is displayed when cleaning is complete.

**6** Press **Yes** to print a nozzle check pattern and check for clogged nozzles.

Select **Center** or **Left** in **Print Position** to print in a side margin where a nozzle check pattern has already been printed. Available items change depending on the width of the loaded media.

Press **No** to close the settings menu.

### If nozzles are still clogged even after performing Cleaning (Heavy)

The areas around the print head may be soiled.

Check the following, and then perform regular cleaning.

Clogged nozzles may not be cleared when you check using a nozzle check pattern (Standard) even after performing regular cleaning.

This printer has a built-in "clogged nozzle compensation function" that prints using other nozzles to compensate for ink that is not ejected due to clogged nozzles. So even if the nozzles are clogged, it may not have much effect on the print results.

You can check the print condition of the compensation function by using the nozzle check pattern (Quality Check).

#### Example when compensation function is enabled



If there is no unevenness or banding in the nozzle check pattern, you can use it as it is.

#### Example when compensation function is not enough



When there is a large number of clogged nozzles, the nozzle check pattern may contain unevenness or banding.

## Long-term Storage (Pre-storage Maintenance)

### Pre-storage Maintenance Timing

Always perform pre-storage maintenance if the printer will not be used (and will be turned off) for more than two weeks.

If you do not print for a long time and do not perform pre-storage maintenance, turn the printer on at least once a week.

#### **Important:**

*If you do not perform Pre-storage Maintenance, a print head nozzle could become permanently clogged.*

For pre-storage maintenance, use the number of the cleaning ink supply units (sold separately) shown for each model in the following table.

### Performing Pre-storage Maintenance

#### **Important:**

*If the amount of remaining ink or cleaning fluid is insufficient, the function may not run. If there is an insufficient amount of ink remaining, have new ink supply units on hand as a precaution.*

## Maintenance

- 1 Check that the printer is ready to print, and then press  (Menu) - **Maintenance - Keeping Preparation.**
- 2 Press **Start**.
- 3 Next, follow the on-screen instructions to replace the ink supply unit.

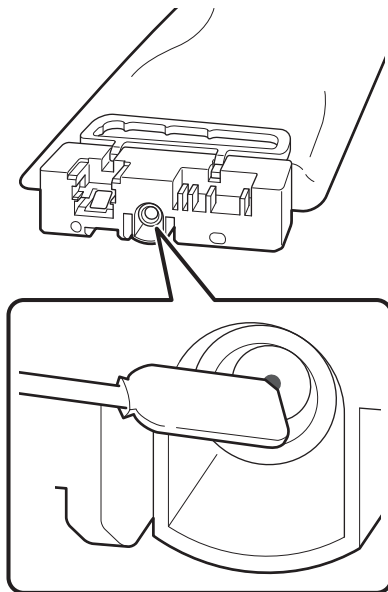
Before storing them, clean off any ink stuck to the ink supply ports of the ink supply units that you removed.

You do not need to clean the ink supply unit for OP.

### Cleaning method


Lightly touch the corner of a cleaning stick from the supplied Cleaning Kit to the hole of the ink supply port to adsorb the ink, as shown in the illustration below. You do not need to wipe off the ink.

Use a new cleaning stick for each color to avoid mixing the colors. Do not forcefully press or move the cleaning stick.

## Restarting use of the printer

### **Important:**

*When restarting use of the printer, charge the printer with ink. When charging with removed ink supply units, have new ink supply units on hand as a precaution.*

Switch on the power and follow the on-screen instructions.

When printing for the first time after restarting, perform a Print Head Nozzle Check and check that there are no clogged nozzles.

## Cleaning the inside surface of the printer cover

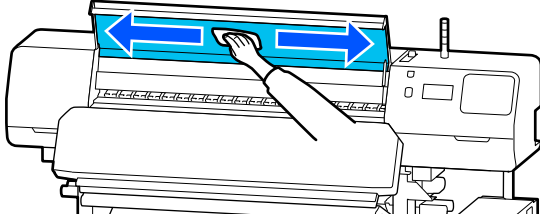
Ink mist causes the inside of the printer cover to become dirty. If you continue to use the printer while this is dirty, you cannot see inside the printer.

If it is dirty, follow the steps below to clean.

- 1 Make sure the printer is turned off and the screen has turned off, and then unplug the power cable from the outlet.  
Disconnect both of the power cables.
- 2 Leave the printer for a minute.
- 3 Open the printer cover.

## Maintenance

- 4 Wipe off lint and dust that has adhered to the inside of the printer cover using a soft cloth that has been soaked in water and thoroughly wrung out.



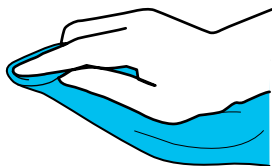
For anything that cannot be removed with a damp cloth, dip a cloth in neutral detergent, squeeze it out, and then wipe the stubborn stain.

## Cleaning pressure rollers

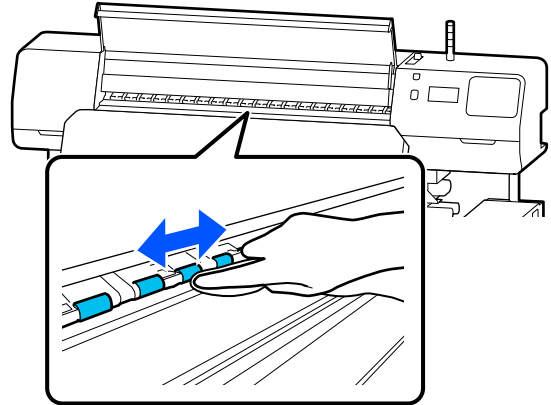
If you keep using the pressure rollers when they are soiled with ink mist, the print outs will be soiled.

If the rollers are dirty, follow the steps below to clean them.

- 1 Make sure the printer is turned off and the screen has turned off, and then unplug the power cable from the outlet.  
Disconnect both of the power cables.
- 2 Leave the printer for a minute.
- 3 Open the printer cover.
- 4 Raise the media loading lever.
- 5 Wrap a soft cloth that has been soaked in water and squeezed well around the tip of your finger as shown in the illustration.



- 6 Use the cloth to wipe the sides of the pressure rollers that have become soiled.





## Troubleshooting

### You cannot print (because the printer does not work)

#### The printer does not turn on.

- **Is the power cable plugged into the electrical outlet or the printer?**

Make sure the power cable is securely plugged into the printer.

- **Is there any problem with the electrical outlet?**

Make sure your outlet works by connecting the power cable for another electric product.

#### The printer is not communicating with the computer.

- **Is the cable plugged in properly?**

Make sure the printer's interface cable is securely plugged into the correct terminal of the computer and the printer. Also, make sure the cable is not broken nor bent. If you have a spare cable, try connecting with the spare cable.

- **Does the interface cable specification match the specifications for the computer?**

Make sure the interface cable specifications match the specifications for the printer and the computer.

- **When using a USB hub, is it being used correctly?**

In the USB specification, daisy-chains of up to five USB hubs are possible. However, we recommend that you connect the printer to the first hub connected directly to the computer. Depending on the hub you are using, the operation of the printer may become unstable. If this should occur, plug the USB cable directly into your computer's USB port.

- **Is the USB hub recognized correctly?**

Make sure the USB hub is recognized correctly on the computer. If it has, disconnect the USB hub from the computer and connect the computer directly to the printer. Ask the USB hub manufacturer about USB hub operation.

#### You cannot print under the network environment.

- **Are the network settings correct?**

Ask your network administrator for the network settings.

- **Connect the printer directly to the computer using a USB cable, and then try to print.**

If you can print via USB, there are some problems on the network environment. Ask your system administrator, or refer to the manual for your network system. If you cannot print via USB, see the appropriate section in this User's Guide.

#### The printer has an error.

- **Confirm if errors have occurred in the printer by checking the lights and messages on the printer's control panel.**



### The prints are not what you expected

#### Print quality is poor, uneven, too light, too dark, obvious graininess, or the tone differs.

#### ■ Are the print head nozzles clogged?

If the nozzles are clogged, specific nozzles do not fire ink and the print quality declines. Try printing a test pattern.

#### ■ Perform Print Head Alignment.

Given that there is a slight gap between the print head and the media, the landing sites for each ink may be affected by humidity, temperature, or inertial forces imparted by the print head, as well as the direction of the print head as it moves from right to left or left to right. As a result, the printing result may show obvious graininess or out-of-focus characteristics.

Select **Print Adjustments - Print Head Alignment** in the media settings to adjust print head misalignment that occurs during printing.

#### ■ Perform Media Feed Adjustment.

Large discrepancies in the feed amount cause banding (horizontal banding, tint unevenness, or stripes). Select **Print Adjustments - Media Feed Adjustment** in the media settings to make adjustment based on the target media.

#### ■ Are you using a genuine Epson ink supply unit?

This printer is developed for use with genuine Epson ink supply units. If you use non-Epson ink cartridges, printouts may be faint, or the color of the printed image may be changed because the remaining ink level is not correctly detected. Be sure to use the correct ink supply unit.

#### ■ Are you using an old ink supply unit?

The print quality declines when an old ink supply unit is used. Replace the old ink supply unit with a new one. Use all of the ink in the ink supply unit before the date printed on the package or within a year of installing the ink supply unit in the ink unit, whichever is sooner.

#### ■ Are the heaters at the correct temperature?

Raise the temperature of the pre-heater/platen heater if the print results are blurred or smudged or the ink clots. Note that raising the temperature too high in the curing heater can cause the media to shrink, wrinkle, or deteriorate. If the temperature of the platen heater is raised too high, the nozzles may become clogged. When changing the temperature, make sure you set it to an appropriate temperature.

In addition, the heaters may require some time to reach the desired temperature if the ambient temperature is low. The heaters may also not have the desired effect after reaching the selected temperature if the media is too cold. Allow the media to warm to room temperature before use.

#### ■ Are media settings correct?

Confirm that the media settings in the software RIP or on the printer match the media actually in use.

#### ■ Have you compared the printing result with the image on the display monitor?

Since monitors and printers produce colors differently, printed colors will not always match on-screen colors perfectly.

## Problem Solver

### ■ Was a printer cover opened during printing?

Opening the printer cover or maintenance cover during printing causes the print head to stop abruptly, resulting in uneven colors. Do not open the covers while printing is in progress.

## The print is not positioned properly on the media.

### ■ Is the media loaded correctly and are the margins correct?

If the media is not loaded correctly, the results may be off center or part of the data may not be printed. You should also check whether the correct options are selected for **Side** and **Print Start Position** in the setup menu.

### ■ Is the media wavy?

Certain types of media may develop waves under some conditions (humidity and temperature) while installed in the printer. If a wave has developed, press the  button in the control panel to feed the media and avoid the affected area. We recommend that you lower the temperature and humidity to prevent waves developing.

### ■ Is the print head misaligned?

If the print head is misaligned, ruled lines may be misaligned accordingly. When vertical ruled lines are misaligned, select **Print Adjustments - Print Head Alignment** in the media settings to adjust print head misalignment that occurs during printing.
